The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the Freemasons' Hospital at Ravenscourt Park, Hammersmith, on the 12th July, 1933.

PRESIDENT OF THE FREEMASONS' HOSPITAL (FIELD-MARSHAL H.R.H. THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT AND STRATHEARN, K.G.).

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY,

On behalf of English Freemasons under the United Grand Lodge of England, scattered 65-33961 over all the world, and of many thousands of our subscribers, I, as President of this Hospital tender to Your Majesty, who has taken so much interest in our benevolent activities, loyal and grateful thanks for honouring us with your presence with that of Her Majesty The Queen, on this, which is to us, a very memorable occasion.

Of the tenets of our Order, none stands out more clearly than the duty to relieve the distressed and suffering, and no pains have been spared to make this Hospital complete in every particular.

We all know the great interest in Hospital work that is ever shown by Your Majesties. The late King Edward, who for so many years presided over our Order, by founding the King Edward Hospital Fund largely helped to preserve the efficiency of our Voluntary Hospitals and we feel sure that in this latest Building Your Majesty will find how that great voluntary effort has progressed.

This Hospital takes the place of a smaller one found to be quite inadequate to the calls upon its services, and we desire to be able more fully to meet the needs of the Brethren of moderate means, their wives and children, who become the victims of sickness.

Your Majesty has no more loyal subjects than the Members of our Order, and we thank Your Majesty and Her Majesty The Queen for the sympathetic interest you have shown in our undertaking. It will ever be a great encouragement to us in our work and, as President, I

invite your Majesty graciously to declare the Building open.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following Gracious Answer:—

I thank Your Royal Highness very sincerely for the Address which you, as the Head of English Freemasons, have presented, and I am deeply moved by these further proofs of Masonic loyalty and affection towards my Throne and Person. It gives both the Queen and myself great pleasure to come here to-day and thus show our continued interest in the Craft of which many of my Family are members,

To give rather than to receive has always been one of the first tenets of this Order. It was not surprising therefore that the idea of a Freemasons' Hospital, to be maintained by its members, met with such an enthusiastic response when initiated more than twenty years ago. The completion of the scheme was delayed by the War, during which, however, the Hospitals established by Freemasons did excellent work, and I well remember a visit paid by the Queen and myself to the Institution in Fulham Road, the immediate predecessor of this great building.

Throughout his life by dear Father gave the warmest support to all measures directed towards the relief of suffering and distress, and I appreciate your reference to his work in connection with King Edward's Hospital Fund, in which I also take the keenest interest.

Your object in establishing this Hospital has been to provide accommodation, equipped with every medical, surgical and nursing device of modern science, for both men and women who, when victims of sickness, wish to pay according to their means. This fine building, so admirably situated and planned to give patients the benefits of sunshine and fresh air, is a worthy realisation of your hopes and cannot fail to bring comfort and help to Freemasons and their families.

With great pleasure do I accede to your request that this Hospital shall in future be called The Royal Masonic Hospital. I now declare it open and pray that, with God's Blessing, within its walls may be found relief from suffering and restoration to health.
