BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX AND TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO FIX additional General Minimum Piece-Rates and TO VARY certain of the General Minimum Piece Rates and Overtime Rates at present in operation and set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice D. (40), dated 28th June, 1929.

Particulars of the proposed rates and variations may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board WILL CONSIDER ANY OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Fix and to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 4th April, 1933.
