PREPARATION OF PLANNING SCHEMES.

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

SECTION 7.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the Regulations from time to time made by him thereunder, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, has relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by the said Regulations upon the occasion of the Epsom Summer Meeting to be held at Epsom Downs on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, the 30th and 31st days of May, 1st and 2nd days of June, 1933, so that nothing in the said Regulations shall prevent any person who is maintaining at the date of this Notice a regular service on week-days in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon any of the approved routes shown in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto, from making on those days in any of the streets or parts thereof declared to be "re-

stricted streets" by any Order made by the Minister of Transport under the aforesaid Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and forming part of the approved route or approved routes shown in Column 2 of the said Schedule opposite to such first mentioned route such number of journeys with his omnibuses plying for hire in addition to those now made in the maintenance by him of any service or services on any approved route, as may be necessary to enable him to maintain on the approved routes shown in Column 2 of the said Schedule the services respectively shown in Column 3 of the said Schedule opposite to each of such approved routes shown in the said Column 2 provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

To extend and make applicable to the added areas, with or without amendment, all or some of the provisions contained in the above-mentioned Order of 1897 and in the Wallasey Order 1892, the Wallasey Tramways and Improvements Acts 1899 and 1906 and the Wallasey Corporation Act, 1927 and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

4. To incorporate in the Order such of the provisions contained in the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable and to apply such provisions to the undertaking authorised by the said Order of 1897 (as extended by any subsequent enactment) or to be authorised by the Order with such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

5. To prescribe the maximum price or prices that may be demanded by the Corporation in respect of any supply of electricity in the added areas.

6. To authorise the Corporation to break up in the added areas streets and parts of streets which are not repairable by the local authority and to exercise within the added areas all powers usually conferred upon distributors of electricity.

7. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928, and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter, vary or

extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

8. To provide (if and so far as necessary or expedient) for the transfer to the Corporation of those parts of the electricity undertaking of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Birkenhead which are situate in or relate to any part of the added areas and to confirm any agreement entered into between the Corporation and the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses with reference to such transfer.

9. To revoke the powers of the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses and the undertakers for the time being for the purposes of the Wirral and Neston Electricity Special Order 1925 respectively, with reference to the supply of electricity in any part or parts of the added areas and to repeal so much of the Birkenhead Electric Lighting (Extension) Orders 1900 and 1904, the said Wirral and Neston Electricity Special Order, 1925, section 50 of the Birkenhead Corporation Act, 1930, and any other Act or Order as relates to such supply.
