## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND £2 10s. PER CENT. CONVERSION LOAN, 1944-1949.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 31st March, 1933, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £2 10s. per cent. Conversion Loan, 1944-1949.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and £2 10s. per cent. Conversion Loan to be allotted on that date will be £45,000,000. The amount of £2 10s. per cent. Conversion Loan allotted will not exceed £10,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount allotted will be divided between Bills and Conversion Loan in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 3rd April, 1933, to Saturday, the 8th April, 1933, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

## £2 10s. PER CENT. CONVERSION LOAN, 1944-1949.

6. Particulars of the Loan are given in the Notice dated 17th March, 1933, and published in the London Gazette of that date.

Copies of the Notice may be obtained at the Bank of England.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £10,000 and must specify the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of sixpence) which will be given for the amount applied for.

8. Scrip Certificates with Coupon attached for the half-year's interest due on the 1st October, 1933, will be issued in respect of accepted tenders. These Scrip Certificates may be inscribed or registered forthwith, or they may be exchanged in due course for Bonds to Bearer.

9. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

10. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the

following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock)

(a) in the case of Treasury Bills, on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated;

(b) in the case of £2 10s. per Cent. Conversion Loan, on Friday, the 7th April, 1933.

11. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for Bills or Conversion Loan.

12. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

13. Tenders at the lowest price accepted may be subject to a *pro rata* diminution.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF COMPUTERS, CLASS II, UNDER THE WAR DEPARTMENT IN THE OFFICE OF THE EXTERNAL BALLISTIC DEPARTMENT, ORDNANCE COMMITTEE, WOOLWICH.

*N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is, or was at the time of death, a British subject; provided that exception may be made:

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

The consent of the War Office is required before a candidate, either of whose parents was of other than British nationality at birth, can be appointed.

4. Other things being equal preference will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces during the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916-1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

5. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.
