The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 22nd day of November, 1932, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

## UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON  
TUESDAY, 22ND NOVEMBER, 1932.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Statutes of the University of Oxford in order to secure greater uniformity and clarity, and to remove redundant and obsolete provisions:

Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

1. In *Statt. Tit. II. Sect. II. cl. 5 (Statuta, ed. 1932, p. 4, l. 40)*, after the word "admission" insert the words "as a Senior or Junior Student or" and delete the words "or an Affiliated Colonial, Indian, or Foreign Senior or Junior Student".

2. In *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. 1. § 1. cl. 4 (Statuta, ed. 1932, p. 53, l. 19)*, delete the

words "Clauses 2 and 3" and substitute the words "Clause 2".

3. In *Statt. Tit. V. Sect. 1. cl. 1 (Statuta, ed. 1932, p. 131, l. 20)*, delete "The word 'Society' shall mean" to "Society of Women Students" and substitute: "The word 'Society' shall mean College (including the New Foundation of Keble College), Public Hall, St. Catherine's Society, the Societies of Women Students, and such Permanent Private Halls as may from time to time be so denominated by Decree."

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 9th December, 1932, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th December, 1932, to Saturday, the 17th December, 1932, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the

House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

# WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

## NEW REGULATIONS AND RULES.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Lord Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have made new Regulations consolidating with some amendments the existing Regulations as to the duties and remuneration of Medical Referees. The new Regulations will come into force on the 1st January next, as from which date the existing Regulations will be revoked.

The Secretary of State has also made Rules as to the duties and fees of Certifying and other Surgeons under sections 43 and 44 of the Act. These are substantially the same as the existing Regulations on the subject, and will also come into force on the 1st January next.
