“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 26th May, 1925, to sanction, *inter alia*, the establishment of the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service and to authorise us to award gratuities, at the rates and under the conditions set forth therein, to Senior Chief Officer, Chief Officers, Petty Officers and men on discharge from that Force:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the rates of Discharge Gratuities allowable by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date

the 26th May, 1925, and the conditions governing their award, should be revised in certain respects for Petty Officers and men who enrol or re-enrol in the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service after the 31st March, 1933, and for officers whose promotion to Chief Officer is after that date:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to award Discharge Gratuities to, or in respect of personnel of the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service at the rates and under the conditions shown in the annexed Schedule but otherwise subject to the restrictions, conditions and provisions laid down in Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 26th May, 1925.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the foregoing proposals.

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 15th May, 1930, to sanction revised scales of pension for men and boys entered

or re-entered after a break in service in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force after the 31st day of March, 1930:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 7th February, 1933, these revised scales were extended, subject to certain reservations, to all men who on the 30th day of September, 1931, were not already serving in the final term of engagement which would qualify them for a pension on discharge:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the revised scales should not apply to certain men who have been invalided and have re-entered within twelve months:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to direct that men who shall have been invalided from Your Majesty's Naval Force and shall have re-entered within twelve months of their discharge, shall, notwithstanding that such re-entry shall have been subsequent to the 31st day of March, 1930, count the whole or part of their time for long service pension and for service and rank elements of disability pension at the rates, and under the conditions, laid down in Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing dates the 7th February, 1921, 6th February, 1922, and 12th February, 1923, provided and to the extent that they be otherwise eligible therefor under the regulations by which the award of their pensions shall be governed.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section XI, Schedule B, of Your Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of July, 1922, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction, inter alia, the age for

compulsory retirement of Warrant Officers and Officers promoted therefrom in certain branches of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces, including the Gunner, Gunner (T) and Boatswain branches, being reduced from 55 to 50 years:

"And whereas the number of Officers in the Gunner, Gunner (T) and Boatswain branches due to retire shortly under the age limit is such that the number of qualified candidates in these branches will be insufficient to fill the consequent vacancies:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction, with effect from the 1st March, 1933, the retention on the Active List of selected Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank of these three branches beyond the normal age of retirement, under the following conditions:—

- (a) Full pay to be continued on the authorised scale, i.e., without extension beyond the increment allowed after nine years' service.

- (b) Time to count for increase of retired pay under the present scale and subject to the existing maximum (£250 a year, standard rate).
- (c) Officers so retained to be ineligible for promotion to the rank of Lieutenant on the Active List.
- (d) The period of retention to be subject to the requirements of the Service and at our discretion.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th day of October, 1922, the 12th day of March, 1923, the 29th day of March, 1926, the 3rd day of November, 1927, and the 17th day of March, 1932, to sanction the estab-

lishment of the Royal Marine Police Force, and the rates of pay and conditions of service therein:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it has now become necessary in view of the increase in the establishment of the Royal Marine Police Force to effect certain changes in the administration, ranks, and emoluments of the personnel:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the appointments of Superintendent, Royal Marine Police, Chief Inspector (promoted from Inspector or Sub-Divisional Inspector), Royal Marine Police, and Sub-Divisional Inspector, Royal Marine Police, and the emoluments set forth in the annexed Schedule, and to authorize us at our discretion to fill appointments as Superintendent and Chief Inspector either by promotion of Officers serving in the Royal Marine Police or by the appointment of Officers on the Active or Retired List of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, subject to the Officer if on the Active List being placed on the Retired List on appointment to the Royal Marine Police.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" 1. The following ranks to be established in the Royal Marine Police:—

If suitable service accommodation is not available Lodging Allowances to be paid at the pertinent rates laid down in the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

" 2. A deduction equivalent to the daily rate of Navy Provision Allowance to be made from the pay of officers of the above ranks while subsisted in hospital.

" 3. Gratuities on vacating these appointments to be payable at the rates of £7, £6, and £4 (standard) for each complete calendar month of service in the ranks of Superintendent, Chief Inspector, and Sub-Divisional Inspector subject to a maximum of £1,260, £1,080 and £720 (standard) respectively. Service rendered by these officers in a lower rank to earn only the rate of gratuity appropriate to that rank and residuary periods of less than one calendar month to be treated as though served in the next lower rank or rating. These gratuities to be subject to the general rules and conditions set forth in respect of gratuities payable to the Royal Marine Police Force.

" 4. The above standard rates of pay and gratuity (including maximum gratuity) to be subject to variation in the same manner and on the same occasions as the rates of full pay, etc., of officers generally.

" 5. In the event of disability or death directly attributable to the conditions of service additional compensation may be paid at our discretion to the Officer or to his dependent relatives according to the Regulations in force for corresponding ranks of the Royal Marines.

