“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 11th day of August, 1854, and the 30th day of June, 1860, we are empowered to make advances on account of pay to the ratings of Your Majesty's Fleet proceeding on foreign Service:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 19th day of May, 1931, to authorize us to grant advances of pay to ratings on their discharge from Your Majesty's ships of the New

Zealand Division of the Royal Navy for passage to England in a vessel other than a ship of war subject to the conditions that they are entitled to full pay on passage and that the amount of the advance should not exceed one month's pay:

“And whereas we consider it expedient that all ratings returning to England from Stations Abroad, otherwise than by ship of war, should receive advances of pay not exceeding the amount due for half the period of passage, assessed with due regard to the deductions normally chargeable thereon, and subject to the condition that they are entitled to full pay on passage:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to grant advances of pay to ratings accordingly, and to sanction that the Order in Council of the 19th May, 1931, be abrogated.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas Rear-Admiral L. R. Oliphant, formerly Superintendent of the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, retired from the service of Greenwich Hospital on the 31st March, 1933:

"And whereas the appointment of Superintendent of the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, does not confer any claim to a pension or gratuity:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Rear Admiral Oliphant of a gratuity of five hundred pounds (£500) in recognition of his meritorious service as Superintendent of the Royal Hospital School."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment)

Order, 1931, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1932, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1932, amending the first-mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (3) of Article nine of the principal Order:—

"(3) Whenever an aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland is carrying passengers for hire or reward—

(a) the owner of the aircraft shall cause to be exhibited and kept exhibited in a conspicuous place in the aircraft a legible notice stating whether and to what extent smoking is permitted in the aircraft; and

(b) no person shall smoke in the aircraft unless, or except in so far as, smoking is stated by the notice to be permitted.

No notice exhibited in an aircraft for the purpose of the foregoing provisions of this paragraph shall state that smoking is permitted therein unless, or except in so far as, smoking therein is authorised by the aircraft's certificate of airworthiness or by the permission in writing of the Secretary of State.

No person shall smoke in an aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland when it is not carrying passengers for hire or reward unless, or except in so far as, smoking therein is authorised by the aircraft's certificate of airworthiness or by the permission in writing of the Secretary of State."

2. The following paragraph shall be inserted at the end of Article nine of the principal Order:—

"(5) Subject to the provisions of this paragraph, when an aircraft is flying within Great Britain and Northern Ireland, no person shall at any time be carried on the wings or undercarriage of the aircraft, or on or in any other part thereof which is not designed for the accommodation of the personnel or passengers, or on or in anything attached to the aircraft:

Provided that—

(a) nothing in this paragraph shall prevent a person having temporary access—

(i) to any part of the aircraft for the purpose of executing repairs to the aircraft or adjusting the machinery or equipment thereof or for the purpose of doing anything which may be necessary for the safety of the aircraft or persons or goods carried therein; or

(ii) to any part of the aircraft in which goods or stores are being carried and to which proper means of access is provided; and

(b) a person may be carried on or in any part of the aircraft, or anything attached thereto, with the permission in writing of the Secretary of State and subject to any

conditions which may be attached to that permission."

3. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1933.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932 (7 E. 7. c. 29, 4-5 G. 5. c. 18, 9-10 G. 5. c. 80, 18-19 G. 5. c. 3 and 22-23 G. 5. c. 32), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty series No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas the Principality of Liechtenstein has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Liechtenstein the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Liechtenstein or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Liechtenstein confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Liechtenstein or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall be applicable to Liechtenstein.

3. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Liechtenstein) Order, 1933.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of March, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bolton le Moors Saint Paul with part of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, and (2) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bolton le Moors Emmanuel, with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors Christ Church all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Manchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul, and part of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, and (2) of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Manchester and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Manchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul, and Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, are now full, the Reverend William Morris being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul, and the Reverend William Evelyn Arnold Harris being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, and the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said William Morris and William Evelyn Arnold Harris (testified by their respectively signing this

Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel and all that part of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church (containing the Parish Church), which is bounded upon the south west and upon the south east by the Parish of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, upon the north east by the middle of James Street and upon the north west by the middle of Deane Road, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided under the style of 'The Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel).

"2. That the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul, and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided under the style of 'The Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul).

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the Parish of the same United Benefice.

"4. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions shall forthwith take effect and (a) the said William Evelyn Arnold Harris if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, and (b) the said William Morris if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul.

