PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of section eighteen of the Finance Act, 1923, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

- (a) that any profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British income tax are also chargeable to income tax payable under the law in force in any foreign state; and
- (b) that arrangements, as specified in the declaration, have been made with the Government of that foreign state with a view to the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British income tax and to the income tax payable in the foreign state;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British income tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the income tax payable in the foreign state, have the effect of law in the foreign state:

And whereas the arrangements contained in the Schedule to this Declaration have been made by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland with the Government of the French Republic:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

- (a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British income tax are also chargeable to the income tax payable under the law in force in France; and
- (b) that the arrangements contained in the said Schedule have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of shipping are chargeable both to British income tax and to the income tax payable in France.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Shipping Profits (France) Declaration, 1932."

SCHEDULE.

(1) The Government of the United Kingdom agree to take the necessary steps under Section 18 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1923, for exempting from income tax (including supertax) chargeable in the United Kingdom any

profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on with ships whose port of registry is in France by a company which manages and controls such business in France. The exemption so granted shall not extend to income tax chargeable under Schedule A of the Income Tax Acts.

(2) The French Government agree to take the necessary steps under Article 5 of the "Loi portant fixation du budget général de l'exercice 1926" of 29th April, 1926, for exempting from taxation any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on with ships whose port of registry is in the United Kingdom by a company which manages and controls such business in the United Kingdom.

This exemption is in respect of the Industrial and Commercial Profits Tax (Impôt sur les bénéfices industriels et commerciaux) imposed by Chapter 1 of the Law of 31st July, 1917, and the Income Tax (Impôt sur le revenu) imposed by the Law of 29th June, 1872, and the Decree of 6th December, 1872, on foreign companies whose shares are not subject to the compounded-duty system but which hold movable or immovable property situated in France.

(3) The expression "business of shipping" means the commercial operations involved in the working of ships by their owners, and for the purposes of this definition the expression

"owner" includes any charterer.

(4) The exemptions referred to in articles (1) and (2) above shall be granted in respect of taxes for the United Kingdom financial year commencing on 6th April, 1924, and the French financial year commencing on 1st January, 1924, and for subsequent years.

(5) The present agreement may be denounced at any time, subject to six months' notice being given by either contracting Government to the

HEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932 (7 E. 7, c. 29, 4-5 G. 5, c. 18, 9-10 G. 5, c. 80, 18-19 G. 5, c. 3, and 22-23 G. 5, c. 32) it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of

the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)), comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas France has acceded to the said Convention in respect of Syria and Lebanon:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Syria and Lebanon the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Syria and Lebanon or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the

said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 9th day of October, 1924 (S.R. & O. 1924, No. 1218), His Majesty was pleased to declare that the provisions of the said Section 91 should apply to Syria and Lebanon, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it

is hereby declared, as follows:—
1. The laws of Syria and Lebanon confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Syria and Lebanon or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall

be applicable to Syria and Lebanon.
3. The Order in Council dated the 9th day of October, 1924, relating to Syria and Lebanon is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Indus-Convention (Syria trial Property Lebanon) Order, 1932.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical sioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of October, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Middlesbrough, Saint Hilda, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Middlesbrough, Saint Peter, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Middlesbrough, Saint Hilda, and Middlesbrough, Saint Peter, duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of York and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of York signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Middlesbrough, Saint Hilda, and Middlesbrough, Saint Peter, are at present vacant:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Middlesbrough, Saint Hilda, and Middlesbrough, Saint Peter, now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Middlesbrough, Saint Hilda, and the said Benefice of Middlesbrough, Saint Peter, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Middlesbrough, Saint Hilda with Saint Peter' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. That a Curate at a stipend of not less than £250 per annum be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Archbishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and the endowments of the United Benefice shall be charged with a sum of £60 per annum as a fund towards meeting the expenses of providing for the services of such Curate as aforesaid which said fund of £60 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purpose aforesaid.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Middlesbrough, Saint Peter, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Middlesbrough, Saint Hilda, shall form part of the endowment and property of the United Benefice and the net income arising therefrom or in respect of any sale thereof shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only towards the payment of the expenses of providing assistance for the Incumbent of the United Benefice by clergy or lay workers.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of York has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme (1) for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Otham and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, and (2) for altering the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, and of the Parish of the Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Philip, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire and report with reference to the said Benefices of Otham; Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist; and Maidstone, Saint Philip; duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Otham and Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, and the terms for effecting the union, including the transfer to the Parish of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Philip, of a part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alteration of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all the said three Benefices of Otham; Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist; and Maidstone, Saint Philip, are now full, the Reverend William Wyatt Holdgate being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Otham; the Reverend Robert William Shaw being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist; and the Reverend Stanley Richards being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Philip:

