APPOINTMENT OF A STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Hackney Carriages at the following place, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:—

APPOINTMENT.

AT STATION ROAD, BALHAM ...

Twenty Hackney Carriages in two portions:

First Portion.—Twelve cabs on South side of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the Eastern pillar of centre entrance to No. 3 Station Road, extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for twelve cabs.

Front of cabs toward the West.

Second Portion.—Eight cabs on South side of roadway, commencing at a point thirty-two yards East of the Southern door post of shop entrance No. 17 Culmore Road, extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for eight cabs.

Front of cabs toward the West.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by cabs from the second portion, which is to be approached by way of Bedford Hill.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.
