TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 2nd December, 1932, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £55,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 5th December, 1932, to Saturday, the 10th December, 1932, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not

later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

SUNDAY ENTERTAINMENTS ACT, 1932.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF CORONERS' DISTRICTS.

Whereas on the twenty-seventh day of July, 1932, the Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster under his hand and seal on behalf of His Majesty relinquished, pursuant to Section 4 (3) of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the power of appointing a Franchise Coroner for the Duchy of Lancaster Liberty in the County of Middlesex;

And whereas on the ninth day of August, 1932, a vacancy occurred in the Office of Franchise Coroner for the said Liberty;

And whereas by the operation of Section 4 of the said Act, the area over which the Franchise Coroner for the said Liberty had jurisdiction thereupon became merged in the County of Middlesex for all purposes relating to Coroners:

And whereas the County of Middlesex is at present divided into two Coroners' Districts, and it is necessary to alter the existing division of the County so as to include the said

Liberty in one of such districts;

And whereas the Middlesex County Council have pursuant to Section 12 of the said Act and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for the alteration of the existing division of the County of Middlesex into Coroners' districts so as to include in one of those districts the area of the said Liberty;

Now therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by Section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, do hereby order that the existing division of the County of Middlesex into Coroners' districts, shall be altered and that the said districts shall be named and constituted as set out in the Schedule hereto and substituted for the existing districts.

This Order shall come into operation on the

first day of December, 1932.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

Order for the Alteration of Coroners' Districts.

Whereas it is provided by Section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, that a county council, after complying with such requirements as to notice and consideration of

objections as may be prescribed, may submit to the Secretary of State a draft order providing for such alteration of any existing division of the county into coroners' districts as appears to them to be suitable and that the Secretary of State, after taking into consideration any objections to the draft order made in the prescribed manner and within the prescribed time, may make an Order, either in the terms of the draft submitted to him or with such modifications as he thinks fit:

And whereas the County of Durham is now divided into coroners' districts:

And whereas the Council of the said county have, pursuant to section 12 of the said recited Act, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for the alteration of the division of the said county into coroners'

And whereas the requirements of the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, have been complied with:

Now therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 12 of the said recited Act, do hereby order as follows:-

- (1) The area comprising the existing coroners' districts known as Chester Ward shall be divided into two coroners' districts to be known as the East (Chester) Ward and the West (Chester) Ward, and these districts shall be constituted as set out in the schedule
- (2) The existing coroner's district known as Chester Ward shall cease to exist.

This order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of November, 1932.

four to six seconds duration.

Words importing the masculine gender include females and words importing the singular include the plural.

The master of every self-propelled vessel when such vessel is approaching the neighbourhood of the new Barking Road Bridge shall cause one prolonged blast to be sounded as an indication of the presence of the vessel, such signal to be made by every down-coming self-propelled vessel when approaching Messrs. Howard's Timber Wharf and by every upgoing self-propelled vessel in the vicinity of the upper end of the Pepper Warehouse.

4. The speed of every self-propelled vessel navigating against the tide shall be decreased on approaching points or sharp bends in the river and, if necessary, such vessel shall stop and wait before rounding such points or sharp bends so as to allow any vessels navigating with the tide to round and pass clear of the

5. All signals prescribed by these Bye-laws to be given by self-propelled vessels shall be given on the whistle or on the accepted substitute for the whistle.

6. Any person committing any breach of or in any way infringing any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

The liability to or payment of any penalty for any offence against these Bye-laws shall be in addition and without prejudice to any liability of the offender for damage occasioned by the offence and also to any right of the Board to recover from the owner of the vessel or other person damages for any loss sustained by them in consequence of such offence.

To empower the Undertakers on all or any of the lands acquired under the Luton Water Act 1911 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1911") or the Order and for the time being held by them to execute any of the works and exercise any of the powers mentioned in Section 12 of the Waterworks Clauses Act 1847.
