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Warsaw, May 20. N. S.

**M**R. Stepany, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of Great-Britain, arrived here last Friday, and on the 19th had Audience of the King of Poland. The Meeting at Lowitz has at last had the desired effect, and on the 16th Instant the Treaty of Accommodation was signed on one side by Prince Radzeville, and the Bishop of Posen, the King's Commissioners, and on the other by the Primate, the Marechal of the Rokortz, and the Deputies of the Palatinates, as likewise by the Nuncio on behalf of the Pope, as Guarand of the Treaty: After which the Marechal of the Rokortz broke his Staff in the usual manner, and dissolved the Assembly; Then they all went to the Cathedral Church of Lowitz, where the Primate Sung *Te Deum*, while a treble discharge was made of the Cannon from the Castle, and after Mass gave a Splendid Entertainment to the Commissioners, the Nuncio, and the Chief of the Rokortz. The Conditions of this Agreement are not yet made publick, but the Primate and the Principal Gentlemen of his Party are to come hither, and make their Submission to the King on the 22th of this Month. The King having thus finished this great Affair, will be now at leisure to pursue his Designs against the Turks, to which end he has renewed his Orders for hastening the Preparations for the Campaign; and the Siege of Caminieck is now talk'd of, as a thing fully resolved on. In the mean while the Chiefest of the Nobility repair hither, to Congratulate the King upon this happy re-establishment of the Peace and Tranquility of the Kingdom. The Sieur Coll, Great Chamberlain to his Electoral Highness of Brandenburg, came lately hither to Compliment his Majesty from the Elector his Master, and to concert an Interview between them, which it is believed will be either at Orlesberg or Jounsburg, both which Places are in the Electors Dominions in Prussia, and he is since returned to Coningsberg, whither he will be followed in a few days by the Baron of Ryswitz, who is appointed the King of Poland's Envoy Extraordinary to that Court. Major General Jordan, who goes with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary from Poland to his Most Christian Majesty, has Orders to take the Court of Hanouer in his way to France, and to pay the Compliments of Condoleance to the Elector of Hanouer, upon the Death of the late Elector his Father.

Our Advices from Lithuania say, the Sieur Oginsky had sent out Circular Letters to all the Nobility of that Dutchy, inviting them to meet together to consider of the Means to preserve their

Rights and Liberties, which were much endangered by the encreasing Power of the Family of Sapieha: That accordingly several of them assembled at Minsk, where some Proposals being made them from the King of Poland, in order to an Accommodation of the Differences between the two Contending Factions, they dispatched 3 Deputies to Court to represent their Resolutions upon the same; But the said Deputies were in their Journey assaulted by a Party of Prince Sapieha's Men, who took away their Instructions and Dispatches. This Violence is very much resented, as well by the King as by the Lithuanian Nobility, and it has broke up a Negotiation, which was in a fair way to put an end to the Troubles that have of late given so much Disturbance to that Dutchy.

*Vienna, May 21.* Their Imperial Majesties continue at Luxembourg, but it is believed their stay there will not be so long as usual, by reason of the unseasonableness of the Weather. The Count de Goes began last Saturday his Journey to the Hague, where he is to reside with the Character of Envoy from the Emperor. Orders have been given to the Imperial Officers to repair to their respective Commands, and to get their Regiments compleat with all possible diligence, so as they may be in a readiness to march by the first of June to the Rendezvous that shall be assigned them. The 6 new Galleys that were lately launched on the Danube, are now almost finished, and will very soon fall down to Peter-Waradin, to join the rest of the Fleet designed to serve this Summer against the Turks. Some Deputies came hither lately from the Province of Zwenberg in Transylvania to solicit this Court for an abatement of the Subsidies demanded of them, but it was not thought fit to comply with their Desires. Our Letters from Peter-Waradin say, a Bassa is lately arrived from the Port to command at Sabacz, and that the Seraskier of Bosnia, and the Forces under his Command, continue still in their former Posts, and that several Country People were summoned in to work on the Lines along the Save, which the Turks are raising with all possible diligence. These Advices add, that some Saicks full of Soldiers were again sent from Belgrade towards Tiral, but returned without attempting any thing. We have Advice from Turkey, that the Grand Signior did not intend to go from Adrianople till towards the end of June, to command his Army, which is to Rendezvous at Sophia.

*Francfort, May 28.* The Germans go on with the Demolishing of Eberembourg, and all things are ready in order to the Restitution of Rhinsfeldt to the Landtgrave of Rhinsfeldt: Of which the Elector of Mentz having sent notice to the Sieur Desbordes, who commands at Philipsborg, and withall desiring to know if he has any Orders for the Restitution of that Place, he received an Answer That the Orders for evacuating the same were

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
