WALLASEY ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).

(Supply of electricity by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wallasey in parts of the Borough of Wallasey and matters incidental thereto).

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wallasey (hereinafter called "the Corporation") whose address is the Town Hall, Wallasey, intend to apply to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928, for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") for all or some of the following amongst other purposes, that is to say:—

1. To extend the area of supply under the Wallasey Electric Lighting Order, 1897 (as extended by any subsequent enactment) by adding thereto the several areas which were added to the Borough of Wallasey in pursuance of the County of Chester Review Order 1933, such areas being parts of the former parishes of Bidston-cum-Ford, Upton and Saughall Massie all in the former Rural District of Wirral.

The areas so proposed to be added to the said area of supply are hereinafter referred to as "the added areas."

2. To authorise the Corporation to generate, supply, distribute and sell electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928 within the added areas, and to confer upon the Corporation all necessary and usual powers in that behalf.

3. To extend and make applicable to the added areas, with or without amendment, all or some of the provisions contained in the above-mentioned Order of 1897 and in the Wallasey Order 1892, the Wallasey Tramways and Improvements Acts 1899 and 1906 and the Wallasey Corporation Act, 1927 and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

4. To incorporate in the Order such of the provisions contained in the schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable and to apply such provisions to the undertaking authorised by the said Order of 1897 (as extended by any subsequent enactment) or to be authorised by the Order with such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

5. To prescribe the maximum price or prices that may be demanded by the Corporation in respect of any supply of electricity in the added areas.

6. To authorise the Corporation to break up in the added areas streets and parts of streets which are not repairable by the local authority and to exercise within the added areas all powers usually conferred upon distributors of electricity.

7. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928, and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

8. To provide (if and so far as necessary or expedient) for the transfer to the Corporation of those parts of the electricity undertaking of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Birkenhead which are situate in or relate to any part of the added areas and to confirm any agreement entered into between the Corporation and the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses with reference to such transfer.

9. To revoke the powers of the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses and the undertakers for the time being for the purposes of the Wirral and Neston Electricity Special Order 1925 respectively, with reference to the supply of electricity in any part or parts of the added areas and to repeal so much of the Birkenhead Electric Lighting (Extension) Orders 1900 and 1904, the said Wirral and Neston Electricity Special Order, 1925, section 50 of the Birkenhead Corporation Act, 1930, and any other Act or Order as relates to such supply.
