WHEREAS His Majesty is satisfied upon consideration of a report from the Lord Chancellor and the Secretary of State that, having regard to the law of Belgium as to the recognition therein of public registers of the United Kingdom as authentic records and as to the proof of the contents of such registers and other matters by means of duly authenticated certificates issued by public officers in the United Kingdom, it is desirable in the interests of reciprocity to make with respect to Belgian public registers and certificates issued by public officers in Belgium such provision as is hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers conferred upon Him by the Evidence (Foreign, Dominion and Colonial Documents) Act, 1933 (23 Geo. 5. c. 4), and other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Evidence (Belgium) Order, 1933.

(2) This Order extends to all parts of the United Kingdom and shall come into operation forthwith.

Public Registers.

2. The Belgian registers, whether those in the custody of the *Officiers de l'état civil* (Registrars of Births, etc.) or those in the custody of the *Greffiers* (Clerks) of the *Tribunaux* of first instance, containing such *actes de l'état civil* (entries relating to civil status) as are specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order shall be deemed to be public registers kept under the authority of the law of Belgium and recognised by the courts of Belgium as authentic records and to be documents of such a public nature as to be admissible as evidence of the matters regularly recorded therein.

3. For the purposes of the last preceding Article the matters which are specified in the second column of the said Schedule as appropriate to be recorded as part of an entry of a particular description, shall, if they are recorded in such a register as aforesaid as part of an entry of that description, be deemed, until the contrary is proved, to be regularly recorded.

4. Subject to any requirements of rules of court, a document which purports to be issued in Belgium as an official copy of an entry in any such register as aforesaid and which—

(a) in the case of a register in the custody of an *Officier de l'état civil*, purports to be signed and authenticated by that officer or his deputy and to bear the printed or stamped emblem of the communal administration; and

(b) in the case of a register in the custody of the *Greffier* of a Tribunal of first instance, purports to be signed and authenticated by that officer or his deputy and to bear the printed or stamped emblem of the Tribunal, shall, without evidence as to the custody of the register or of inability to produce it and without any further or other proof, be received as evidence that the register contains such an entry;

Provided that where in any legal proceedings, such a document as aforesaid is sought to be used for the purpose of obtaining a payment out of court or of establishing a title to property, the document shall not, unless the court for special reasons otherwise order, be admitted as evidence unless the court is satisfied that it was issued not more than twelve months before the date on which it is so sought to be used and was so issued in response to a specific request for a complete copy of the entry in question (including the marginal notes thereto, if any) and not as a mere summary of the effect of the entry.

Official Certificates.

5. Subject to any requirements of rules of court, a certificate purporting to be given in Belgium as an official certificate of any such class as is specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order and purporting to be signed by the officer and to be authenticated in the manner specified in the second and third columns of that Schedule respectively as appropriate in the case of a certificate of that class shall be received as evidence of the facts stated in the certificate.

General.

6. It is hereby declared that a document issued in Belgium by a public officer, as proof of any matter for the proof of which by a document under the signature of that officer, and the appropriate seal or emblem, provision is made by this Order is not, if otherwise admissible, in evidence, inadmissible for any purpose by reason only that it is not authenticated by the process known as legalisation.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of January, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, and Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting

the union, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of London embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, now belongs to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, in right of his See and the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, is also the Patron in right of his See of the Benefice of Ealing, Castle Hill, Saint Stephen, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, now belongs to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be desirable for the purpose of more conveniently carrying into effect the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, in regard to the Union of Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed that an exchange should be made of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, for the Patronage of the said Benefice of Ealing, Castle Hill, Saint Stephen, to the intent that

the Patronage of the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted shall belong wholly to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, is now full, the Reverend George Wallace Johnston being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed hereto), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the Patronage of the said Benefice of Ealing, Castle Hill, Saint Stephen, which is now vested in the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as aforesaid, shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and duly published in the London Gazette, be transferred from the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors, and shall become and be absolutely vested in and be exercisable by the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, and that in exchange for such Patronage so transferred the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, which is now vested in the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, shall in like manner and by the same authority be transferred from the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, and shall become and be absolutely vested in the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"2. That the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, and the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, with Saint Jude' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"4. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to

become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, and the then Incumbent of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, shall have been instituted to Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, shall be transferred to the Church of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"6. That in the event of the services of any of the Church officers or servants of the Church of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such Church officers and servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of Clause 10 of this Scheme receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of office and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of London equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us, in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"7. That upon the union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"8. That upon the union taking effect (a) the two Curate Grants of £120 per annum each at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in respect of the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, shall be combined to form one Grant of £240 per annum payable conditionally upon the employment of a Curate within the Parish of the United

