Warsaw, May 20. N. S.

**M**R. Stepany, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of Great-Britain, arrived here last Friday, and on the 19th had Audience of the King of Poland. The Meeting at Lowitz has at last had the desired effect, and on the 16th Instant the Treaty of Accommodation was signed on one side by Prince Radzeville, and the Bishop of Posen, the King's Commissioners, and on the other by the Primate, the Marechal of the Rokortz, and the Deputies of the Palatinates, as likewise by the Nuncio on behalf of the Pope, as Guarand of the Treaty: After which the Marechal of the Rokortz broke his Staff in the usual manner, and dissolved the Assembly; Then they all went to the Cathedral Church of Lowitz, where the Primate Sung *Te Deum*, while a treble discharge was made of the Cannon from the Castle, and after Mass gave a Splendid Entertainment to the Commissioners, the Nuncio, and the Chief of the Rokortz. The Conditions of this Agreement are not yet made publick, but the Primate and the Principal Gentlemen of his Party are to come hither, and make their Submission to the King on the 22th of this Month. The King having thus finished this great Affair, will be now at leisure to pursue his Designs against the Turks, to which end he has renewed his Orders for hastening the Preparations for the Campaign; and the Siege of Caminieck is now talk'd of, as a thing fully resolv'd on. In the mean while the Chiefest of the Nobility repair hither, to Congratulate the King upon this happy re-establishment of the Peace and Tranquility of the Kingdom. The Sieur Coll, Great Chamberlain to his Electoral Highness of Brandenburg, came lately hither to Compliment his Majesty from the Elector his Master, and to concert an Enterview between them, which it is believed will be either at *Ortlesberg* or *Jounsburg*, both which Places are in the Electors Dominions in Prussia, and he is since returned to *Coningsberg*, whither he will be followed in a few days by the Baron of *Ryswitz*, who is appointed the King of Poland's Envoy Extraordinary to that Court. Major General *Jordan*, who goes with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from Poland to his Most Christian Majesty, has Orders to take the Court of Hanover in his way to France, and to pay the Compliments of Condoleance to the Elector of Hanover, upon the Death of the late Elector his Father.

Our Advices from *Lithuania* say, the Sieur *Oginsky* had sent out Circular Letters to all the Nobility of that Dutchy, inviting them to meet together to consider of the Means to preserve their

Rights and Liberties, which were much endangered by the encreasing Power of the Family of *Sapieha*: That accordingly several of them assembled at *Minsk*, where some Proposals being made them from the King of Poland, in order to an Accommodation of the Differences between the two Contending Factions, they dispatched 3 Deputies to Court to represent their Resolutions upon the same; But the said Deputies were in their Journey assaulted by a Party of Prince *Sapieha's* Men, who took away their Instructions and Dispatches. This Violence is very much resented, as well by the King as by the Lithuanian Nobility, and it has broke up a Negotiation, which was in a fair way to put an end to the Troubles that have of late given so much Disturbance to that Dutchy.

*Vienna*, May 21. Their Imperial Majesties continue at *Laxemburg*, but it is believed their stay there will not be so long as usual, by reason of the unseasonableness of the Weather. The Count *de Goes* began last Saturday his Journey to the *Hague*, where he is to reside with the Character of Envoy from the Emperor. Orders have been given to the Imperial Officers to repair to their respective Commands, and to get their Regiments compleat with all possible diligence, so as they may be in a readiness to march by the first of June to the Rendezvous that shall be assigned them. The 6 new Galleys that were lately launched on the *Danube*, are now almost finished, and will very soon fall down to *Peter-Waradin*, to join the rest of the Fleet designed to serve this Summer against the Turks. Some Deputies came hither lately from the Province of *Zwenberg* in *Transylvania* to solicit this Court for an abatement of the Subsidies demanded of them, but it was not thought fit to comply with their Desires. Our Letters from *Peter-Waradin* say, a Bassa is lately arrived from the Port to command at *Sabacz*, and that the Seraskier of *Bosnia*, and the Forces under his Command, continue still in their former Posts, and that several Country People were summoned in to work on the Lines along the *Save*, which the Turks are raising with all possible diligence. These Advices add, that some Saicks full of Soldiers were again sent from *Belgrade* towards *Tiral*, but returned without attempting any thing. We have Advice from *Turkey*, that the Grand Signior did not intend to go from *Adrianople* till towards the end of June, to command his Army, which is to Rendezvous at *Sophia*.

