A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS in pursuance of Section 1 of the Russian Goods (Import Prohibition) Act, 1933, We proclaimed and declared by a Proclamation given on the nineteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, that the importation into the United Kingdom of goods of the classes or descriptions therein specified, grown, produced or manufactured in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, was prohibited:

And whereas, in virtue of the said Section, it is lawful for Us by Proclamation to revoke or vary any Proclamation previously made, in pursuance of that Section:

And whereas We have deemed it expedient that the said Proclamation, given on the nineteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in virtue and exercise of the powers aforesaid, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation proclaiming and declaring, and it is hereby proclaimed and declared, that the said Proclamation of the nineteenth day of April,

one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, is hereby revoked.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace* this first day of *July* in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and in the twenty-fourth year of Our Reign.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Dartford, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the Charter the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties,

property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that borough, either with or without any adjoining or other place and also of any officer of that authority:

And whereas sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an urban district council is constituted or included in a borough, all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by attaching to or vested in that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of that Act or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the council of such borough:

And whereas the Urban District of Dartford in the Administrative County of Kent, comprises the Parish of Dartford, and is an urban district for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council of Dartford are the local authority:

And whereas it is proposed by a Charter of Incorporation to create the Urban District of Dartford a municipal borough to incorporate its inhabitants and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts:

And whereas by a Resolution passed at a Meeting of the Urban District Council of Dartford held on the 1st day of February, 1895, the powers, property, duties and liabilities of the Dartford Burial Board were, as from the 25th day of March, 1895, transferred to the said Council in pursuance of section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1894:

And whereas under a Scheme made the 12th May, 1899, by the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, the District Council became entitled to appoint four representative Trustees of the Foundations of Mary Pettet and John Randall, in the Parish of Dartford, in the County of Kent:

And whereas under a Scheme made the 20th April, 1920, by the Board of Education, the District Council became entitled to appoint two representative Governors of the Dartford Grammar School:

And whereas by an Order of the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, dated the 16th day of October, 1923, in the matter of the Charity called the Dartford Almshouse Charity in the Parish of Dartford, regulated by a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners of the 11th day of March, 1910, the Urban District Council of Dartford were empowered to appoint four representative Trustees of the said Charity:

And whereas by a Conveyance (duly enrolled in the books of the Charity Commissioners) dated the 28th day of September, 1903, made between Charles Newman Kidd of the one part and the Urban District Council of Dartford of the other part a plot of land which has since been laid out and is now known as the Central

Park Recreation Ground was conveyed to the said Council to be appropriated and used in perpetuity as a public recreation ground and for no other purpose whatsoever subject nevertheless as therein mentioned:

And whereas by two several Conveyances (duly enrolled in the books of the Charity Commissioners) dated the 30th day of March, 1904, and 20th day of January, 1909, respectively made between Everard Hesketh of the one part and the Urban District Council of Dartford of the other part two several plots of land which have been laid out and are now known as the Hesketh Park and Sports Ground were conveyed to the said Council for the purpose of a public recreation ground for the inhabitants of Dartford and not for any other purpose:

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the Borough of Dartford—when constituted by Charter—with the Police Force of the County of Kent:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Dartford Scheme, 1933.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

“The appointed day” means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Dartford;

“The Borough” means the Municipal Borough of Dartford;

“The Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

“The District” means the existing Urban District of Dartford;

“The District Council” means the existing Urban District Council of Dartford;

“The Municipal Corporations Acts” means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

“Duties” includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty or for punishing the breach of any duty;

“Liabilities” includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would but for this Scheme be liable whether accruing before, on, or after the appointed day;

“Local Authority” means a local authority as defined in section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

“Powers” includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;

"Property" includes all property, real and personal and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in, to and out of property real and personal, including things in action and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS, ETC., OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3.—(1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this Article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the council of a borough containing according to the census of 1881 or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the council of a borough in relation to the appointment of a Watch Committee, a Police Force of Special Constables, or the levy of a Watch Rate under Part IX of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Administrative County of Kent.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article the Corporation shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities in relation to (a) the appointment of Analysts under the Acts relating to the Sale of Food and Drugs, or (b) the execution of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, or (c) Weights and Measures, but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and be attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of Kent and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the matters mentioned above form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a borough.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC., OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4.—(1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties including those under any local Act, Provisional Order or Order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council for the benefit of the District shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities were incurred in the execution of an Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the council of a borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to the Corporation in respect of the Borough.