"5. That upon the unions taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages, and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in Christ Church, Bolton le Moors, shall be transferred to the Church of Emmanuel, Bolton le Moors, but the Marriage registers in duplicate current at Christ Church, Bolton le Moors, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"6. That in the event of the services of the Verger or any of the Church servants of Christ Church, Bolton le Moors, being dispensed with by reason of the unions taking effect, such Verger or Church servants shall, out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of Clause 9 of this Scheme receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of office, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop

of Manchester equitable and proper, and pending the completion of the sale or sales contemplated by Clause 9 of this Scheme, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, shall be at liberty to advance the necessary sums or sum out of the Expenses Fund of the said Diocese of Manchester under the said Measure and to repay to such Fund the amount of such advances or advance with interest out of the net proceeds of such sale or sales.

"7. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"8. That upon the unions taking effect the endowments of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say (a) an annual sum or stipend of £100 being part of a larger annual sum or stipend at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, (b) a further part, namely £200 per annum, of such larger annual sum or stipend shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, St. Paul, and (c) with the consent of the Right Honourable James Ramsay MacDonald, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, and in exercise of his office as such First Lord alternate Patron on behalf of Your Majesty of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church (testified by his signing this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, as the other alternate Patron of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church (testified as aforesaid), all other the endowments of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, that is to say, the remaining part, namely a sum of £74 10s. 0d., of such larger annual sum or stipend together with certain debentures held by us and producing an annual income of £13 10s. 0d. shall be excepted out of the unions and shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the endowment of the proposed new District hereinafter referred to.

"9. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the unions have taken effect the Church of the Parish of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all

respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Manchester under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall together with the net proceeds of the sale of the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, hereinbefore referred to, form one aggregate fund, and such aggregate fund shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say, (i) that there shall be paid thereout the compensation or compensations mentioned in Clause 6 of this Scheme; and (ii) that the balance of such aggregate fund shall be held and accumulated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church for a District to be formed under the New Parishes Acts, 1843 and 1856, in or near the Town of Bolton and for and towards the endowment of such Church and District and the provision of a Parsonage House in connection therewith;

(c) That the font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of the Parish of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Manchester, and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of the Parish of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, or such of them as the Bishop of Manchester shall select shall be removed to the Church of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, and any of the articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Manchester for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel, Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Manchester which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of the Parish of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, as aforesaid.

" 10. That upon the taking effect of the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul, and the Churchwardens of the Church of such United Benefice shall for the purposes of the trusteeship of Christ Church School, situate in Deane Road, Bolton le Moors, and lying within the area included in the part of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be united with the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul, be substituted for and stand in the place of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, and the Churchwardens of the Church of that Benefice respectively.

" 11. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Emmanuel, and (b) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul, shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Bolton le Moors, Saint Paul.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of Christ Church, Bolton le Moors, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church, shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the Church of the Parish of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, of any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Manchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by the Parochial Church Council of Bolton le Moors, Christ Church, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 10th June, 1932:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council by Order of the 26th June, 1933, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, and the New Parish of Saint Francis, Bournville, both in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Badgeworth and the said Benefice of Shurdington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Badgeworth with Shurdington' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices of Badgeworth and Shurdington shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices of Badgeworth and Shurdington shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices of Badgeworth and Shurdington be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

BIRMINGHAM.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Handsworth St. Mary, in the said City, and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to there being room and to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than four feet six inches below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave, and to the approval of the Medical Officer of Health for the City of Birmingham.

**COVENTRY CORPORATION TRAMWAYS
(CESSER OF POWERS) ORDER, 1933.**

WHEREAS by the Coventry Electric Tramways Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903") powers were granted for the construction and working of the tramways therein described and certain of those tramways, including the tramways described in the Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the abandoned tramways," were constructed and opened for traffic.

And whereas the said powers in relation to the abandoned tramways are now vested in the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Coventry (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation").

the satisfaction of the Board of Trade, the said Board, if they think fit, may by order declare that the powers of the promoters in respect of such tramway or the part thereof so discontinued shall, from the date of such order, be at an end, and thereupon the said powers of the promoters shall cease and determine, unless the same are purchased by the local authority in manner by this Act provided."

And whereas by virtue of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, have been transferred to the Minister of Transport.
