

*Privy Council Office,
Whitehall, 28th April, 1933.*

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Wood Green, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing Local Authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that Borough, either with or without any adjoining or other place, and also of any officer of that Authority:

And whereas Sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, Section 1 of the School Boards Act, 1885, and Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas Section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an Urban District Council is constituted or included in a Borough, all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by, attaching to, or vested in, that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as, or similar to, those of that Act, or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district, shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the Council of such Borough:

And whereas the Urban District of Wood Green, in the Administrative County of Middlesex comprises the Parish of Wood Green, and is an Urban District for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council (hereinafter called "The District Council") of Wood Green are the Local Authority:

And whereas it is proposed by a Charter of Incorporation to create the Urban District of Wood Green a Municipal Borough, to incorporate its inhabitants, and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Urban Districts of Wood Green and Southgate were constituted a Parliamentary Division, and return one member to serve in Parliament:

And whereas under the provisions of the Education Act, 1921, the District Council are a local education authority for the purposes of elementary education, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was approved by the Board of Education on the 1st day of September, 1903:

And whereas the District Council, on the 28th day of October, 1903, under section 74 of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, as amended by the Education Acts, 1876 to 1902, made Bye-laws with respect to school attendance which were sanctioned by the Board of Education on the 21st day of April, 1904, and such Bye-laws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas the District Council on the 24th day of February, 1926, under Part VIII. of the Education Act, 1921, made Bye-laws with respect to the Employment of Children and Street Trading by Young Persons which Bye-laws were confirmed by the Secretary of State on the 1st day of June, 1926, and such Bye-laws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas by virtue of a Scheme made by the Inclosure Commissioners for England and Wales, and confirmed by the Metropolitan Commons Supplemental Act, 1882, Tottenham Commons were to be regulated and managed by the Local Board for the District of Tottenham:

And whereas by virtue of the Tottenham Local Board (Division of District) Act, 1888, such portions of the said Tottenham Commons as were situated within the District of the thereby constituted Local Board for Wood Green were transferred to and vested in and were thenceforth to be regulated and managed by the Local Board for Wood Green as fully and effectually as if the Local Board for Wood Green had been mentioned in that behalf in the hereinbefore recited Commons Scheme:

And whereas the Parish of Wood Green is united for burial purposes with the Parish of Tottenham and the two Parishes together form the District of the Tottenham and Wood Green Burial Board:

And whereas by a Scheme made on the 13th day of July, 1917, by the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales the Urban District Council of Wood Green became entitled to appoint the Five Representative Trustees of the Wood Green (Urban District) Charity:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers, and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactment in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the School Boards Act, 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Wood Green Scheme, 1933.

(2) In this Scheme, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"The appointed day" means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Wood Green;

"The Borough" means the Municipal Borough of Wood Green;

"The Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

"The District" means the existing Urban District of Wood Green;