(3) Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the Urban District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

6.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the council of a borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed;

(c) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as a Burial Board as immediately before the appointed day are owing shall by virtue of this Scheme be charged upon the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this Article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this Article or the powers of

any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

7. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme

(a) The unrepealed provisions of:—

(i) The local Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme and the Confirmation Act mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Scheme (so far as the last mentioned Act relates to the Provisional Order specified in that Schedule);

(ii) The Orders specified in the Third Schedule to this Scheme; and

(iii) Any other local Act or Provisional Order duly confirmed or Order having the force of an Act and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present Session of Parliament);

as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(b) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act, Provisional Order or in any Order having the force of an Act:—

(i) To the Dartford Local Board or the Dartford Urban District Council shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and

(ii) To the Local Government District of Dartford or the Urban District of Dartford shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

8. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the District enure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS OR ACTS APPLIED BY ORDER.

9. The provisions of the following Acts or the parts thereof:—

(a) Baths and Wash-houses Acts, 1846-1925;
(b) Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890;

(c) Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890;

(d) The Museums and Gymnasiums Act, 1891 (so far as it relates to Museums);

(e) The Public Libraries Acts, 1892-1919;

(f) Notification of Births Act, 1907;

(g) The Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts, 1899-1923;

(h) The Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

(i) The Public Health Act, 1925—Parts II, III, IV, and V;

(j) The Sunday Entertainments Act, 1932, Section I;

as shall have been adopted for the District immediately before the appointed day shall be in force within and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

BURIAL ACTS, 1852-1906.

10.—(1) All the powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council under or by virtue of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, as apply to a Town Council acting as a burial board shall extend to the Corporation, acting as a burial board, and the expenses of the Corporation in the execution of those Acts shall accordingly be chargeable upon and paid out of the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

BYE-LAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

11.—(1) All bye-laws made before the 1st January, 1923, which under the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health, whether made before or after the passing of that Act, shall cease to be in force within the Borough on the expiry of one year from the appointed day.

(2) Any reference to the Dartford Local Board or the Dartford Urban District Council in:—

(a) any bye-law, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payment or scale of charges; or

(b) any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority; which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (2) of this Article applies to the Local Government District of Dartford or the Urban District of Dartford shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

12. Any bye-laws made by the County Council of the Administrative County of Kent under section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District shall until the 1st day of January, 1935, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those bye-laws had been made by the Corporation, unless the bye-laws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by bye-laws made by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION.

13.—(1) Every officer of the District Council who having been in their employment immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and for a period of not less than one year before that date, by virtue of this Scheme or in pursuance or in consequence thereof, suffers any direct pecuniary loss by determination of his appointment, or by diminution or loss of fees, salary or emoluments, shall be entitled to compensation for that loss.

For the purposes of this Article any officer whose appointment is determined, or whose salary is reduced by the Corporation within

four years after the commencement of this Scheme because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, shall be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(2) The provisions set out in the Eighth Schedule to the Local Government Act, 1929, shall apply to the determination and payment of compensation under this Article subject to the following and any other necessary modifications:—

(a) Any reference in that Schedule to "the Council" shall be construed as a reference to the Corporation, and

(b) Any reference in that Schedule to "the appointed day" shall be construed as a reference to the appointed day as defined in this Scheme.

(3) All fees or remuneration received and retained by an officer in connection with the preparation of the jurors book or the register of electors under the Representation of the People Acts shall, subject to a reasonable deduction for any expenses incurred by the officer, be regarded as part of the emoluments of the officer for the purposes of compensation.

(4) No officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(5) For the purposes of this Article and of the provisions of the Eighth Schedule to the said Act of 1929 as applied by this Article:

The expression "officer" includes a servant.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

14.—(1) The accounts of the District Council and of their committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the District Auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

15.—(1) The District Council shall by the levy of a rate liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day and all other sums then due to the District Council may be recovered by the Corporation.

16.—(1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate or shall prejudicially affect or prevent the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council or any contract, deed, bond, agreement or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by or with the District Council, or their predecessors:

Provided that:—

(a) Any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if instead of that Council (or their predecessors) the Corporation had been a party thereto.

(2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such a manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

17. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary or affect any power, right, interest or jurisdiction in or over or in connection with any charitable endowment:

Provided nevertheless that the power of appointing Trustees or Governors conferred by the hereinbefore recited Schemes of the 12th May, 1899, and 20th April, 1920, on the District Council shall be transferred to and be henceforth exercisable by the Corporation, and that the power of appointing Trustees conferred by the hereinbefore recited Order of the 16th day of October, 1923, and Scheme of the 11th day of March, 1910, on the District Council, shall be transferred to and be henceforth exercisable by the Corporation, and that the hereinbefore recited Conveyances dated the 28th day of September, 1903, the 30th day of March, 1904, and the 20th day of January, 1909, shall have effect as if references therein to the Corporation and Borough were substituted for references to the District Council and the Urban District.

18. Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the limits for the supply of gas or electricity by any company, body or local authority under any Act or any Provisional Order confirmed by Parliament or under any Order made in pursuance of the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 and 1929, or the Electricity Supply Acts, 1882 to 1928, nor shall the existing powers or charges of any such company, body or local authority under any Act or Order be prejudiced or affected thereby.

19. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

20. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all assessments, orders, apportionments, notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the appointed day by, or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, done, entered into or done by or with reference to the Corporation, instead of the District Council and may be proceeded on, or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the Borough of Rowley Regis—when constituted by Charter—with the Police Force of the County of Stafford:

And whereas in pursuance of the Education Act, 1921, the Urban District Council are a local education authority for elementary education, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was approved by the Board of Education on the 25th day of April, 1903, and such Scheme was amended by the District Council on the 22nd day of April, 1907, and the 28th day of July, 1930, the approval of the Board of Education being given thereto on the 6th day of June, 1907, and the 1st day of September, 1930, respectively:

And whereas the Urban District Council of Rowley Regis on the 25th day of April, 1921, under section 74 of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, as amended by the Education Acts, 1876 to 1918, made bye-laws with respect to School attendance which were sanctioned by the Board of Education on the 1st day of July, 1921:

And whereas the Education Committee of the Urban District Council of Rowley Regis, acting by and with the assent of the Urban District Council on the 11th day of May, 1921, made bye-laws for regulating the Employment of Children and Young Persons under the Employment of Children Act, 1903, and the Education Act, 1918, which bye-laws were confirmed by the Secretary of State on the 26th day of October, 1921, and such bye-laws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the School Boards Act, 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Rowley Regis Scheme, 1933.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

“The appointed day” means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Rowley Regis;

“The Borough” means the Municipal Borough of Rowley Regis;

“The Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

“The District” means the existing Urban District of Rowley Regis;

“The District Council” means the existing Urban District Council of Rowley Regis;

“The Municipal Corporations Acts” means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

“Duties” includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the

District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty or for punishing the breach of any duty;

“Liabilities” includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would but for this Scheme be liable whether accruing before, on, or after the appointed day;

“Local Authority” means a local authority as defined in section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

“Powers” includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;

“Property” includes all property, real and personal and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in, to and out of property real and personal, including things in action and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS, ETC., OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3.—(1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the council of a borough containing according to the census of 1881 or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the council of a borough in relation to the appointment of a watch committee, a police force of special constables, or the levy of a watch rate under Part IX of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Administrative County of Stafford.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities in relation to (a) the appointment of Analysts under the Acts relating to the Sale of Food and Drugs, or (b) the execution of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927, or (c) Weights and Measures, but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and be attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of Stafford and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the matters mentioned above form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a borough.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC., OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4.—(1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties including those under any local Act, Provisional Order or Order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council for the benefit of the District shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities were incurred in the execution of an Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the council of a borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of the Borough.

(3) Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the Urban District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

6.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as, immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the council of a borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed;

(c) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as a Burial Authority as immediately before the appointed day are owing shall by virtue of this Scheme be charged upon the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this article or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

7. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(a) The unrepealed provisions of any Local Act, Provisional Order duly confirmed, or Order having the force of an Act, and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such Local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present Session of Parliament), as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(b) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Provisional Order, or in any Order having the force of an Act—

(i) To the Rowley Regis Local Board or the Rowley Regis Urban District Council shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and

(ii) To the Local Government District of Rowley Regis or the Urban District of Rowley Regis shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

Provided nevertheless that any Order made under the Shop Hours Act, 1904, or under the Shops Acts, 1912-1928, and in force immediately before the appointed day in any area affected by this Scheme shall, subject to the provisions of those Acts, remain in force and apply to the area to which it then applied.

8. The Provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the District enure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council, or their predecessors, as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS OR ACTS APPLIED BY ORDER.

9. Such of the provisions of the following Acts or the parts thereof:—

(a) The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890;

(b) The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890;

- (c) The Public Libraries Acts, 1892 to 1919;
- (d) The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907;
- (e) The Public Health Act, 1925;

as shall have been adopted for the district immediately before the appointed day shall be in force and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

BURIAL ACTS, 1852 TO 1906.

10.—(1) All the powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council under or by virtue of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, as apply to a town council acting as a burial authority shall extend to the Corporation acting as a burial authority and the expenses of the Corporation in the execution of those Acts shall accordingly be chargeable upon and paid out of the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

BYE-LAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

11.—(1) All bye-laws made before the 1st January, 1923, which under the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health, whether made before or after the passing of that Act, shall cease to be in force within the Borough on the expiry of one year from the appointed day.