Benefice at a stipend of not less than £240 per annum and (b) the three Curate Grants of £120 per annum, £60 per annum and £27 per annum respectively at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in respect of the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, together with the capital sum of £600 at present held by us on behalf of the same Benefice and in respect of which a payment of £27 per annum is now made towards the stipend of a Curate shall be appropriated as a provision towards the stipend of a second Curate for the United Benefice and the combined amount of £234 per annum shall be payable conditionally upon the employment of a second Curate within the Parish of the United Benefice at a stipend of not less than £234 per annum.

"9. That after the said union has taken effect the right of Patronage of and presentation to the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishoprpic for ever.

"10.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923 ;

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the making good of the structure of the Parish Hall and Verger's House adjoining the Church so far as may be necessary on account of the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) a sufficient sum shall be appropriated for the payment of the compensation or compensations mentioned in Clause 6 of this Scheme or for the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations as in the same Clause is provided and (2) a sum sufficient in our opinion to produce an annual income of £50 shall be reserved out of such net proceeds and transferred to the London Diocesan Board of Finance or other Body of Trustees as a Fabric Endowment Fund in connection with the said Parish Hall and Verger's House, and of the residue of such net proceeds one-fifth shall be paid into the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London, and the remaining four-fifths of the residue of such net proceeds shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church for a District to be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which such Church shall be built ;

(c) That the font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of London, and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel, Churches or Chapels within the said Diocese of London which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude.

"11. That upon the union taking effect a part of the endowments and property of the said Benefices of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, and Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, that is to say (a) an annual stipend of £133 being part of a larger annual stipend at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, and (b) a capital sum of £2,326 15s. 11d. now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Saint Pancras, Holy Cross, and available for the purpose of providing a Parsonage House therefor, shall (together with all interest accumulated in respect of the said capital sum) be severed and diverted from the United Benefice and shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the proposed new District contemplated by Clause 10 (b) of this Scheme.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under that Measure of the site of any church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the Church of Gray's Inn Road, Saint Jude, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto.

"And provided further than nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said

Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923 :

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules :

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme :

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid :

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months :

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme :

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 6th day of April, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen

Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal Residence belonging to the See of Manchester :

“Whereas the Right Reverend Guy, now Bishop of Manchester, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same :

“And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £300 (being a sum which does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Manchester :

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £300 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of twelve years or until the said sum of £300 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one-tenth part of the said principal sum of £300 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to

be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Guy, now Bishop of Manchester, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

“And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £300 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire

into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Raydon and Shelley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Shelley and the Parishes of the Benefices of Layham and Polstead, both in the said County of Suffolk and in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Raydon before that date and shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Raydon following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Shelley and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shelley shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Raydon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Raydon.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make an alteration in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Lord Bishop of Southwark, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

“ I Richard Godfrey by Divine Permission Bishop of Southwark do in pursuance of the 26th section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria cap. 106 hereby represent to your Grace:—

“ 1. There is in the County of Surrey and my Diocese the Rectory of Chipstead the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parishes of Kingswood and Merstham and which contains according to the census of One thousand nine hundred and twenty one a population of Nine hundred and ninety two but which has since that date increased to approximately One thousand three hundred and fifty and the net annual value thereof is Five hundred and ninety six pounds.

“ 2. There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory of Merstham the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead and contains according to the census of One thousand nine hundred and twenty one a population of two thousand four hundred and three but which has since that date increased to approximately two thousand five hundred and the net annual value thereof is Seven hundred and seventy pounds.

“ 3. In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of Kingswood the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead and contains according to the census of One thousand nine hundred and twenty one a population of Two thousand five hundred and ninety seven but which has since that date increased to approximately Five thousand and the net annual value thereof is Three hundred and seventy pounds.