*Francfort*, May 28. The Germans go on with the Demolishing of *Eberembourg*, and all things are ready in order to the Restitution of *Rhinfeldt* to the Landgrave of *Rhinfeldt*: Of which the Elector of *Mentz* having sent notice to the Sieur *Desbordes*, who commands at *Philipsburg*, and withall desiring to know if he has any Orders for the Restitution of that Place, he received an Answer That the Orders for evacuating the same were

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come long ago, but no day being fixed, he expected farther Instructions in that matter. We hear the French are all retired out of the Country of *Gemensheim*, which belongs to the Elector *Palatine*, except some Troops who remain as yet at *Haguenaw*.

*Brussels, June 1.* The Count *de Tirimont*, late Ambassador from *Spain* at the Treaty of *Ryswick*, who is appointed Commissioner from his Catholick Majesty for Regulating the Limits between the Territories of *Spain* and *France* in the *Netherlands*, having now received his Instructions for that purpose from the Council of State, went hence yesterday for *Lisse*, to Confer with the French Commissioners. We hear the French had promised to deliver up *Dinant* as yesterday, and that an Officer, and a Detachment of the Troops of *Liege*, lay in a readiness to take possession of the same.

*Hague, June 3.* The Baron of *Bosch*, Minister of the King of *Poland*, went hence this morning for the *Brill* to embark for *England*. Monsieur *Hop* returned this day to *Amsterdam*, but is to come back in a day or two in order to receive his Dispatches from the States-General to the Imperial Court, to which he is appointed their Envoy Extraordinary, and he will begin his Journey thither in a few days, most of his Servants being sent before. The *Sieur Hessels* is on his return from *Cleves*, having conducted thither the *Czar* and his Ambassadors by the Appointment of the States-General.

*Paris, June 4.* N. S. My Lord *Portland* continues to take his Leave at this Court, and intends to set out in 10 or 12 days on his return to *England*. The Most Christian King having caused several Regiments of Horse, Foot, and Dragoons, to be Disbanded, is likewise making a Reform among the Commissaries of War, of whom 25 are lately discharged. The Duke of *Orleans* has named the *Sieur La Carte*, one of the Captains of his Guards, to go and Compliment the Duke of *Lorraine* on his Arrival in that Dutchy. Prince *Gaston*, Second Son to the Great Duke of *Tuscany*, took his Leave of the King last Sunday at *Versailles*, and intends shortly to go for *Flanders*, whence it is said he will proceed for *England*. The *Sieur Du Heron*, appointed to go as Envoy to the Courts of *Bruswick*, and the *Sieur d'Abbeville*, who is ordered to that of *Mentz* with the like Character, intend in a few days to repair to their respective Stations.

*Falmouth, May 23.* Last Saturday came in here 6 or 7 small French Vessels from *St. Malo* and *Morlaix*, being bound with Wine, Brandy, and Salt for *Ireland*.

*Plymouth, May 24.* Yesterday sailed hence the Experiment of and for *London*, *Henry Glimm* Master, from the *Barbadoes*; as also the *Adventure of Poole*, *William Middleton* Master, from *St. Jago de Ferras*.

*Lewmouth, May 25.* This morning a considerable Fleet of Laden Colliers sailed out of our Road.

*Deale, May 26.* Yesterday sailed hence about 20 Sail of outward-bound Merchant Ships and Coasters.

*Whitehall, May 28.* By Letters from Capt. *Cranby*, Commander of His Majesties Ship the *Poole*, dated at *St. Mary's Island* the 8th of *May*, we have an account, that in the Latitude of 35 degr. 35 min. 130 Leagues W. N. W. from the

*Maderas*, he fell in with part of the Spanish Fleet bound home from the *West-Indies*, being 6 Sail, who reported, that on the first of *May* they were separated from 8 Sail more belonging to their Fleet, and that in the Gulph of *Florida* one of their Ships sunk down, which had on board about 600000 Dollars; but all the Men were saved. The Commander of the *Poole* supplied them with some Provisions, which they wanted, and so left them pursuing their Voyage.