" 6. The rate of pay of Inspector 'after 10 years' service in the grade,' namely 15s. a day (standard), to be abolished."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913 (53-4 V. c. 37, and 3-4 Geo. V. c. 16), or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1933," and shall be read as one with "The China Order in Council, 1925," hereinafter called the "Principal Order."

2. The third paragraph of Article 22 (2) of the Principal Order is hereby deleted and the following is substituted in place thereof:—

"The Judge shall preside in the Full Court".

3. This Order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52) to 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. V. c. 39), it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and

that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 2nd day of May, 1932, between His Majesty and His Majesty the King of Iraq for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India,

And His Majesty the King of Iraq,

Desiring to make provision for the reciprocal extradition of criminals,

Have resolved to conclude a Treaty for that purpose, and to that end have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland,
Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Francis Henry Humphrys, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, High Commissioner of His Britannic Majesty in Iraq;

His Majesty the King of Iraq:

General Ja'far Pasha al Askari, Order of Al Rafidain, Second Class, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Minister for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 3, committed within the jurisdiction of the one party, shall be found within the territory of the other party.

ARTICLE 2.

For the purposes of the present Treaty—

(i) The territory of His Britannic Majesty shall be deemed to be Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, and all parts of His Britannic Majesty's dominions overseas other than those enumerated in Article 18, together with the territories enumerated in Article 20 and any territories to which it may be extended under Article 21. It is understood that in respect of all territory of His Britannic Majesty as above defined other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, the present Treaty shall be applied so far as the laws permit.

(ii) The nationals or natives of any British Protectorate or British-protected State or of

any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations is held by His Britannic Majesty shall be deemed to be British subjects.

ARTICLE 3.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.

2. Manslaughter.

3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.

4. Rape.

5. Unlawful carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge, of a girl under 16 years of age.

6. Indecent assault.

7. Kidnapping or false imprisonment.

8. Child stealing, including abandoning, exposing or unlawfully detaining.

9. Abduction.

10. Procuration.

11. Multiplication of spouses contrary to law.

12. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.

13. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.

14. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.

15. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.

16. Arson.

17. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny or embezzlement.

18. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, or fraudulent conversion.

19. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

20.—(a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.

(b) Knowingly and without lawful authority making or having in possession any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of coin.

21. Forgery, or uttering what is forged.

22. Crimes against bankruptcy law.

23. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.

24. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

25. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition crimes or offences.

26. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a crime or offence against the laws of both High Contracting Parties.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes or offences: provided that such participation be punishable by the laws of both High Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for

which, according to the laws of both the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE 4.

Each High Contracting Party reserves the right to refuse or grant the surrender of its own subjects to the other High Contracting Party.

ARTICLE 5.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination or under punishment in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to for any other crime or offence, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE 6.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime or offence or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the High Contracting Party applying or applied to.

ARTICLE 7.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the crime or offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for a crime or offence of a political character.

ARTICLE 8.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in custody or be brought to trial in the territories of the High Contracting Party to whom the surrender has been made for any other crime or offence, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the territories of the High Contracting Party by whom he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes or offences committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE 9.

Subject to the provisions of Articles 18 and 19, the requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority in the territories of the High Contracting Party requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime or offence had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court in the

territories of the High Contracting Party who makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE 10.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE 11.

A criminal fugitive may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any police magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority in the territories of the High Contracting Party applied to on such information or complaint and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime or offence had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the territories of such High Contracting Party in which the magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction. He shall, in accordance with this article, be discharged if within the term of two months a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the diplomatic agent of the High Contracting Party claiming his extradition in accordance with the stipulations of this Treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this Treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either High Contracting Party which may come into a port of the other.

ARTICLE 12.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the High Contracting Party applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime or offence of which he is accused had been committed in the territory of such High Contracting Party, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the High Contracting Party who makes the requisition, and that the crime or offence of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the High Contracting Party applied to under this Treaty.

ARTICLE 13.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the High Contracting Party applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the territories of the other High Contracting Party, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, or copies thereof, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, providing the same are authenticated as follows:—

(1) A warrant, or copy thereof, must purport to be signed by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other High Contracting Party, or purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other

High Contracting Party to be a true copy thereof, as the case may require.

(2) Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified, under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other High Contracting Party, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.

(3) A certificate of, or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction, must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other High Contracting Party.

In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate or judicial document must be authenticated, either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of the other High Contracting Party, or by any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the High Contracting Party to whom application for extradition is made.

ARTICLE 14.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed within their respective jurisdictions, his extradition shall be granted to the Power whose claim is earliest in date, unless such claim is waived.

ARTICLE 15.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the High Contracting Party applied to, or the proper tribunal of such High Contracting Party, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE 16.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, and any articles that may serve as a proof of the crime or offence, shall be given up when the extradition takes place, in so far as this may be permitted by the law of the High Contracting Party granting the extradition.

