9. Notwithstanding the amendments contained in the present Ordinance, the status and rights of the present holder of the Mynors Fellowship, G. D. H. Cole, M.A., shall continue to be governed by the Ordinance approved by the King in Council on the 6th day of February, 1925, and amended by the University of Oxford Commissioners and approved by the King in Council on the 30th day of April, 1926.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd December, 1932, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Wednesday, the 28th December, 1932, to Saturday, the 31st December, 1932, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not

later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF CORONERS' DISTRICTS.

Whereas on the 14th day of June, 1932, a vacancy occurred in the office of Franchise Coroner for the Duchy of Lancaster Liberty of the Manor of Ogmores in the County of Glamorgan:

And whereas on the first day of July, 1932, the Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster under his hand and seal on behalf of His Majesty relinquished, pursuant to section 4 (3) of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the power of appointing a Franchise Coroner within the said Liberty:

And whereas by the operation of section 4 (1) of the said Act the area in which the said Franchise Coroner has jurisdiction thereupon, for all purposes relating to Coroners, became merged in the said County:

And whereas by section 4 (2) of the said Act it is provided that where any area in which a Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction is merged in a County which is divided into Coroners' Districts, any consequential alteration of the division of the County into Coroners' Districts shall be effected in manner provided by the Act:

And whereas the said County is now divided into three County Coroners' Districts:

And whereas the Franchise Coroner for the said Liberty had jurisdiction in the parishes or parts of parishes named in the Schedule hereto:
