And whereas the Cochin State is a place over which His Majesty extends His protection:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf conferred by the Fugitive Offenders Acts, 1881 and 1915, and otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Cochin State (Fugitive Offenders) Order in Council, 1933.
- 2. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881 (hereinafter in this Order referred to as the said Act), shall apply as if the Cochin State were a British Possession.
- 3. The said Act shall apply to the Cochin State, subject to the following conditions, exceptions and qualifications, namely:—

(a) Part II and sections 20 and 21 of the

said Act shall not apply;

- (b) the said Act shall not be applicable for the purpose of the apprehension and return from Cochin to any other part of India or from any other part of India to Cochin of any fugitive offender accused of having committed an offence in any other part of India or in Cochin as the case may be:
 - (c) notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 thereof, the said Act shall not apply for the purpose of the apprehension and return to or from the Cochin State of a person accused of any offence other than an offence described in the Schedule to this Order; and
 - (d) the "Governor" in relation to the Cochin State, shall mean, in any case in which the fugitive offender is an European British subject, the Agent-to the Governor-

General, Madras States, and in any other case the Diwan of Cochin.

4. This Order shall be published in the Gazette of India and shall thereupon come into operation.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Fleetwood and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the Charter the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that borough, either with or without any adjoining or other place and also of any officer of that authority:

And whereas Sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas Section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an urban district council is constituted or included in a borough, all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by attaching to or vested in that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any Local Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of that Act or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district

shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the council of such borough:

And whereas the Urban District of Fleetwood in the Administrative County of Lancaster comprises the Parish of Fleetwood as constituted by the Fleetwood Improvement and Market Act, 1842, (5 Vict. Ch. XLIX), and as extended by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act, 1882, and is an Urban District for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council of Fleetwood are the local authority:

And whereas it is proposed by a Charter of Incorporation to create the Urban District of Fleetwood a Municipal Borough to incorporate its inhabitants and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts:

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the Borough of Fleetwood—when constituted by Charter—with the Police Force of the County of Lancaster:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Rural Districts of Fylde (except the part of the civil parish of Carleton which is included in the Parliamentary Borough of Blackpool) and Preston and the Urban Districts of Fleetwood, Kirkham, Longridge, Poulton-le-Fylde, Thornton Cleveleys and Walton-le-Dale, were constituted a Parliamentary Division and return one Member to serve in Parliament:

And whereas the District Council on the 25th day of August, 1911, under Section 17 of the Education Act, 1902, made a Scheme for the establishment of an Education Committee for Higher Education in their District and the Scheme was approved by the Board of Education on the 27th day of October, 1911:

And whereas by Article 2 of an Order made the 18th day of January, 1888, by the Local Government Board, the Fleetwood Improvement Commissioners (being the predecessors of the District Council) as the Urban Sanitary Authority forming part of or abutting upon the Port of Fleetwood was permanently constituted the Port Sanitary Authority for so much of the Port of Fleetwood as therein defined:

And whereas under a Scheme dated the 29th day of March, 1912, by the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales the District Council became entitled to appoint two of the Trustees who administer the Thornton Branch of Baines's Poor and Apprenticing Charity in the Ancient Parish of Poulton-le-Fylde:

And whereas under a Scheme of the said Board dated the 23rd day of November, 1915, the District Council became entitled to appoint the Trustees of Elizabeth Goulding's Charity for Poor Widows and Orphans residing in Fleetwood:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Fleetwood Scheme, 1933.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

"The appointed day" means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Fleetwood;

"The Borough" means the Municipal

Borough of Fleetwood;

"The Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

"The District" means the existing Urban

District of Fleetwood;

"The District Council" means the existing

Urban District Council of Fleetwood;

"The Port Sanitary District" means the existing Port Sanitary District of Fleetwood as defined by the hereinbefore recited Order of the 18th day of January, 1888, made by the Local Government Board;

"The Port Sanitary Authority" means

"The Corporation";

"The Municipal Corporations Acts" means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

- "Duties" includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty or for punishing the breach of any duty;
- "Liabilities" includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would but for this Scheme be liable whether accruing before, on, or after the appointed day:
- "Local Authority" means a local authority as defined in Section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;
- "Powers" includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;
- "Property" includes all property, real and personal and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in, to and out of property real and personal, including things in action and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation, whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

Powers, Etc., of Corporation under Public General Acts.

3.—(1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the Council of a borough containing according to the census of 1881, or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) On the appointed day the Port Sanitary District shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the Port Sanitary Authority for the purposes of exercising powers assigned to the Port Sanitary Authority and the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by the said Order of the 18th day of January, 1888.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act,

1925.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or besubject to the liabilities in relation to (a) the appointment of Analysts under the Acts relating to the Sale of Food and Drugs, or (b) the execution of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, or (c) Weights and Measures, but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and be attached to the Administrative County of Lancaster and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the matters mentioned above form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a Borough.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC., OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

- 4.—(1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties including those under any local Act, Provisional Order or Order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.
- (2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council for the benefit of the District shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.
- (3) All the powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council under or by virtue of the Order of the Local Government Board, thated the 18th day of January, 1888, permanently constituting the Fleetwood Improvement Commissioners (the predecessors of the District Council) the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of Fleetwood shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation.

Property and Liabilities of District Council.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council both in respect of the District and of the Port Sanitary District shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities were incurred in the execution of an Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the Council of a Borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of

the Borough.

(3) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the Port Sanitary District shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Port Sanitary District, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the Port Sanitary District shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of the Port Sanitary District.

(4) Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the

Borough.

(5) Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the Port Sanitary District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the Port Sanitary District.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

- 6.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:
 - (a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation;
 - (b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed.
- (2) All borrowed moneys to which this article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.
- (3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this article or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

- 7. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:
 - (a) The unrepealed provisions of-
 - (i) The local Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme and the Confirmation Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Scheme (so far as the last mentioned Acts relate to the Provisional Orders specified in that Schedule), and
 - (ii) Any other local Act, Provisional Order duly confirmed or Order having the force of an Act and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present Session of Parliament),

as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(b) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Provisional Order or in any

Order having the force of an Act—

(i) To the Fleetwood Improvement Commissioners or the Fleetwood Urban District Council or the Port Sanitary Authority of Fleetwood shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and
(ii) To the Local Government District of

Fleetwood or the Urban District of Fleetwood shall be read as a reference to the

Borough.

8. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the District enure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS.

- 9. Such of the provisions of the following Acts or the parts thereof-
 - (a) Baths and Wash-houses Acts, 1846 to 1925;
 - (b) Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890;
 - (c) Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890;
 - (d) Public Libraries Acts, 1892 to 1919;
 - (e) Notification of Births Act, 1907; (f) Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

(g) Public Health Act, 1925;

(h) Health Resorts and Watering Places Act, 1921;

as shall have been adopted for the District immediately before the appointed day shall be in force within the Borough and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

Bye-Laws, Regulations, Orders, etc.

10.-(1) All bye-laws made before the 1st January, 1923, which, under the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health, whether made before or after the passing of that Act, shall cease to be in force within the Borough on the expiry of one year from the appointed day.

(2) Any reference to the Fleetwood Improvement Commissioners or the Fleetwood Urban District Council in:—

(a) any bye-law, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments or scale

of charges; or

(b) any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority; which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference to the Fleetwood Port

Sanitary Authority in:-

(a) any bye-law, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments or scale of charges; or

(b) any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority; which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation as the Port Sanitary Authority.

(4) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (2) of this Article applies to the Local Government District of Fleetwood or the Urban District of Fleetwood shall be read

as a reference to the Borough.

11. Any bye-laws made by the County Council of Lancaster under Section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District shall until the 1st day of January, 1936, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those bye-laws had been made by the Corporation but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the bye-laws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by bye-laws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

- 12.—(1) The hereinbefore recited Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee for Higher Education of the District Council shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect as if references to the Corporation and the Borough were substituted for references to the Urban District Council of Fleetwood and the Urban District of Fleetwood and reference to the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November were substituted for the reference to the annual meeting of the District Council.
- (2) The members of the Education Committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Borough Council under the said Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee and shall hold office until the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November, 1933.

COMPENSATION.

13.—(1) Every officer of the District Council or of the District Council as the Port Sanitary Authority, who having been in their employment immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and for a period of not less than one year before that date, by virtue of this Scheme or in pursuance or in consequence thereof, suffers any direct pecuniary loss by determination of his appointment, or by diminution or loss of fees, salary

or emoluments, shall be entitled to compensation for that loss.

For the purposes of this article any officer whose appointment is determined, or whose salary is reduced by the Corporation within four years after the commencement of this Scheme because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, shall be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(2) The provisions set out in the Eighth Schedule to the Local Government Act, 1929, shall apply to the determination and payment of compensation under this article, subject to the following and any other necessary

modifications:-

(a) Any reference in that Schedule to "the Council" shall be construed as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) Any reference in that Schedule to "the appointed day" shall be construed as a reference to the appointed day as defined in this Scheme.

(3) All fees or remuneration received and retained by an officer in connection with the preparation of the jurors book or the register of electors under the Representation of the People Acts, shall, subject to a reasonable deduction for any expenses incurred by the officer, be regarded as part of the emoluments of the officer for the purposes of compensation.

(4) No officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(5) For the purposes of this article and of the provisions of the Eighth Schedule to the said Act of 1929 as applied by this article the expression "officer" includes a servant.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

- 14.—(1) The accounts of the District Council and of their committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.
- (2) The accounts of the Port Sanitary Authority and of their committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.
- (3) Any sum certified at the audit by the District Auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

- 15.—(1) The District Council shall by the levy of a rate liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.
- (2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day and all other sums then due to the District Council may be recovered by the Corporation.
- 16.—(1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate or shall prejudicially affect or prevent the continuance of any action cause of action or proceeding which immediately before

the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council or any contract, deed, bond, agreement or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by or with the District Council or their predecessors;

Provided that:-

- (a) Any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and
- (b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if instead of that Council (or their predecessors) the Corporation had been a party thereto.
- (2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such a manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.
- 17. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary or affect any power, right, interest or jurisdiction in or over or in connection with any charitable endowment. Provided nevertheless that the power of appointing Trustees conferred on the District Council by the hereinbefore recited Schemes of the 29th day of March, 1912, and the 23rd day of November,

- 1915, shall be transferred to and be henceforth exercisable by the Corporation.
- 18. Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the limits for the supply of gas or electricity by any company, body or local authority under any Act or any Provisonal Order confirmed by Parliament or under any Order made in pursuance of the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 and 1929, or the Electricity Supply Acts, 1882 to 1928, nor shall the existing powers or charges of any such company, body or local authority under any Act or Order be prejudiced or affected thereby.
- 19. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.
- 20. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all assessments, orders, apportionments, notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made entered into or done before the appointed day by or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, done, entered into or done by or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council and may be proceeded on, or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.