"And whereas there is at present no Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, but there are certain funds in our hands and in the hands of the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty which are available for the provision of a Parsonage House for such Benefice:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, now belongs to the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being: "Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said William Wyatt Holdgate and Stanley Richards (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—
"1. That the said Benefice of Otham and the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Otham with Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, shall be vacant then the union shall forthwith take effect but if upon that day the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, shall be full then the union shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, and in either case the said William Wyatt Holdgate if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Otham shall become and be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect
the Parsonage House at present belonging to
the said Benefice of Otham shall become and
be the house of residence for the Incumbent
of the United Benefice.

That upon the said union taking effect the funds held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty for the provision of a Parsonage House for the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, as aforesaid shall be severed or diverted from the United Benefice and shall become and ibe applicable for the provision of a Parsonage House for the New District referred to in Clause 5 of this Scheme.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice all the properties revenues and income constituting the endowments of the said Benefice of Otham together with a part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, namely an annual sum of £100 being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, and all the other or remaining endowments or property of the last named Benefice shall be severed or diverted from that Benefice and shall be applied for the endowment of a new District to be in the Patronage of the Archbishop of Canterbury and to be constituted mainly out of that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed to be transferred and annexed to the Parish of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Philip.

"6. That upon the said union taking effect a part of the Parish of the said Benefice of

Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Philip, namely all that part of the said Parish of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, lying to the west of an imaginary line commencing at the point near Bicknor Hole where the middle of the road leading from Sutton Valence to Maidstone crosses the eastern boundary of the said Parish of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, and extending thence north westwards along the middle of the said road for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the eastern boundary of Stevensons Wood, and extending thence northwards first to and then along the eastern boundary of Stevensons Wood and to and along the western boundary of Whites Wood and to and along the western boundary of Hooklands Wood for a distance in all of 34 chains or thereabouts to a point about 15 yards south of the northern end of the said western boundary of Hooklands Wood and extending thence westwards along a field boundary for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the footpath leading from Gould Court to Hopper Houses, and extending thence northwards along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading to Shepway Court and extending thence westwards for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last named footpath to its junction with the footpath leading into Mote Park and extending thence northwards along the middle of the last named footpath for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to the southern boundary of Mote Park and extending thence westwards along the southern boundary of Mote Park for a distance of 30 yards precisely and extending thence due north for a distance of 51 chains or thereabouts to a point upon the northern boundary of the said Parish of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, all which part of the said Parish of Maidstone, Saint John the Evangelist, is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured pink.

"7. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Otham.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of Canterbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

WI HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 10th day of November, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the District of Saint Peter, Saint Helier, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1930, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th day of the same month a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the Parish of Morden, the Parish of Carshalton, and the New Parish of Benhilton, all in the said County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Southwark, and such District was named 'The District of Saint Peter, Saint Helier':

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said District of Saint Peter, Saint Helier, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said District of Saint Peter, Saint Helier, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Carshalton which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said District of Saint Peter, Saint Helier.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the District of Saint Peter, Saint Helier, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark, being:—

