

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in weaving elastic web and in winding yarn at the works of Joseph Burgess and Son Limited, Belvoir Road, Coalville, Leicestershire, subject to the conditions that, apart from any arrangements that may be made to meet the convenience of individual workers, a worker shall not be employed in the second shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours and washing facilities shall be provided; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.
