The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Gonville and Caius College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 10th day of February, 1933, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes of Gonville and Caius College in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statute having been duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the tenth day of February, 1933 (notice of the proposed amending Statute having been given to the University) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

WE, the Master and Fellows of Gonville and Caius College in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College by adding the following Statute.

55. Amendments of the Davy Trust.

(1) In pursuance of the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and all or any other powers enabling them the Master and Fellows by this Statute enact that nothing in these Statutes contained shall be invalid on the ground that it does not accord with the Trusts of the Will of Dr. Martin Davy which is dated the 18th day of January, 1839 (hereinafter referred to as the Will).

(2) The Master and Fellows shall have the same power in regard to the alteration of the Trusts of the Will and the substitution thereof of other provisions as is or may be conferred upon them with regard to the Statutes of the College by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, or all or any other powers enabling them.

(3) The administration of the Trusts shall be vested in the College Council.

(4) The College Council may with the concurrence of the Master make Regulations for the administration of the Trusts and no such Regulations shall be invalid on the ground that they do not accord with the Trusts of the Will. Provided that any Regulations shall have regard to the main purposes of the Trusts of the Will as modified by this Statute namely to supplement the stipend of the Master and to give to each Master the right to use the Mansion House as a residence.

(5) Without prejudice to the generality of this Statute and of the power to make Regu-
