

of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Peterborough, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Barnabas, Peterborough, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Peterborough.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Peterborough, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Peterborough, in the County of Northampton and in the Diocese of Peterborough, which is bounded upon the west by the Parish of Saint John Baptist, Peterborough, upon the north by the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Paul, Peterborough, upon the east by the New Parish of All Saints, Peterborough, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Peterborough, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Peterborough, at the junction of Lincoln Road with Lime Tree Avenue, and extending thence westward along the middle of Lime Tree Avenue for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cronwell Road North, and extending thence northward along the middle of Cronwell Road North for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hankey Street, and extending thence westward along the middle of Hankey Street for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Westwood Street and continuing thence westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Main Line of the London and North Eastern Railway upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Peterborough, from the said Parish of Saint John Baptist, Peterborough.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Peterborough, which is bounded upon the west by the said Parish of Saint John Baptist, Peterborough, upon the south by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Peterborough, upon the east by the said New Parish of All Saints, Peterborough, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say upon the north-east and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Peterborough, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Peterborough, at the junction of Alma Road with Lincoln Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Lincoln Road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction

with Searjeant Street, and extending thence westward along the middle of Searjeant Street for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Walpole Street, and continuing thence westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said Main Line of the London and North Eastern Railway upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Peterborough, from the said Parish of Saint John Baptist, Peterborough."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.
