This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Act, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—

- Russian Goods (Import Prohibition) Act, 1933.
- Army and Air Force (Annual) Act, 1933.
- Children and Young Persons Act, 1933.
- Foreign Judgments (Reciprocal Enforcement) Act, 1933.
- London Passenger Transport Act, 1933.
- Doncaster Area Drainage Act, 1933.

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND £2 10s. PER CENT. CONVERSION LOAN, 1944-1949.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st April, 1933, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £2 10s. per cent. Conversion Loan, 1944-1949.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and £2 10s. per cent. Conversion Loan to be allotted on that date will be £50,000,000. The amount of £2 10s. per cent. Conversion Loan allotted will not exceed £10,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount allotted will be divided between Bills and Conversion Loan in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.
