PROPOSAL TO FIX AND TO VARY MINIMUM RATES CF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO FIX additional General Minimum Piece-Rates and TO VARY certain of the General Minimum Piece Rates and Overtime Rates at present in operation and set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice D.