(2) Any reference to the Rowley Regis Local Board or the Rowley Regis Urban District Council in:—

(a) Any bye-law, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments or scale of charges; or

(b) Any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority; which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference to any document to which paragraph (2) of this article applies to the Local Government District of Rowley Regis or the Urban District of Rowley Regis shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

12. Any bye-laws made by the County Council of Stafford under section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District shall until the 1st day of January, 1935, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those bye-laws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the bye-laws shall have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by bye-laws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

13.—(1) The hereinbefore recited Scheme (as amended and sanctioned) for the constitution of the Education Committee of the District Council shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect as if references to the Corporation and the Borough, were substituted for references to the Rowley Regis Urban District Council and the Urban District of Rowley Regis and reference to the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November were

substituted for the reference to the annual meeting of the District Council.

(2) The members of the Education Committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Borough Council under the said Scheme (as amended) for the constitution of the Education Committee and shall hold office until the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November, 1933.

14. The said recited School Attendance bye-laws and bye-laws for regulating the Employment of Children and Young Persons made under the Education Acts in force in the Urban District at the commencement of this Scheme shall apply to the Borough until revoked or altered by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

15.—(1) Every Officer of the District Council who having been in their employment immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and for a period of not less than one year before that date by virtue of this Scheme or in pursuance or in consequence thereof, suffers any direct pecuniary loss by determination of his appointment, or by diminution or loss of fees, salary or emoluments, shall be entitled to compensation for that loss.

For the purpose of this clause any Officer whose appointment is determined, or whose salary is reduced by the Corporation within four years after the commencement of this Scheme because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, shall be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(2) The provisions set out in the Eighth Schedule to the Local Government Act, 1929, shall apply to the determination and payment of compensation under this clause, subject to the following, and any other necessary modifications:—

(a) Any reference in that Schedule to "the Council" shall be construed as a reference to the Corporation, and

(b) Any reference in that Schedule to "the appointed day" shall be construed as a reference to the appointed day as defined in this Scheme.

(3) All fees or remuneration received and retained by an officer in connection with the preparation of the jurors book or the register of electors under the Representation of the People Acts shall, subject to a reasonable deduction for any expenses incurred by the officer, be regarded as part of the emoluments of the officer for the purposes of compensation.

(4) No officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(5) For the purposes of this Article and of the provisions of the Eighth Schedule to the said Act of 1929 as applied by this Article:—

(i) The expression "officer" includes a servant, and

(ii) A teacher employed in a public elementary school maintained but not provided by the District Council or the Corporation shall be deemed to be an officer employed by

the District Council or Corporation, and if his services are dispensed with by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation, he shall be deemed to be an officer whose services are dispensed with by the Corporation.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

16.—(1) The accounts of the District Council and of their Committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the District Auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

17.—(1) The District Council shall by the levy of a rate liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day and all other sums then due to the District Council may be recovered by the Corporation.

18.—(1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate or shall prejudicially affect or prevent the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council or any contract, deed, bond, agreement, or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council, or their predecessors:

Provided that:—

(a) any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) all Contracts, deed, bonds, agreements, and other instruments subsisting immediately before the appointed day entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if instead of that Council (or their predecessors) the Corporation had been a party thereto.

2. All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such a manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

19. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary or affect any power, right, interest or jurisdiction in or over or in connexion with any charitable endowment.

Provided nevertheless that the power of appointing Governors conferred by the hereinbefore recited Scheme of the 15th day of December, 1922, on the District Council, shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the Corporation.

20. Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the limits for the supply of gas or electricity or water by any company, body or local authority under any Act or any Provisional Order confirmed by Parliament or under any Order made in pursuance of the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 and 1929, or the Electricity Supply

Acts, 1882 to 1928, or the Water Works Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863, nor shall the existing powers or charges of any such company, body or local authority under any Act or Order be prejudiced or affected thereby.

21. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

22. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all assessments, orders, apportionments, notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the appointed day by, or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation, as if the same had been made, done, entered into or done by, or with reference to the Corporation, instead of the District Council and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

In paragraph 2, line 1, after the words "sum expended" insert "from Corporate Revenues."

Add a new clause:—

8. An Open Scholarship in Classics, known as the Edward Marjoribanks Scholarship, shall be offered from time to time at the discretion of the Governing Body as the funds of the Trust permit, out of the income of a benefaction by the late Edward Marjoribanks, M.A., M.P., formerly Open Scholar of the House. In awarding the Scholarship preference will be given *ceteris paribus* to persons educated at Eton College. The number of Edward Marjoribanks Scholars may be increased at

the discretion of the Governing Body, if there shall be sufficient funds for the purpose.

The emoluments of the Scholarship shall not exceed £200 a year; but in other respects than in his emoluments the Scholar elected shall be subject to the conditions laid down in the preceding clauses of this Statute.
