UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 2ND MAY, 1933.

Whereas it is expedient to amend § 19 of Title XIX of the Statutes of the University of Oxford in order that, if in any year any part of the sum set aside for the payment of University Lecturers under the provisions of the said Title be not expended, the part not expended may be available for other purposes of the Common University Fund, now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

In *Statt. Tit. XIX. § 19. cl. 3 (1) (b)* (*Statuta*, ed. 1932, p. 349), lines 6-13 ("Provided that . . . year or years") shall be struck out and the following substituted: "Provided that if in any year the sum actually expended in payment of such stipends shall be less than

the sum set aside as hereinbefore provided, the unexpended balance shall become part of the remainder of the Fund."

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, in the University of Cambridge, on the 2nd day of May, 1933, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statutes having been duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College or Hall, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the second day of May, 1933 (notice of the proposed amending Statutes having been given to the University) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty The King in Council.

WE, The Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, commonly called Trinity Hall, in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the

power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College or Hall in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE X.

Law Studentships, Research Studentships and Prizes.

By deleting Section 1 of the Statute and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended Section 1:—

"1. The Governing Body may appoint to Law Studentships of an annual value of not less than fifty pounds and tenable for three years distinguished students of the College who have borne a good character throughout their University career and who intend to follow some branch of the legal profession and who have taken the degree of Doctor of Philosophy or of Bachelor of Arts or of Law, or being Affiliated Students are candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Law and have been placed in the first class in a Law Examination of the University. For this purpose the Governing Body may set aside in each year such sum as they may determine."

By deleting at the beginning of Section 2 the words "Distinguished Students" down to "for election to Law Studentships." inclusive.

STATUTE XVII.

College Officers.

By adding in Section 2 of this Statute the words "or Stewards" after the word "Steward" and the words "or Librarians" after the word "Librarian".

STATUTE XXII.

Removal of Members.

By deleting in Section 1 of this Statute the words "one year" and substituting therefor the words "six months".

STATUTE XXIII.

Application of Corporate Income.

By deleting in the first paragraph of Section 7 of this Statute the words "To the Master £400" and substituting therefor the words "To the Master £650".

By deleting the third paragraph of Section 7 of this Statute commencing with the words "Any Balance" and ending with the words "2 moduli" and substituting therefor the following to form an amended third paragraph:—

"Any balance remaining after the payment of the above dividends shall be divided into a number of moduli which shall not exceed the value of £150 each. Two such moduli shall be paid to the Master and to each of the Stipendiary Fellows."

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, on the 7th March, 1933, and concluded on the 3rd May, the following Verdicts of the Pyx Jury were delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz.:—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT. VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, to the 31st day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number

which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins with four additional coins from one of such packets making altogether two crowns, twenty-nine half-crowns, five florins, thirty-seven shillings, twenty-three sixpences, one fourpence, twenty-four threepences, two twopences and one penny. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We then took for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed comprising two crowns, ten half-crowns, four florins, seventeen shillings, ten sixpences, one fourpence, one threepence, two twopences and one penny, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, was, for such pound so taken for assay nil on the whole, and that, therefore, such pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus nine ten-thousandths (—.0009) on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, being one hundred and seventy thousandths of an ounce (+.170) above the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts.

Verdicts of the Pyx Jury were delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz. :—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PRETORIA BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Pretoria in the Union of South Africa, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, both days inclusive. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took out four coins from each of such packets of gold coins except one packet from which we took one coin amounting altogether to forty-five sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed separately each of the said coins so taken out, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight so prescribed was minus two thousandths of an ounce ($-.002$ oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted all the said gold coins so taken out and separately weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Trial Plate of gold produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said ingot was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus five hundred-thousandths (or $-.00005$), and that therefore the said metal was within the remedy as to fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the said coins remaining in the said packets of gold coins, and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation of from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, being five thousandths of an ounce above the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts. We then took from such residue four sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 123.300 grains, the second 123.317 grains, the third 123.138 grains, the fourth 123.369 grains, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively the first twenty-six thousandths of a grain above ($+.026$), the second forty-three thousandths of a grain above ($+.043$), the third one hundred and thirty-six thousandths of a grain below ($-.136$), the fourth ninety-five thousandths of a grain above ($+.095$), the standard weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920.