"All that portion of the Parish of Carshalton, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north and upon the north west by the said District of Saint Peter, Saint Helier, upon the south west by the new Parish of Benhilton, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Benhilton from the said Parish of Carshalton at the south western corner of the close numbered 306 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Carshalton published in the year 1913 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thence south eastward along the fences forming the southern boundaries of the said close and of the close numbered 304 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 18 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence reaches the western side of Wrythe Lane, and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of Wrythe Lane for a distance in all of 2½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the southern boundary of the close numbered 274 upon the said maps, and extending thence first eastward to and along such fence and along the fence forming the southern boundary of the close numbered 275 upon the said maps and then north east-ward along the fences forming the south eastern boundaries of the last mentioned close and of the closes numbered 302 and 301 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 27½ chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the southern boundary of the close numbered 363 upon the said maps upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Carshalton from the said District of Saint Peter, Saint Helier."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

sex and in the Diocese of London:
"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, and Westminster, Saint Mary, Charing Cross Road, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, Oxford, on the 29th day of November, 1932, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

Ex Parte the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend the Ordinance in relation to the Fellowship of the Foundation of Robert Mynors, Esquire, made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5. ch. 33), for the aforesaid College, and forming Appendix III of University College Statutes, duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting specially summoned for this purpose and holden on the seventeenth day of March, 1932, and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and ordered for sealing after the consent of the

University had been given on the ninth day of May, 1932 (Oxford University Gazette, Vol. LXII, No. 2001, page 510), and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Ordinance in relation to the Fellowship of the Foundation of Robert Mynors, Esquire, in order to make clear that the College retains the right at the conclusion of each period of tenure of, and at each new appointment to, the Mynors Fellowship when held in conjunction with a University Readership, to decide for its part whether or not the connection of the Fellowship with a University Readership shall be continued for the next Mynors Fellowship period, and to elucidate the distinction between the duties of such Mynors Fellow as University Reader and as Fellow of the College, and to protect the status and rights of the present holder of the Fellowship;

Now, therefore, WE, the Master and Fellows of the said College, in virtue of all and every the powers enabling us contained in Statute XIII. 1 of our Statutes and section 7 (2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do alter and amend the said Ordinance by the following omissions, alterations and

additions:

WE substitute for the present clauses 5-7 inclusive, the following new clauses, numbered 5, 6, 7, and we add a new clause 9, viz.:

5. The Mynors Fellowship may, if the Master and Fellows at a General Meeting so decide, be tenable in conjunction with a University Readership in Economics or Politics, if the University shall maintain such a Readership with a stipend of not less than £300 per annum, for this purpose: and in this case the Mynors Fellow shall be elected, or re-elected, by a Board consisting of the Master of the College, the Drummond Professor of Political Economy, the Gladstone Professor of Political Theory and Institutions, a person appointed by the Hebdomadal Council, a person appointed by the Faculty of Social Studies, and two persons appointed by the Master and Fellows of the The Fellow so elected shall in the College. first instance be elected for such period, not exceeding seven years, as shall have been agreed upon between the College and the University. At the end of such period, or if the Fellow shall previously vacate the Reader-ship, the Master and Fellows shall at a General Meeting decide whether the connection of the Fellowship with the University Readership shall be continued for a further period, and if it be so continued the then holder shall be re-eligible by the said Board.

6. If the University shall determine the Readership or the tenure of the same by the Mynors Fellow or if the College shall decide under cl. 5 of this Ordinance not to continue the connection of the Fellowship with the University Readership, the then holder of the Mynors Fellowship shall be re-eligible by the Master and Fellows under cl. 2 of this Ordinance.

7. A Mynors Fellow elected under cl. 5 of this Ordinance shall, as to his duties as University Reader, be subject to such Regulations as may from time to time be determined by Statute made by or for the University and to any Regulations made for the Reader by the University after consultation with the College, and, as to his duties as Fellow, be subject to

such conditions, including conditions as to residence and teaching, as shall have been fixed by the College at the time of his election or reelection.

9. Notwithstanding the amendments contained in the present Ordinance, the status and rights of the present holder of the Mynors Fellowship, G. D. H. Cole, M.A., shall continue to be governed by the Ordinance approved by the King in Council on the 6th day of February, 1925, and amended by the University of Oxford Commissioners and approved by the King in Council on the 30th day of April, 1926.
