The emoluments of the Scholarship shall not exceed £200 a year; but in other respects than in his emoluments the Scholar elected shall be subject to the conditions laid down in the preceding clauses of this Statute.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

Greeting!

Whereas We did by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual bearing date the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, appoint Commissioners (known as the Royal Commission on Historical Monuments—England) to make an inventory of the ancient and historical monuments and constructions connected with or illustrative of the contemporary culture, civilization and conditions of life of the people in England, excluding Monmouthshire, from the earliest times to the year 1714, and to specify those which seem most worthy of preservation:

And whereas We have deemed it expedient that Our Lieutenants of Counties in England should be appointed *ex-officio* Members of the said Commission for the purposes of that part of the Commission's inquiry which relates to ancient and historical monuments and constructions within their respective counties:

Now know ye that We do by these Presents authorise and appoint Our Lieutenant for the time being of each and every County in England, other than Our County of Monmouth, to be a Member of the said Commission for the purposes of that part of the Commission's inquiry which relates to ancient and historical monuments and constructions within the area of his jurisdiction as Our Lieutenant of such County.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's* the *Twenty-ninth* day of *June*, 1933, in the *Twenty-fourth* Year of Our Reign.
