"Whereas by the Authority of an Order of His late Majesty King William the Fourth in Council bearing date the 27th day of April, 1831, and published in the London Gazette on the 9th day of August, 1831, a District Parish was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint George, Barnsley, situate in the Parish of Silkstone, in the said County of York and at that time in the Diocese of York but now in the said Diocese of Wakefield, and the same is now known as 'The District Parish of Saint George, Barnsley':

"And whereas it has been proposed to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said District Parish of Saint George, Barnsley, should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Buchanan, Bishop of the said Diocese of Wakefield, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Vicarage of the said District Parish of Saint George, Barnsley, as of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Silkstone and of the Rectory of the Parochial Chapelry of Barnsley, in the said Parish of Silkstone, with the consent of the Reverend Charles Henry Archbould Bagshaw, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Silkstone aforesaid, with the consent of the Reverend Henry Evelyn Hone, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Wakefield, the Rector or Incument of the said Parochial Chapelry of Barnsley, and with the consent of the Reverend Isaac Clark, Clerk in Holy Orders and Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said District Parish of Saint George, Barnsley (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical. Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that from and after the day of the date of the

publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said District Parish of Saint George, Barnsley, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parochial Chapelry of Barnsley, in the said Parish of Silkstone, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parochial Chapelry and Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said District Parish of Saint George, Barnsley.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the District Parish of Saint George, Barnsley, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, being:-

"All that portion of the Parochial Chapelry of Barnsley, in the Parish of Silkstone, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the north east by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Barnsley, upon the south east by the New Parish of Saint John, Barnsley, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the west by the said District Parish of Saint George, Barnsley, and upon the remaining part of the north east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District Parish of Saint George, Barnsley, from the said Parochial Chapelry of Barnsley, at the junction of Market Hill and Eldon Street, and extending thence south eastward to and along the middle of Queen Street for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Cheapside, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Cheapside for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parochial Chapelry of Barnsley, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Barnsley."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in 'law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Seaham has been improved by means of certain leases and sales of glebe lands and of minerals within and under the glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice, which leases and sales were granted and carried out under the authority of the said Acts with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by former Incumbents of the said

Benefice of Seaham:

"And whereas the proceeds of the said leases and sales have been paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and have been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts and the investments so made include a sum of £12,881 18s. 3d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock forming part of the aforesaid sum of £12,881 18s. 3d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, or in respect of any securities or investments from time to time representing the said sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Seaham and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Parishes of Norwich, Saint Michael at Plea, and Norwich, Saint Peter, Hungate, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said two Parishes and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Parishes based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the Benefices of Norwich, Saint Michael at Plea, and Norwich, Saint Peter, Hungate, were united by Order in Council dated the 11th day of August, 1902, and by a Faculty dated the 13th day of January, 1906, the Church of Norwich, Saint Michael at Plea, was constituted the Parish Church of such United Benefice:

"And whereas the Church of Norwich, Saint Peter, Hungate, has ceased to be used and is no longer required for the purposes of Divine Service:

"And whereas the said United Benefice of Norwich, Saint Michael at Plea, with Saint Peter, Hungate, is now full, the Venerable George Martius MacDermott, Archdeacon of Norwich, being the present Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said George Martius MacDermott (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:-

"1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Parish of Norwich, Saint Michael at Plea, and the said Parish of Norwich, Saint Peter, Hungate, shall be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure. provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Norwich, Saint Michael at Plea, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Norwich, Saint Michael at Plea, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate if there be marriages registers current at the Church of Norwich, Saint Peter, Hungate, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"4. That as from the date of the union taking effect the said Church of Norwich, Saint Peter, Hungate, shall be appropriated for educational, charitable or other purposes in connection with the Church of England having in view the spiritual, intellectual, moral or social welfare of the Parishioners of the United Parish and others, and subject to such conditions, regulations, and provisions as the Bishop of Norwich shall by Deed made pursuant to the 24th Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, declare and appoint.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the appropriation of the said Church of Norwich, Saint Peter, Hungate, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the appropriation of any Church under the powers conferred by that Measure shall be obtained to the appropriation hereby proposed of the said Church of Norwich, Saint Peter,

Hungate.

"Provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England,

or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Norwich.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Moreton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Little Laver, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of

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the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Moreton and Little Laver duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Moreton and the Parish of the Benefice of Shelley, in the said County of Essex and in the said Diocese of Chelmsford, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended

in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Moreton is now full, the Reverend Reginald Henry Goode being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Little Laver is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Little-Laver is subject to a charge of £52 per annum under Section 2 of the Clergy Pensions (Older

Incumbents) Measure, 1930:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Reginald Henry Goode (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Moreton and the said Benefice of Little Laver shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Moreton with Little Laver' but that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Reginald Henry Goode if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Moreton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Moreton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Little Laver and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That at any time and from time to time after the union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may

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be necessary not exceeding the sum of £100

in any one year.

"5. That upon the union taking effect a portion of the endowments or property of the United Benefice, that is to say, a sum of £33336s.8d. Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock (being part of a larger sum of such Stock at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Little Laver) shall be severed or diverted from the United Benefice and shall subject as hereinafter mentioned, be appropriated and held by us as to one moiety of such Stock for the augmentation of the Benefice of Billericay, in the said Diocese of Chelmsford, and as to the other moiety of such Stock for the augmentation of the Benefice of Becontree, Saint Elizabeth, in the said Diocese of Chelmsford. Provided that if at the date of the union taking effect the said charge of £52 per annum shall still be payable as aforesaid then for the period during which such charge shall continue to be payable a portion, namely £52 per annum of the income arising in respect of the said sum of £3333 6s. 8d. Local Loans Stock shall be retained and applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to meet the said charge and during the same period the income payable to the Incumbents of the said two Benefices of Billericay and Becontree, Saint Elizabeth, respectively, under the terms of this Scheme shall be reduced accordingly.

"6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Moreton shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Little Laver shall have the second turn.

"7. That with the consent of the Warden Council and Scholars of Kebel College, in the University of Oxford, as the Patrons of the said Benefice of Shelley (in testimony where-of they have caused their Common or Collegiate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend Julian Sinclair Barrass, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shelley (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Shelley, all that extreme southern portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Moreton comprising 45 acres or thereabouts and including part of Bundish Hall, all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured pink.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 6th day of April, 1858, and published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Mark, Peterborough, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Peterborough':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 7th day of August, 1869, and published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Paul, Peterborough, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Peterborough':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 26th day of September, 1891, and published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of the following month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of All Saints, Peterborough, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Peterborough':

"And whereas the said District of Saint Mary, Boongate, the said District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Peterborough, the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Peterborough, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Peterborough, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

- (b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than four feet six inches below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave, and to the approval of the Medical Officer of Health for the City of Birmingham.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION OF BOYS AND GIRLS TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

 Age.—The limits of age are 16 and 17. For any examination the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the 1st March of the year in which the examination is held. A candidate who attained the age of 16 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 17 on that date would not be admitted.

In reckoning age for competition persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Nationality.—Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbring-ing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal ! grandfather of the candidate was a naturalborn British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

5. All candidates take subjects 1 and 2; of the optional subjects 3 to 7 they may offer subjects for which the maximum marks amount to either 600 or 700 or 800. The marks will be adjusted so that candidates whose optional subjects carry a maximum of either 600 or 700 marks will have an equal opportunity of success with candidates whose optional subjects carry a maximum of 800 marks. A candidate whose optional subjects carry a maximum of less than 600 marks will be at a disadvantage.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. The examination may be held undivided or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the examination will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part. Of those whose performance on the first part is best a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks on the whole examination. If the examination is held in two parts, the second part may be held in fewer centres than the first.

7. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

8. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
