The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of Eagland not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the

House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF PRO-BATIONER MAPPING ASSISTANTS IN H.M. LAND REGISTRY.

- 1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners. When a vacancy occurs, the Commissioners will cause notice to be given by an advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications. Applications will not be accepted or recorded until a vacancy is announced to be filled.
- 2. Candidates must have attained the age of 162 and must not have attained the age of 18 on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbring-ing with His Majesty's dominions, that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible pro-vided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a naturalborn British subject, and (b) neither the father

nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

- 4. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 5. Candidates must have obtained a School Certificate, preferably with a credit in Mathematics.
- 6. Those candidates who from their application forms appear to the Civil Service Commissioners to be best fitted for the post will be submitted to an examination in Drawing to test their skill in plan drawing and lettering and will also be admitted to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for appointment such candidates as they consider most suitable, having regard to the number of vacancies to be filled, from among those who qualify in the examination in Drawing. The Selection Board will be nominated by the Civil Service Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department who will be represented on the Selection Board. The decision of the Selection Board will be final.

Candidates admitted to the examination in Drawing will be required to pay a fee of 8s.

- 7. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.
- 8. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed on probation for a period of not less than three months, subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.
- 9. The Chief Land Registrar will require to be satisfied from periodical reports or by examination by the Head of the Mapping Branch that persons appointed as Probationers possess the necessary qualifications for appointment to the grade of Mapping Assistant. A

Probationer who proves to be unsatisfactory or shows no promise of acquiring the necessary qualifications during the three months probationary period will not be retained in the Service. All appointments are subject to the general conditions of service applicable to Crown servants, but normally one month's notice will be given or required on the termination of service or on resignation.

10. Subject to satisfactory reports and on reaching the age of 19 Probationers will be appointed to the grade of Mapping Assistant (unestablished); and on attaining the age of 20, Mapping Assistants (unestablished) will be eligible for consideration for appointment to the established staff, subject to the occurrence of vacancies. Appointment to the established staff is conditional on the issue of a certificate of qualification by the Civil Service Commissioners; in the event of the Commissioners declining to issue a certificate of qualification, the candidate will not be retained in the Service.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1933.

The Minister of Health hereby gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he will recognise from the date of operation of the Amendment Regulations each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedules hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition is subject to the conditions set out in the headings to the Schedules. Where the Certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely

affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the meat or the container, as the case may be.

Except as stated below, this Notice\supersedes all previous Notices published in the London Gazette relating to the recognition of Official Certificates for the purposes of the principal Regulations.


FIRST SCHEDULE.