“ 4. The North Westerly portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead lying to the North West of Outwood Lane lies at a distance from the Church of Chipstead and adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Kingswood.

“ 5. The North Westerly portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Merstham lying to the West of the Old Main Line of the Southern Railway lies at a distance from the Church of Merstham and adjacent to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead.

“ 6. It appears to me that the following alterations in the boundaries of the said respective Parishes may be made with advantage to the interests of religion videlicet: (a) the

North Westerly portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead be united to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Kingswood and (b) the North Westerly portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Merstham be united to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead.

“ 7. The Reverend John William Morris is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Chipstead and your Grace in right of your said Archbishopric is the Patron thereof.

“ 8. The Reverend Agmond Edward Wilkinson is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Merstham and your Grace in right of your said Archbishopric is the Patron thereof.

“ 9. The Reverend William Alexander Dunn is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Kingswood and The Rochester and Southwark Diocesan Church Trust are the Patrons thereof.

“ 10. Pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act, I, the Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the said portion of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead so proposed to be annexed to the Ecclesiastical Parish of Kingswood and the said portion of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Merstham so proposed to be annexed to the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Dues, Rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested.

“ And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents of the said respective Parishes and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the Consents of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents thereto to His Majesty in Council.”

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

“ **SCHEME.**

“ 1. It is proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead in the County of Surrey and Diocese of Southwark and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of Kingswood.

“ Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead which is bounded on the West by the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Kingswood on the North in part by the Parish of Banstead and on all other sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of Outwood Lane where the Western boundary of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead crosses such Lane from which point the said imaginary line proceeds in a North Easterly direction along the centre of Outwood Lane aforesaid until it reaches a point opposite the footpath leading from Outwood Lane at the North Eastern corner of Well Copse from whence the said imaginary line turns in a Westerly or North Westerly direction along the centre of the said footpath until it reaches the Southern boundary of the Chipstead Valley Branch of the Southern Railway whence it proceeds in a Westerly direction along such boundary until

it reaches the boundary between the said Ecclesiastical Parishes of Chipstead and Banstead.

"Such District is coloured pink on the plan hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'A'.

"2. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Merstham in the same County and Diocese and unite the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead.

"Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Merstham which is bounded on the West by the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Chipstead on the East by an imaginary line running along the Western boundary of the Main Line of the Southern Railway and on all other sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of Church Lane where the boundary of the said Ecclesiastical Parishes of Chipstead and Merstham cross such lane from which point the said imaginary line proceeds in a South Easterly direction along the centre of Church Lane until it reaches the centre of Brighton Road whence it turns in a Southerly direction along the centre of Brighton Road until it reaches a point opposite the centre of the Lane leading from Brighton Road to Chaldon from which point the said imaginary line turns in an Easterly direction along the centre of the last mentioned road until it reaches the Western boundary of the Main line of the Southern Railway.

"Such District is coloured Green on the plan hereto annexed and thereon indicated by the letter 'B'.

"3. The Inhabitants of the said Districts shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes from which they are separated (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within any of the said Churches) but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Churches of the respective Parishes to which such Districts are respectively united and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868, to the repair of such last mentioned Churches.

"4. The Incumbent of the respective Parish to which each such District is united shall have sole and exclusive cure of Souls within such District or Districts as are so united to his Parish.

"5. The inhabitants of the said Districts shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms and churchings solemnised and performed in the Churches of the respective Parishes to which such Districts are respectively united.

"6. All fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said Districts shall henceforth belong to the Incumbents of the Parishes to which such Districts are respectively united.

"7. No alteration shall be made in the Patronage or Endowments of the said Benefices or any of them.

"That there is in the County of Kent and my Diocese of Canterbury the Vicarage or Benefice of Hythe the Parish whereof contains (according to the 1921 Census) a population of

six thousand eight hundred and seventy-three or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church and St. Michael's Mission Church for one thousand and eighty persons and being of the net annual value of four hundred and eighty one pounds or thereabouts.