ARTICLE 17.

Each of the High Contracting Parties shall defray the expenses occasioned by the arrest within its territories, the detention, and the conveyance to its frontier, of the persons whom it may have consented to surrender in pursuance of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE 18.

His Britannic Majesty may accede to the present Treaty on behalf of any of His Dominions hereafter named—that is to say, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, and Newfoundland—and India. Such accession shall be effected by a notice to that effect given by His Britannic Majesty's representative at Baghdad, which shall specify

the authority to which the requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in the Dominion concerned, or India, as the case may be, shall be addressed. From the date when such notice comes into effect the territory of the Dominion concerned or of India shall be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purposes of the present Treaty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India, on behalf of which His Britannic Majesty has acceded, shall be made by the appropriate diplomatic or consular officer of Iraq.

Either High Contracting Party may terminate this Treaty separately in respect of any of the above-mentioned Dominions or India. Such termination shall be effected by a notice given in accordance with the provisions of Article 22.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this article in respect of one of His Britannic Majesty's Dominions may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, and which is being administered by the Government of the Dominion concerned; such territory shall, if so included, be deemed to be territory of His Britannic Majesty for the purpose of the present Treaty. Any notice given under the third paragraph of this article shall be applicable to such mandated territory.

ARTICLE 19.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any territory of His Britannic Majesty other than Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man, or the Dominions or India mentioned in Article 18, shall be made to the Governor, or chief authority, of such territory by the appropriate diplomatic or consular officer of Iraq.

Such requisition shall be dealt with by the competent authorities of such territory: provided, nevertheless, that if an order for the committal of the fugitive criminal to prison to await surrender shall be made, the said Governor or chief authority may, instead of issuing a warrant for the surrender of such fugitive, refer the matter to His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.

ARTICLE 20.

This Treaty shall apply in the same manner as if they were Possessions of His Britannic Majesty to the following British Protectorates, that is to say, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Gambia Protectorate, Kenya Protectorate, Nigeria Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, Nyasaland, Sierra Leone Protectorate, Solomon Islands Protectorate, Somaliland Protectorate, Swaziland, Uganda Protectorate and Zanzibar, and to the following territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, that is to say, Cameroons under British Mandate, Togoland under British Mandate, the Tanganyika Territory, Palestine, and Transjordan.

ARTICLE 21.

If after the signature of the present Treaty it is considered advisable to extend its provisions to any British Protectorates other than those mentioned in the preceding article or to any British-protected State, or to any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, other than those mandated territories mentioned in Articles 18 and 20, the stipulations of Articles 18 and 19 shall be deemed to apply to such Protectorates or States or mandated territories from the date and in the manner prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

ARTICLE 22.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

In the absence of an express provision to that effect, a notice given under the first paragraph of this article shall not affect the operation of the Treaty as between Iraq and any territory in respect of which notice of accession has been given under Article 18.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratification shall be exchanged at Baghdad as soon as possible.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in English and Arabic, of which, in the case of divergence, the English text shall prevail, at Baghdad, this second day of May, 1932, corresponding with the twenty-sixth day of Dhulhijjah, 1350, Hijrah.

"Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the incomes of the said Archdeaconry of Canterbury and of the said Archdeaconry of Maidstone should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the grants hereinafter recommended and proposed will not have the effect of raising the annual incomes provided for such Archdeaconries out of the Common Fund created by the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and will not raise the whole incomes of those Archdeaconries, including the income derived from any ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto, beyond the sum of £1,000 per annum:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that, subject as is hereinafter mentioned, we, the said Ecclesias-

tical Commissioners, be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund, by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year, (first) to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Canterbury and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a yearly sum of £125, and (secondly) to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Maidstone and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a yearly sum of £125 such yearly sums to take effect and be calculated as from the 1st day of January, 1933. Provided always that before any payment in respect of any of the said yearly sums shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees or any of these fees or payments shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacons of the said Archdeaconries, and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacons.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive one of the said yearly sums of £125 hereinbefore recommended to be paid to the said Archdeacon of Canterbury and the said Archdeacon of Maidstone respectively shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry, such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Denston and Stradishall duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report :

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report :

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Denston and Stradishall are now full, the Reverend Alexander McKechnie being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Denston and the Reverend Henry Stirling Grant being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stradishall :

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Denston and the said Benefice of Stradishall shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Stradishall with Denston ’ but that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Denston only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Stradishall and the then Incumbent of Denston shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Stradishall only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the

said Benefice of Denston; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Denston if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Stradishall shall have been instituted to Stradishall subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Stradishall before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Stradishall following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Denston and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Denston shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stradishall shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patron of the said Benefice of Denston shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Stradishall shall have the second and the third turns.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme :

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid :

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