We then assayed the said four sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.52, the second 916.88, the third 916.52, the fourth 916.56, and that therefore the said sovereigns

were respectively—the first fourteen hundred-thousandths below ($-.00014$), the second twenty-two hundred-thousandths above ($+.00022$), the third fourteen hundred-thousandths below ($-.00014$), the fourth ten hundred-thousandths below ($-.00010$), the standard fineness prescribed as aforesaid.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, Clause 4 of the General Regulations respecting appointment to His Majesty's Civil Establishments, made under the Order in Council of the 22nd July, 1920, and published in the London Gazette of the 6th April, 1923, has been amended to read as follows, viz.:—

4. Subject to the provisos appended to this clause every candidate shall satisfy the Commissioners that he is free from any physical defect or disease that would be likely to interfere with the proper discharge of his duties.

Provided that in the case of an officer holding a pensionable situation in any of His Majesty's Civil Establishments who is a candidate for another situation in those Establishments the Commissioners may, at their discretion, if they see fit, grant their certificate of qualification on being satisfied that he is fully qualified in respect of age, character, knowledge and ability, without requiring evidence as to freedom from physical defect or disease, provided they are satisfied that the situation to which it is proposed to appoint him does not require a higher degree of physical capacity than the situation which he already holds.

Provided also that in the case of persons whose health has been impaired by reason of service in His Majesty's Forces during the Great War, the Commissioners may on the conditions and in the manner prescribed by the Order in Council of 22nd March, 1918, issue Modified (War) Certificates and Special Recommendations which shall have effect as laid down in that Order and as if that Order had been part of the Regulations made under the Order of 22nd July, 1920.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANT MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS IN THE WORKS AND BUILDINGS DIRECTORATE OF THE AIR MINISTRY.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 25 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part, but must not have attained 30 years of age on that date.

Candidates who have served or are serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age, for this purpose, any time during which they have so served, but not exceeding 5 years.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is

or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

The consent of the authorities of the Air Ministry is required before the child of a naturalised British subject can be admitted to compete.

3. Until further order, special consideration will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces during the War.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army, or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

12. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS, 1877 TO 1927.

IMPORTATION OF RAW CHERRIES ORDER OF 1933.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927. The effect of the Order is to prohibit the landing in England or Wales after the 27th May of French cherries except those accompanied by certificates issued by the French Phytopathological Service to the effect that the cherries were grown within a small district in the north of France. This area is defined in a Schedule to the Order.

After the 5th June the landing in England or Wales of Italian cherries is prohibited except those grown in the Region of Emilia. After the 16th June the importation of cherries grown in any part of Italy is entirely prohibited. Consignments imported between the 6th and 16th June must be accompanied by certificates issued by the Italian Phytopathological Service.

German cherries imported after the 27th May must be accompanied by certificates of origin;

after the 26th June the importation of German cherries is prohibited except of those accompanied by certificates issued by the German Phytopathological Service to the effect that the cherries were not grown south of latitude 53° N. or in East Prussia.

Cherries grown in other European countries and imported after the 27th May must be accompanied by certificates of origin.

The certificates prescribed in the Order must be delivered to the Officer of Customs and Excise with the entry relating to the consignment.

Cherries landed without the certificates prescribed in the Order must be destroyed at the expense of the importer unless they are re-exported or are disposed of in accordance with the terms of a licence issued by an Inspector of the Ministry.

An Inspector may enter any premises and open, examine and take samples of any cherries shipped or believed to have been shipped from any country other than Scotland, Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man; any person wilfully obstructing or impeding an Inspector in the exercise of these powers, or failing to comply with the provisions relating to destruction or re-exportation, or with the terms of a licence, is liable to a penalty of £10, or in respect of a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty of £50.

The Order remains in force until the 30th September, 1933.
