A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS in pursuance of Section 1 of the Russian Goods (Import Prohibition)
Act, 1933, We proclaimed and declared by a Proclamation given on the nineteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, that the importation into the United Kingdom of goods of the classes or descriptions therein specified, grown, produced or manufactured in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, was prohibited:

And whereas, in virtue of the said Section, it is lawful for Us by Proclamation to revoke or vary any Proclamation previously made, in pursuance of that Section:

And whereas We have deemed it expedient that the said Proclamation, given on the nineteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in virtue and exercise of the powers aforesaid, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation proclaiming and declaring, and it is hereby proclaimed and declared, that the said Proclamation of the nineteenth day of April,

one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, is hereby revoked.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, and in the twenty-fourth year of Our Reign.
