The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Gonville and Caius College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 10th day of February, 1933, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes of Gonville and Caius College in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statute having been duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the tenth day of February, 1933 (notice of the proposed amending Statute having been given to the University) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

WE, the Master and Fellows of Gonville and Caius College in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College by adding the following Statute. 55. Amendments of the Davy Trust.

- (1) In pursuance of the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and all or any other powers enabling them the Master and Fellows by this Statute enact that nothing in these Statutes contained shall be invalid on the ground that it does not accord with the Trusts of the Will of Dr. Martin Davy which is dated the 18th day of January, 1839 (hereinafter referred to as the Will).
- (2) The Master and Fellows shall have the same power in regard to the alteration of the Trusts of the Will and the substitution therefor of other provisions as is or may be conferred upon them with regard to the Statutes of the College by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, or all or any other powers enabling them.
- (3) The administration of the Trusts shall be vested in the College Council.
- (4) The College Council may with the concurrence of the Master make Regulations for the administration of the Trusts and no such Regulations shall be invalid on the ground that they do not accord with the Trusts of the Will. Provided that any Regulations shall have regard to the main purposes of the Trusts of the Will as modified by this Statute namely to supplement the stipend of the Master and to give to each Master the right to use the Mansion House as a residence.
- (5) Without prejudice to the generality of this Statute and of the power to make Regu-

lations the following provisions of the Will shall cease to have any operation:

- (a) The obligation upon the Master of annual residence in the Mansion House;
- (b) The forfeiture provisions consequent upon non-residence by the Master;
- (c) The provisions requiring the employment of two persons to reside in the Mansion House during the absence of the Master.
- (6) No Master of the College shall have any claim or right of indemnity against the College or against any preceding Master or his estate in respect of any act or omission authorised by the provisions of this Statute or of any Regulations made hereunder.
 - In witness whereof we, the said Master and Fellows of Gonville and Caius College, have hereunto caused our Common Seal to be affixed this tenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.

CANCELLATION OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby CANCEL the appointment of the following Standing for Hackney Carriages at the following places:—

CANCELLATION.

AT NORTHUMBERLAND AVENUE AND VICTORIA EMBANKMENT. In six portions.

Fifty Hackney Carriages:

First Portion.—Two carriages in centre of Northumberland Avenue, commencing six yards East of the refuge opposite Grand Buildings, extending Eastward as far as necessary for two carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

Second Portion.—Five carriages in centre of Northumberland Avenue, commencing opposite the Eastern side of Main Entrance to Hotel Victoria, extending Eastward as far as necessary for five carriages.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been framed in pursuance of Section 73 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, viz.:-

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF SECOND CLASS CLERKS FOR SERVICE UNDER THE SUPREME COURT OF NORTHERN IBELAND.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies.

- 1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not have attained the age of 22 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. upper age limit may, however, be extended to 30 in the case of candidates who possess professional legal qualifications or have had actual experience of legal business, and may further be extended to 50 in the case of candidates who were employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and are still so employed at the date of the vacancy.
- 2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:
 - (a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
 - (b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.
 - (c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a naturalborn British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Command-

ing Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. A candidate must have had a secondary education, and have obtained the Senior Certificate of the Ministry of Education of Northern Ireland, or have passed any other examination which in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners is of equivalent or higher standard, and must have had two years' experience in a lawyer's office or be a barrister or a graduate in law; provided that the Commissioners may waive these requirements, if the Lord Chief Justice so recommend, in the case of any candidate who has been employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and is still so employed at the date of the vacancy.

Credit in the competition will be given for a university degree.

5. The Lord Chief Justice will take such steps as he thinks most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy vacancies which he desires to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

- 6. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary of the Supreme Court of Northern Ireland, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from that office, which must be stamped by the applicant with a "Civil Service" stamp or stamps to the value of two shillings and sixpence; this fee is payable in respect of the application and will not be returned in any circumstances.
