PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

THE GOVERNING BODY OF ETON COLLEGE having, on the 15th day of November, 1932, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending Statute XXVI (1) of the existing Statutes of the said College, the said Statute is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Eton College on the 15th day of November, 1932.

Whereas Statutes for the Government of Eton College were made by the Governing Body of the said College under the Public Schools Act, 1868, and approved by His Majesty The King in Council on 24th October, 1904:

And whereas the said Governing Body in exercise of the powers for this purpose conferred upon them by Section 11 of the said

Act have resolved to alter Statute XXVI (1) of the said Statutes in the following manner:

Be it enacted as follows:—

From and after the date of His Majesty's Order in Council approving this Statute, Statute XXVI (1) shall read as follows:—

“The Provost and Fellows shall have power to appoint Chaplains or Conducts, not more than two in number; who shall perform the daily Service in the College Chapel according to such regulations as shall be made by the Provost and Fellows; and shall hold their office during the pleasure of the Provost and Fellows.”

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Frederick Raymond Cordey, John Thomas Bowen and Arianfryn Hughes in recognition of their gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 25th January, 1932, an explosion of firedamp took place in the Llwynypia Colliery, near Tonypany, and caused poisonous gas to circulate round the ventilating system. Cordey at the time was working with a man named West at some distance from the point where the explosion occurred, but both were affected by the gas. West collapsed, and Cordey took him on his back for thirty yards before he too began to collapse. Leaving West, he made his way to the Main Heading where he found Bowen and Hughes attending to others who had been injured; he was too exhausted to do more than tell them of West's plight. Bowen and Hughes thereupon went to rescue West. Bowen's lamp went out indicating the presence of gas, but they pressed on and effected the rescue. Cordey, who had followed them as soon as he could, met them shortly after they started back. All three men deliberately endangered their lives in rescuing their comrade. The risk was unknown, and two rescuers actually lost their lives through venturing rashly into untested air in other parts of the mine.

CITY OF MANCHESTER.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO TRAMWAYS.

The Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Manchester, being assembled in Council at the Town Hall in the said City on the 9th day of November, 1932, acting by the Council as the Local Authority for the said City and as the Promoters of the Manchester Corporation Tramways Undertaking do hereby under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870; the Manchester Corporation Act, 1897; the Manchester Corporation Tramways Act, 1899; The Manchester Corporation Tramways Act, 1900; the Manchester Corporation Act, 1901; the Manchester Corporation Tramways Act, 1902; the Manchester Corporation Act, 1903; the Manchester Corporation Tramways Act, 1904; the Manchester Corporation Tramways Act, 1907; the Manchester Corporation Tramways Order, 1908, confirmed by the Tramways Order Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1908; the Manchester Corporation Act, 1909; the Manchester Corporation Act, 1911; the Manchester Corporation Act, 1920; the Manchester Corporation Act, 1924; the Manchester Corporation Act, 1929; and every other power enabling them in that behalf make the following Bye-laws and Regulations, namely :—

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word " Corporation " means the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Manchester; the words " Tramways Undertaking " mean the Tramway System worked by the Corporation, situate within or outside the City of Manchester; the word " Car " means any carriage or car run upon the Tramways and used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers; the expression " Interior of a Car " shall not include the upper deck of covered cars; the word " Conductor " means any Officer or Servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word " Driver " means any Officer or Servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car of the Corporation and to all places in respect

to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

2. Every person shall enter or leave a car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform and not otherwise. Provided that when a car is stationary at a place where a street refuge exists on the immediate off side of the car persons shall enter or leave by the step of the Driver's platform if so directed by the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation. Provided also that in the case of single deck cars persons may enter or leave from either end of the near side of the car unless directed by the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation to enter or leave from one particular end, when every person shall enter or leave the car by the near side step of that particular end.

Every person desiring to enter a car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons intending to alight from the car to do so.

Entering or Leaving Car in Motion.

3. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any car in motion.

Smoking.

4. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette in the interior of any car.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, tramway station, waiting room, shelter, barrier, or any premises used in connection with the Tramways Undertaking, or spit, or commit any nuisance, in, upon, from, or against any car, tramway station, waiting room, or premises as aforesaid, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

No person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, or whilst upon any tramway station, waiting room, or premises as aforesaid, sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg, or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or throw down and leave in or upon any car, tramway station, waiting room, or premises as aforesaid, any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit, or any other objectionable matter in or upon any car, tramway station, waiting room, or premises as aforesaid.

Objectionable Persons.

6. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous contagious or infectious disorder, nor any person who from any other cause in the opinion of the Conductor is unfit to be a passenger, shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person may be prevented from mounting or entering any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall leave the car on being requested by the Conductor to do so, and on his refusal he may be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Damage to Car.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings,

or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Offensive Clothing.

8. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, soil, injure, or damage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person who, in the opinion of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall enter or remain in or upon any car, and any such person may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car.

If any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall, on the request of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, leave such car upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned or tendered to him, and on his refusal to do so he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation.

Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Provided further, that on top covered double-deck cars any such person shall, if so directed by the Conductor, travel on the upper deck when there is seating accommodation available thereon.

Payment of Fares.

9. Each passenger shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally payable for the journey whether the same shall or shall not be demanded. Upon payment of the fare the passenger shall receive and accept a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid. Such ticket shall only be available by the car on which it is issued and for the passenger to whom it is given or in respect of whom it is issued. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey. A passenger travelling beyond the stage or journey to which his ticket is available shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally payable for the distance travelled over by him beyond the stage or journey to which he had paid the fare.

Tickets.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the Conductor or any duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket in such a condition that the number can be read and any other material portion thereof identified or pay the fare legally payable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Luggage.

