The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Wadham College, in the University of Oxford, on the 7th day of February, 1933, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

**WADHAM COLLEGE, OXFORD.**

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, 13 and 14 George V. cap. 33, and approved by the King in Council in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, in relation to Wadham College in the University of Oxford in the matter of the Retirement of Officers of the College, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the Seventh day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and voting. For Statute VI, Clause 12, substitute the following Clause:—

"12. No Sub-Warden, Dean, Bursar, Tutor, Lecturer (other than the Divinity

Lecturer), or Librarian shall hold Office after the end of the academic year in which he attains the age of sixty, unless at a Meeting, specially summoned after not less than a fortnight's notice, he be re-elected for a period of not more than five years, by a vote of not less than two-thirds of the whole Governing Body. No Chaplain or Divinity Lecturer shall hold Office after the end of the academic year in which he attains the age of seventy. Provided that nothing herein contained shall enable a Chaplain or Divinity Lecturer to be elected to an Official Fellowship after attaining the age of sixty, or, if he shall have been elected to an Official Fellowship before attaining the age of sixty, to continue to hold such Fellowship after the end of the academic year in which he attains that age except for the period and subject to the conditions contained in Statute III, Clause 6 (13)".
