WHEREAS by the Charter of Incorporation of the Imperial College of Science and Technology it is provided that six members of the Governing Body of the said College shall be appointed by His Majesty:

And whereas under the provisions of the said Charter the term of office of three of the members appointed by His Majesty, viz.:—the Right Honourable Viscount Buckmaster, G.C.V.O., Colonel Sir Henry George Lyons, D.Sc., F.R.S., and Charles Samuel Garland, Esquire, expires on the 31st day of May instant, and it is expedient that they should be re-appointed for a further term of Office:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Right Honourable Viscount Buckmaster, G.C.V.O., Colonel Sir Henry George Lyons, D.Sc., F.R.S., and Charles Samuel Garland, Esquire, be re-appointed as members of the Governing Body of the Imperial College of Science and Technology for a further term of four years from the 1st day of June next.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Southgate, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that borough, either with or without any adjoining or other place and also of any officer of that authority:

And whereas sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an urban district council is constituted or included in a borough, all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by attaching to or vested in that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of that Act or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the council of such borough:

And whereas the Urban District of Southgate in the Administrative County of Middlesex, comprises the Parish of Southgate, and is an urban district for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council of Southgate are the local authority:

And whereas it is proposed by a charter of incorporation to create the Urban District of Southgate a municipal borough to incorporate its inhabitants and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Urban Districts of Wood Green and Southgate were constituted a parliamentary division and return one member to serve in Parliament:

And whereas by a Scheme made on the 23rd June, 1910, by the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, the Urban District Council of Southgate have power to appoint three Representative Trustees of Sophia Walker's Charity:

And whereas by a Scheme made on the 3rd January, 1933, by the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, the Urban District Council of Southgate have power to appoint four Representative Trustees of the United Charities in the Ancient Parish of Edmonton:

And whereas under a Scheme made on the 9th March, 1909, regulating the Latymer Foundation at Edmonton, the Urban District Council of Southgate are enabled to recommend for appointment two Representative Governors of the said Foundation:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Southgate Scheme, 1933.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

"The appointed day" means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Southgate;

"The Borough" means the Municipal Borough of Southgate;

"The Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;