11. A passenger shall not bring or attempt to bring on to any car any luggage or parcel exceeding 66 lbs. in weight, and a passenger shall not if so directed by the Conductor or any duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, bring or attempt to bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, or any luggage which from its size, or otherwise, is, in the opinion of the Conductor or any duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the car.

A passenger shall in respect of all luggage (other than his own personal luggage not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight) taken or brought by him upon any car pay to the Conductor for the carriage of the same the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges for the time being applicable to the carriage of parcels or luggage upon a car and displayed in the car.

Travelling on Steps, etc.

12. No person other than a duly authorised Officer of the Corporation shall travel on the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the upper deck, or sit on the railing, guards, or buffers of any car, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any car.

No person shall improperly hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the car with the consent of the Conductor.

Full Number of Passengers.

13. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is authorised to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount upon, or remain in or upon any such car when warned by the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation not to do so.

Dogs.

14. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of a car, and no dog or other animal shall be allowed upon the upper deck of any car except by the permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Any dog or other animal allowed on the upper deck of any car shall be carried or held on leash. A person shall not take a dog or other animal into or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge, of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

A passenger shall in respect of a dog taken or brought by him upon any car pay to the conductor for the carriage of such dog the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges for the time being applicable to the carriage of dogs upon a car and displayed in the car.

Firearms, etc.

15. A person shall not enter, mount upon, or remain in any car with a loaded firearm, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, or likely to cause a nuisance, or to soil, injure, or damage any car or the clothing of any passenger.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

16. No person other than the Conductor or Driver or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, switches, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, platform chains, or any part of a car, or its equipment, and, except in case of emergency or accident, no person other than the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation shall signal a car to start or stop. No passenger shall, when a car is in motion, speak to the driver or distract his attention except in cases of emergency.

Obstruction.

17. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Conductor, Driver, or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or the Tramways Undertaking.

No person shall in any way wilfully obstruct, impede, or interfere with any car or the traffic on the Tramways Undertaking.

Disabled Cars.

18. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the permission of the Conductor, mount or enter a disabled or damaged car.

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

19. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car, any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be removed immediately from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, and, if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to its return.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws.

20. Every Conductor, Driver, and other duly authorised Officer of the Corporation shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent any breach thereof.

Penalty.

21. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and

Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Bye-laws to be kept in Cars.

22. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use and in or about each tramway station, waiting room, shelter, or premises used in connection with the Tramways Undertaking a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

Operation.

23. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into operation on the First day of February, 1933, and on and from that date the Bye-laws and Regulations relating to Tramways and Motor Omnibuses made by the Council of the Corporation of the City of Manchester on the 4th day of June, 1924, so far as the same have not been repealed by the Road Traffic Act, 1930, shall be repealed, but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of the contravention thereof.

2. To provide for the appointment by the Corporation of a Harbour Committee.

3. To authorise the Corporation to purchase by agreement and hold and to sell or otherwise dispose of lands and hereditaments for the purposes of the harbour undertaking and to grant easements.

4. To define and/or amend the limits of the harbour and harbour undertaking and the limits within which the Corporation as a harbour authority may levy rates.

5. To empower the Corporation to maintain and improve the harbour undertaking and to construct maintain alter and improve all necessary embankments, quays, wharves, jetties, piers, landing places, approaches, buildings, buoys, moorings, groynes, sluices and works, apparatus and conveniences.

6. To authorise the Corporation for the purposes of the Order to deepen, dredge scour and excavate the harbour the foreshore and bed of the sea and to appropriate and sell or dispose of any sand, mud, and other materials excavated and to acquire dredgers &c. for such purposes.

7. To authorise the Corporation to provide or license steam tugs hoppers barges etc. and to levy rates for or in respect of the use or licensing thereof.

8. To empower the Corporation to levy rates dues tolls and charges and to authorise additions variations and alterations to or in the rates dues tolls and charges in connection with the harbour undertaking, to confer vary or extinguish exemptions from payment thereof, to compound with respect thereto and to make provision for revision of such rates.

9. To enable the Corporation to sell or lease the harbour undertaking or rates or any part thereof with the approval of the Minister of Transport in such manner as may be provided by the intended Order.

10. To authorise the Corporation to borrow money for all or any purposes of the Order and to charge the moneys so to be borrowed and the interest thereon upon the revenue of the undertaking and to provide for the repayment of the said moneys and for the payment of any deficiency in the said revenue out of such rates revenues and funds, including the general rate fund and the general rates of the borough of Southwold as the Order may prescribe and to form and maintain a reserve fund.

11. To empower the Corporation to make up deficiencies in harbour revenue out of the said general rate fund or general rates or either of them.

12. To authorise the Corporation to make vary or rescind by-laws for the management regulating and use of the harbour undertaking and for the licensing and control of vessels boats and persons using frequenting plying for hire etc. in the harbour and for

regulating and fixing the fares to be charged by those licensed vessels boats or persons and to impose penalties for the breach or non-observance of such by-laws and to provide for the enforcement thereof.

13. To provide for the removal of sunk, stranded or abandoned vessels; to authorise the Corporation to deal with vessels laid by or neglected as unserviceable in the harbour, and to make provision for the recovery by the Corporation of expenses incidental thereto.

14. To incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847, the Commissioners Clauses Act 1847 and any amendment or modification of the said Acts.

15. To vary or extinguish all or any rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the intended Order and to make all such other provisions as may be necessary or expedient for giving effect to the objects of the proposed Order.

16. To amend extend alter or repeal all or some of the provisions of the Southwold Harbour Orders 1898 and 1907 and the Southwold Harbour Light Railway Order 1913.
