MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REFERENCE TO THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of Sub-Section (4) of Section 2 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order-in-Council to require imported goods of certain

classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

- (1) Pipes for smoking tobacco made wholly or mainly of wood;
- (2) Wooden tobacco pipe bowls with drilled stems.

The reference previously made to the Standing Committee in respect of imported briar pipes, stained or unstained, and briar bowls, stained or unstained, is annulled.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

THE TRADE BOARDS (FUSTIAN CUTTING) ORDER, 1933.

The Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that he has made a Special Order dated the 31st May, 1933, applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to the Fustian Cutting trade, that is to say, fustian cutting, whether performed by hand or machine, and all processes or operations incidental or appertaining thereto carried on in an establishment where fustian is cut. A Notice of Intention to make this Order was published in the issue of the London Gazette for 14th April, 1933, together with the terms of the Order. The Order will come into operation on the 9th June, 1933. Copies of the Order can be obtained direct from H.M. RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS IN OXFORD, MAIDENHEAD, NEW WINDSOR, ST. ALBANS, ETON, SLOUGH, AND SUNNINGHILL (INCLUDING THE VILLAGE OF ASCOT).

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, dated 21st April, 1927, the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of Male Workers in Oxford, Maidenhead, New Windsor, St. Albans, Eton, Slough,
