HUDDERSFIELD CORPORATION.

(TRAMWAY ABANDONMENT.)

ORDER BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

WHEREAS by Section 7 of the Huddersfield Corporation (Tramway and Trolley Vehicles) Scheme, 1932 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme of 1932") confirmed by the Public Works Facilities Scheme (Huddersfield Corporation) Confirmation Act, 1932, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Huddersfield (therein and hereinafter refered to as "the Corporation") were authorised to use trolley vehicles on certain routes in the borough.

And whereas it is enacted in Section 17 of the Scheme of 1932 (inter alia) as follows:—

"(2) (a) The Minister of Transport may at any time by order authorise or require the Corporation to abandon or discontinue temporarily or permanently any of the tramways of the Corporation along the route of which the Corporation are authorised to provide and equip trolley vehicles under the provisions of this Scheme.

(c) Any order made under the provisions of this subsection may as from such date as may be specified therein provide for the cesser of all or any of the powers, liabilities, duties or obligations conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to any tramway to be abandoned or discontinued in pursuance of such order and for the portion of the road upon which the tramway is situate to be left in good repair and condition."

And whereas by the said Section 7 of the Scheme of 1932 the Corporation are authorised to use trolley vehicles along the route of the tramway authorised by the Act hereinafter referred to, that is to say:—

Tramway No. 11 in Somerset Road and Northgate (Almondbury) authorised by the Huddersfield Improvement Act, 1880.

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Minister of Transport (hereinafter refererd to as "the Minister") for an order to authorise the permanent discontinuance and abandonment by them of the tramway hereinbefore mentioned.

Now therefore the Minister in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 17 of the Scheme of 1932, and of

any and every other power thereunto him enabling hereby orders as follows:—

- (1) The Corporation may and shall forthwith abandon and discontinue the tramway hereinbefore mentioned and shall leave the portion of the road upon which the said tramway is situate in good repair and condition.
- (2) As from the date of this order the powers and obligations of the Corporation to run services of cars on the said tramway shall cease and as from the date on which the removal of the rails of the said tramway and the restoration of the road upon which the same is laid shall be duly completed all other powers, liabilities, duties or obligations conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to the said tramway shall cease.

(3) This order may be cited as "The Huddersfield Corporation (Tramway Abandonment) Order, 1933".