"That there is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Lympne with West Hythe the Parish whereof contains (according to the 1921 Census) a population of seven hundred and eighty six or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for two hundred and seventy persons and being of the net annual value of three hundred and seventy eight pounds or thereabouts.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, all that portion of the Parish of Lympne with West Hythe which is verged red on the plan hereto annexed may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Lympne with West Hythe and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Hythe to which it is contiguous.

"That the Patron of the Benefice of Hythe is the Reverend Sydney Wilson Ruscoe Rector of Saltwood and the Reverend Charles William Chastel de Boynville is the present Incumbent thereof.

"That the Patron of the Benefice of Lympne with West Hythe is the Venerable Edward Hoare Hardcastle Archdeacon of Canterbury and the Reverend George Herbert Green is the present Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty sixth section of the said Pluralities Act I have drawn up the following Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands Tithe rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which Scheme together with the Consents thereto of the Reverend Sydney Wilson Ruscoe as Patron of the Benefice of Hythe and of the said Reverend Charles William Chastel de Boynville as Incumbent thereof and of the Venerable Edward Hoare Hardcastle Archdeacon of Canterbury as Patron of the Benefice of Lympne with West Hythe and of the said Reverend George Herbert Green as Incumbent thereof I do certify by this my Report to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

"COSMO CANTUAR:"

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents referred to in the said Report are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That there shall be separated from the Ecclesiastical Parish of Lympne with West Hythe and annexed to the Parish of Hythe all that portion of the Parish of Lympne with West Hythe which is verged red on the plan hereto annexed.

"That the Incumbent of Hythe shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within the

portion of the Parish of Lympne with West Hythe so to be separated from Lympne with West Hythe and annexed to Hythe.

"That the inhabitants of such portion so to be separated shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Hythe but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of Lympne with West Hythe except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the Parish Church of Lympne with West Hythe and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion so to be separated shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Hythe as they might have had in the Parish Church of Lympne with West Hythe.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (but excluding Tithes if any) arising from the said portion so to be separated from the Parish of Lympne with West Hythe shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Hythe.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said Benefices or either of them."

"CONSENTS.

"We, The Reverend Sydney Wilson Ruscoe Rector of the Rectory of Saltwood in the County of Kent the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Hythe (if the same were now vacant) the Reverend Charles William Chastel de Boynville Incumbent of the same Benefice, the Venerable Edward Hoare Hardcastle Archdeacon of Canterbury the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Lympne with West Hythe (if the same were now vacant) and the Reverend George Herbert Green the Incumbent of the same Benefice, do hereby respectively signify our Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Wood Green, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing Local Authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that Borough, either with or without any adjoining or other place, and also of any officer of that Authority:

And whereas Sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, Section 1 of the School Boards Act, 1885, and Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas Section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an Urban District Council is constituted or included in a Borough, all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by, attaching to, or vested in, that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as, or similar to, those of that Act, or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district, shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the Council of such Borough:

And whereas the Urban District of Wood Green, in the Administrative County of Middlesex comprises the Parish of Wood Green, and is an Urban District for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council (hereinafter called "The District Council") of Wood Green are the Local Authority:

And whereas it is proposed by a Charter of Incorporation to create the Urban District of Wood Green a Municipal Borough, to incorporate its inhabitants, and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Urban Districts of Wood Green and Southgate were constituted a Parliamentary Division, and return one member to serve in Parliament:

And whereas under the provisions of the Education Act, 1921, the District Council are a local education authority for the purposes of elementary education, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was approved by the Board of Education on the 1st day of September, 1903:

And whereas the District Council, on the 28th day of October, 1903, under section 74 of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, as amended by the Education Acts, 1876 to 1902, made Bye-laws with respect to school attendance which were sanctioned by the Board of Education on the 21st day of April, 1904, and such Bye-laws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas the District Council on the 24th day of February, 1926, under Part VIII. of the Education Act, 1921, made Bye-laws with respect to the Employment of Children and Street Trading by Young Persons which Bye-laws were confirmed by the Secretary of State on the 1st day of June, 1926, and such Bye-laws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas by virtue of a Scheme made by the Inclosure Commissioners for England and Wales, and confirmed by the Metropolitan Commons Supplemental Act, 1882, Tottenham Commons were to be regulated and managed by the Local Board for the District of Tottenham:

And whereas by virtue of the Tottenham Local Board (Division of District) Act, 1888, such portions of the said Tottenham Commons as were situated within the District of the thereby constituted Local Board for Wood Green were transferred to and vested in and were thenceforth to be regulated and managed by the Local Board for Wood Green as fully and effectually as if the Local Board for Wood Green had been mentioned in that behalf in the hereinbefore recited Commons Scheme:

And whereas the Parish of Wood Green is united for burial purposes with the Parish of Tottenham and the two Parishes together form the District of the Tottenham and Wood Green Burial Board:

And whereas by a Scheme made on the 13th day of July, 1917, by the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales the Urban District Council of Wood Green became entitled to appoint the Five Representative Trustees of the Wood Green (Urban District) Charity:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers, and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactment in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the School Boards Act, 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Wood Green Scheme, 1933.

(2) In this Scheme, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"The appointed day" means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Wood Green;

"The Borough" means the Municipal Borough of Wood Green;

"The Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

"The District" means the existing Urban District of Wood Green;

"The District Council" means the existing Urban District Council of Wood Green;
 "The Municipal Corporations Acts" means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

"Duties" include responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty, or for punishing the breach of any duty;

"Liabilities" include all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would, but for this Scheme, be liable, whether accruing before, on or after the appointed day;

"Local Authority" means a Local Authority as defined in Section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

"Powers" include rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;

"Property" includes all property, real and personal, and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in, to and out of property, real and personal, including things in action, and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation, whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS ETC., OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3.—(1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the Local Authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and, save as provided in this Article, the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the Council of a Borough containing, according to the census of 1881, or any later census, a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the Council of a Borough in relation to the appointment of a Watch Committee, a Police force of Special Constables, or the levy of a Watch Rate under Part IX of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of Police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Corporation shall not exercise any of the powers or duties, or be subject to the liabilities in relation to the execution of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, or of the Weights and Measures Acts, 1878-1926; but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by, and be attached to, the County Council of the Administrative County of Middlesex, and the area of the Borough shall

for all purposes of the Acts relating to the matters mentioned above form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a Borough.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC., OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4.—(1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist, and, subject to the provisions of this Scheme, their powers and duties, including those under any Local Act, Provisional Order, or Order shall be transferred to, and attach to, the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by, or attach to, the District Council for the benefit of the District, shall be exercisable by, or attach to, the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in, or attach to, the District Council shall on the appointed day, by virtue of this Scheme, be transferred to, vest in, and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired, or the liabilities incurred, in the execution of an Act of Parliament, the property and liabilities shall be held by, and be discharged by, the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the Council of a Borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall, by virtue of this Scheme, be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to the Corporation in respect of the Borough.

6. Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the Urban District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

7.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing, and for the payment of the interest thereon, shall, by virtue of this Scheme, be transferred to, and attach to, the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this Article applies shall, together with the interest to

accrue due thereon, be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned, or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid, or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this Article, or the powers of any person entitled under such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme, the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

8. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme, the unrepealed provisions of:—

(a) The Local Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme, and the Confirmation Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Scheme (so far as the last-mentioned Acts relate to the Provisional Orders specified in that Schedule), and

(b) Any other Local Act, Provisional Order duly confirmed, or Order having the force of an Act, and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such Local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present Session of Parliament);

as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall apply and extend to the Borough, and any reference therein to the Local Government District of Wood Green or the Urban District of Wood Green and the Local Board or the Council thereof shall be deemed to refer to the Borough and Corporation thereof.

9. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act, or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall, in respect of all matters relating to, or affecting, any part of the District, enure to the benefit of the Corporation, and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS.

10. Such of the provisions of:—

(a) The Baths and Washhouses Acts, 1846 to 1925;

(b) The Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890;

(c) The Public Libraries Acts, 1892 to 1919;

(d) The Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts, 1899 to 1923;

(e) The Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

(f) The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890;

(g) The Public Health Act, 1925;

as shall have been adopted by the District Council, and shall be in force within the District immediately before the appointed day, shall be in force in and apply to the Borough,

as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

BYE-LAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

11.—(1) All Bye-laws made before the 1st January, 1923, which, under the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health, whether made before or after the passing of that Act, shall cease to be in force within the Borough on the expiry of one year from the appointed day.

