ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931.

Draft Regulations made by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under Section 13 of the above-mentioned Act have been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and are published herewith.

Representations by persons to whom the Regulations are applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council on or before the 2nd day of June, 1933.

The Architects Registration Council at their meeting held on the 28th day of March, 1933, resolved that the existing Regulations be amended and added to in manner following:—

By deleting the existing Regulation No. 26 and substituting therefor the following Regulation No. 26 in lieu thereof and by adding the additional Regulations Nos. 42, 43 and 44 hereinafter set out.

No. 26.—A person shall be eligible to apply for Registration under the Act (1) if he shall have passed any examination held in pursuance of Section 6 (4) of the Act or (2) if his application for Registration be made before the 31st December, 1933, and if on the 1st January, 1932, he was an Assistant Architect and at the time of his application had been engaged in the study and practice of Architecture in the United Kingdom for at least ten years or (3) if he shall at any time (whether before or after the recognition by the Council of the examination) have passed any one of the examinations

in architecture specified below (being the examinations recognised by the Council on the 16th day of December, 1932, on the recommendation of the Board of Architectural Education) namely:—

The Royal Institute of British Architects: Final Examination, Special Final Examination.

The School of Architecture, Robert Gordon's Colleges, Aberdeen: Diploma Final Examination.

The Birmingham School of Architecture, Central School of Arts and Crafts, Birmingham: Diploma Final Examination.

The Welsh School of Architecture, The Technical College, Cardiff: Diploma Examination.

The School of Architecture, Edinburgh College of Art: Diploma Final Examination.

The Glasgow School of Architecture: Diploma Final Examination, University of Glasgow Degree of Bachelor of Science in Architecture Final Examination.

The School of Architecture, Leeds College of Art: Diploma Examination.

The Liverpool School of Architecture, University of Liverpool: Final Examination for the Degree of Bachelor of Architecture, Final Examination for the Diploma in Architecture.

The School of Architecture, The Architectural Association, London: Diploma Final Examination.

The Bartlett School of Architecture, University of London: Final Examination

for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts in Architecture, Final Examination for the Diploma in Architecture.

The School of Architecture, University of Manchester: Bachelor of Arts degree with Honours in Architecture Final Examination, Certificate Final Examination.

XV.

Election of Members of the Council under sub-paragraph (vii) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule to the above Act.

42.—(1) Regulation 1 (Interpretation) of the Regulations approved by the Privy Council on the 24th day of October, 1932, shall apply to the Regulations following.

(2) In the Regulations following unless the context otherwise requires the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

The expression “unattached Architects” means registered persons not being architect members of any of the bodies referred to in sub-paragraphs (i) to (vi) (both inclusive) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule to the Act.

The expression “The appropriate number” in relation to the persons to be elected to membership of the Council at any election under these Regulations means a number representing one for every five hundred persons who on the 31st day of October preceding the election in question are unattached Architects (any fraction of five hundred being for this purpose reckoned as five hundred).

The expression “the Scrutineers” means the Solicitor for the time being and the Accountant for the time being of the Council and includes in the case of the inability of the said officers or either of them on any occasion to act in the performance of the duties by these Regulations assigned to the Scrutineers such persons or person (not being members or a member or candidates or a candidate for membership of the Council) as the Chairman for the time being of the Council may nominate to perform the said duties on such occasion.

43. The members to be elected under sub-paragraph (vii) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule to the Act shall be registered persons elected in manner hereinafter provided, by unattached Architects.

44.—(1) The Clerk shall on or as soon as may be after the 31st day of October in the year preceding the year in which the election is to be held prepare and sign a list of all unattached Architects whose names are on the Register on that day and shall distinguish each name entered in the said list by a serial number. The said list (hereinafter referred to as “the Voters List”) shall be conclusive and no person whose name is not entered therein shall be entitled to vote at the election in the ensuing year.

(2) The Clerk shall also ascertain which of the members of the Council elected under sub-paragraph (vii) of the First Schedule to the Act and holding office on the said 31st day of October are willing (if nominated and elected) to continue in office for a further year.

(3) In the ensuing month of November the Clerk shall send by post to each unattached Architect whose name is entered in the Voters List at his address appearing in the Register a

notice containing the particulars following, viz.:—

(a) A statement of the number of unattached Architects whose names appear in the Voters List

(b) A statement of the appropriate number of members of the Council to be elected by such unattached Architects in the ensuing year

(c) The names of such of the members of the Council elected under the said sub-paragraph (vii) and holding office on the said 31st day of October are willing (if nominated and elected) to continue in office for a further year together with a record of their respective attendances at meetings of the Council from the last preceding annual meeting down to the said 31st day of October

(d) An invitation to the addressee to sign and transmit to the Clerk at the office of the Council so as to be received by him not later than the ensuing 1st day of January (upon a form of nomination to be enclosed with the notice) nominations (to a number not exceeding the appropriate number) of registered persons for election as members of the Council for the year commencing at the close of the annual meeting to be held in the ensuing month of March together with a consent under the hand of every such nominee expressing his willingness (if elected) to serve as such member for the said period.

(4) In the said month of January the Clerk shall send by post to each person whose name is entered on the Voters List at his address appearing in the Register a voting paper containing a list (arranged alphabetically in the order of their surnames) of the candidates in respect of whom such nominations and consents have been received on or before the first day of that month and containing also the statements hereinafter mentioned.

(5) There shall be enclosed with each voting paper two envelopes namely (i) an envelope capable of holding the voting paper and indorsed with the serial number of the voter to whom it is sent and (ii) an envelope capable of holding the former envelope and its contents and addressed to the “Scrutineers” at the office of the Council.

(6) Every voting paper shall show the number of nominations received in due time in respect of each candidate and shall state on the face thereof

(a) the number (being the appropriate number) of votes which may be given by each voter

(b) that no more than one vote may be given for any one candidate

(c) that the vote must be given by placing a cross on the voting paper opposite the name of the candidate for whom the vote is given

(d) that the voting paper is not to be signed by the voter

(e) that the voting paper when completed is to be placed in the envelope bearing the serial number and that that envelope is to be signed on the outside thereof by the voter and closed up and placed in the envelope addressed to the Scrutineers

(f) that the envelope addressed to the Scrutineers is to be properly stamped and returned by post so as to be delivered in ordinary course of post not later than the ensuing 7th day of February.

(7) As to each envelope bearing the serial number and received on or before the said day the Scrutineers shall ascertain by reference to the Voters List whether the same appears to be signed by the voter whose serial number it bears and they shall destroy unopened any such envelope which is not received on or before the said day or which does not appear to be so signed. They shall open all the said envelopes which are received on or before the said day and appear to be so signed and shall extract the voting papers therefrom and shall count the votes thereby given for the several candidates and shall report the result to the Council.

(8) At the Annual meeting of the Council held in the ensuing month of March the Chairman presiding thereat shall declare to be elected the candidates (not exceeding the appropriate number) for whom the highest numbers of votes have been ascertained (in the manner above provided) to have been given.

(9) If an equality of votes is found to exist between any of the candidates and the addition of a vote would enable any such candidate to be declared elected the said Chairman may give such additional vote orally but if he be unwilling to give such vote he shall determine by lot which of the candidates whose votes are equal shall be elected and he shall declare the election accordingly.

(10) The candidates elected shall be entitled to retain office as members of the Council until the close of the Annual meeting thereof to be held in the month of March in the year succeeding the year of the election.
