THE MERCHANDISE MARKS (IMPORTED GOODS) EXEMPTION DIRECTION (No. 2), 1933.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3, sub-section (2) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, they have given a Direction in the following terms:—

Whereas it is provided by Article I of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 5 Order, 1929(a) that it shall not be lawful to import into the United Kingdom any glassware to which Part I of that Order applies, or to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom any such glassware which has been imported unless it bears an indication of origin:

And whereas it is provided by Article 2 of the said Order that Part I thereof shall apply *inter alia* to glassware of the descriptions specified in the Schedule thereto whether imported separately or as part of any other article:

And whereas thermometers are included in the descriptions of glassware specified in the Schedule to the said Order:

And whereas it is provided *inter alia* by Article 4 of the said Order that the indication of origin shall be applied to each article other than tubing and rod by acid-stamping or etching, sand-blasting, engraving, or burnt-on enamel:

And whereas the Board of Trade, being the appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 4 of the said Order to mounted thermometers is likely to cause hardship to the said persons:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3 hereby direct as follows:—

1. It shall be a sufficient compliance with the provisions of Article 4 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 5 Order 1929, if in the case of any mounted thermometer the indication of origin is stamped, printed, impressed, stencilled or branded in a contrasting colour on the front of the scale or mount.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 2), 1933.