(2) Any reference to the Wood Green Local Board or the Wood Green Urban District Council in:—

(a) Any bye-law, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments, or scale of charges; or

(b) Any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or Local Authority;

which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (2) of this Article applies to the Local Government District of Wood Green or the Urban District of Wood Green shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

12. Any bye-laws made by the County Council of Middlesex under Section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, or under Section 11 of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act, 1928, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District, shall, until the 1st day of January, 1936, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those bye-laws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the bye-laws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by bye-laws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

13.—(1) The hereinbefore recited Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee of the District Council shall, until duly revoked or altered, continue in force and have effect as if references to the Corporation and the Borough were substituted for references to the District Council and the District, and reference to the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November were substituted for the reference to the annual meeting of the District Council.

(2) The Members of the Education Committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Council of the Borough under the said Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee, and shall hold office until the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November, 1933.

14. The hereinbefore recited School Attendance Bye-laws and Bye-laws with respect to the Employment of Children and Street Trading by Young Persons made under the Education Acts in force in the Urban District at the commencement of this Scheme shall apply to the Borough until revoked or altered by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

15.—(1) Every officer of the District Council who having been in their employment imme-

diately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and for a period of not less than one year before that date, by virtue of this Scheme or in pursuance or in consequence thereof, suffers any direct pecuniary loss by determination of his appointment, or by diminution or loss of fees, salary or emoluments, shall be entitled to compensation for that loss.

For the purposes of this clause any officer whose appointment is determined, or whose salary is reduced by the Corporation within four years after the commencement of this Scheme because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, shall be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(2) The provisions set out in the Eighth Schedule to the Local Government Act, 1929, shall apply to the determination and payment of compensation under this clause, subject to the following and any other necessary modifications:—

(a) Any reference in that Schedule to "the Council" shall be construed as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) Any reference in that Schedule to "the appointed day" shall be construed as a reference to the appointed day as defined in this Scheme.

(3) All fees or remuneration received and retained by an officer in connection with the preparation of the jurors' book or the register of electors under the Representation of the People Acts shall, subject to a reasonable deduction for any expenses incurred by the officer, be regarded as part of the emoluments of the officer for the purposes of compensation.

(4) No officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(5) For the purposes of this Article and of the provisions of the Eighth Schedule to the said Act of 1929, as applied by this Article:—

(i) The expression "officer" includes a servant; and

(ii) A teacher employed in a public elementary school maintained but not provided by the District Council or the Corporation shall be deemed to be an officer employed by the District Council or the Corporation, and if his services are dispensed with by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation, he shall be deemed to be an officer whose services are dispensed with by the Corporation.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

16.—(1) The accounts of the District Council and of their Committees and Officers shall be made up to the appointed day, and shall be audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the District Auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

17.—(1) The District Council shall, by the levy of a rate, liquidate as far as practicable

before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day, and all other sums then due to the District Council, may be recovered by the Corporation.

18.—(1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate, or shall prejudicially affect or prevent, the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council, or any contract, deed, bond, agreement, or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors);

Provided that:—

(a) Any action, cause of action, or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if, instead of that Council (or their predecessors), the Corporation had been a party thereto.

(2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such a manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

19. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary, or affect any power, right, interest, or jurisdiction in or over or in connection with any charitable endowment.

20. Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the limits for the supply of gas or electricity by any company, body or local authority under any Act or any Provisional Order confirmed by Parliament or under any Order made in pursuance of the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 and 1929, or the Electricity Supply Acts, 1882 to 1928, nor shall the existing powers or charges of any such company, body or local authority under any Act or Order be prejudiced or affected thereby.

21. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day, shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

22. Notwithstanding the Incorporation of the Borough, and the provisions of this Scheme, all assessments, orders, apportionments, notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into, or done before the appointed day by or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, done, entered into, or done by or with reference to the Corporation, instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on, or enforced in the same manner, in all respects as if the Corporation, instead of the District Council, had been party or privy to the same, and had been named or referred to therein.

4. Articles included in any of the accompanying lists will, subject to the provisions of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, be chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, as amended, on and after the 12th May, 1933.
