PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Children and Young Persons Act, 1933 (23 Geo. V. c. 12), it is, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, specify as respects the metropolitan police court area the places (which, notwithstanding anything in the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840 (2-3 Vict. 71 and 3-4 Vict. 84), may be places other than police courts) in which juvenile courts are to sit, and assign as a division to each such place such portion of that area as may be specified in the Order: and direct the manner in which for the purposes of the constitution of a juvenile court in that area two justices of the peace for the County of London shall be selected from the panel of such justices nominated from time to time by the Secretary of State:

And whereas such an Order in Council may contain such supplemental, incidental and consequential provisions as appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary for the purposes of the Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to

order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that—

(1) juvenile courts for the metropolitan police court area shall sit in the places mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order; and the division assigned to each such place shall be that portion of that area which is specified in the second column of the Schedule.

(2) the juvenile courts shall be held on the days and at the hours specified in the third column of the Schedule or on such other days and at such other hours as may from time to time be approved by a Secretary of State: provided that a juvenile court which would in pursuance of the foregoing provision have been held on a day when the metropolitan police courts are closed may be held on the preceding day, or if the preceding day is a Sunday, on the day following.

(3) the justices who are to sit at the several sittings of the juvenile courts shall be chosen by the panel and such metropolitan police magistrates as are nominated by the Secretary of State to act as chairmen of juvenile courts within the metropolitan police court area.

(4) This Order shall come into force on the 1st November, 1933.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to

be taken by His Majesty's vessels, and other vessels, navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain Regulations and Rules were made by Orders in Council dated the 30th day of March, 1914, the 4th day of September, 1918, the 6th day of February, 1925, the 29th day of March, 1926, and the 20th day of March, 1931, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Portland:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such Rules as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

2. Clause 5 of the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 30th day of

March, 1914, as amended by the said Order in Council dated the 20th day of March, 1931, is hereby repealed.

3. The following Rule shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Portland and shall be read and construed as though inserted in the Second Schedule of the said Order in Council, dated the 30th day of March, 1914, in the position indicated by the number prefixed thereto.

Outgoing vessels to have priority.

5. Outgoing vessels shall have priority of passage in the channels through the breakwaters over incoming vessels, and no vessel proceeding inward shall enter any of said channels until any vessel or vessels proceeding outwards by the same channel shall have passed out. Provided that this rule shall not apply when the incoming vessel is showing either of the signals laid down in Rule 6, when it is the duty of all other vessels to keep out of her way and not to enter the channel. Nevertheless, an outgoing vessel shall have priority over an incoming vessel if both are showing either of the above mentioned signals.

The following Address was presented to the KING on the occasion of the opening of the new Graving Dock of the Southern Railway at Southampton by His Majesty on the 26th July, 1933:—

CHAIRMAN OF THE SOUTHERN RAILWAY.

TO HIS MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTY THE KING.
May it please Your Majesty.

We, the Chairman, Directors, Officers and Employees of all grades of the Southern Rail-

way Company, beg to offer our humble welcome and to express our grateful appreciation of the high honour Your Majesty has conferred upon us by graciously coming here to-day to declare this great Graving Dock open.

We recall with pride that on this date 43 years ago—July 26th, 1890—Her Majesty Queen Victoria honoured the Southampton Dock Company by declaring the Empress Dock open, and also that His Majesty King Edward, when Prince of Wales, opened the Prince of Wales Dock on August 3rd, 1895; further that in 1924 His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales inaugurated the world's largest Floating Dock which Your Majesty has just passed in the Royal Yacht.

The fame of Southampton as a Port goes back into distant history, but since the London and South Western Railway Company acquired the Docks in 1892 the rise to prosperity of the Port has been most noteworthy. That Company, and its successor the Southern Railway Company, have turned to the use of man the great natural advantages of Southampton Water, with its unique double tides and its sheltered position in close proximity both to the Capital of Your Majesty's Empire and to the Continent of Europe.

In the Great War, Southampton held the proud position of being "Number 1 Port." Eight million men of Your Majesty's forces—including the whole of the Expeditionary Force—passed over these Quays. In peace time, Southampton—England's premier Passenger Port—forms a most important link in the chain that binds the Motherland to the Dominions beyond the seas.

Between the date of the acquisition of the Docks by the Railway Company and the commencement of the present extensions, the length of quays has more than doubled; the amount of cargo and number of passengers carried has nearly trebled, and the tonnage of vessels using the Docks has increased eightfold.

It is with the view of leaving nothing undone to provide for the needs of the world's shipping, and with the purpose of keeping abreast of modern requirements, that the Southern Railway Company decided to carry through the important extensions now nearing completion, and to undertake, with the assistance and approval of Your Majesty's Government the construction of this Graving Dock—the largest in the World—capable of dry-docking a vessel of 100,000 tons.

The skill of the Engineers and Contractors has enabled these works to be successfully accomplished, notwithstanding the many complicated problems that have had to be overcome.

Your Majesty's gracious presence here to-day encourages us in our determination to bear our share in the Nation's endeavour for the revival of trade.

Once more expressing our heartfelt welcome, we reaffirm our loyalty and attachment to Your Majesty, to Her Majesty the Queen, and to the Members of the Royal Family.

We now respectfully beg that Your Majesty will be pleased to declare this Dock open.

To which address His Majesty was pleased to return the following Gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I have accepted with much pleasure the invitation to be present at to-day's

ceremony, and I thank you heartily for the loyal and dutiful address which you, Mr. Loder, have presented. The association of my family with the great docks in Southampton Water is, as you say, a long one, and I personally have a vivid recollection of that day in August, 1895, when I accompanied my Father at the opening of the Prince of Wales Dock, the largest in existence at that time.

It affords me, therefore, special satisfaction to inaugurate to-day this splendid addition to the dock system of the port.

From the early days of our overseas trade, Southampton has held a foremost place in the commercial life of this country. This position it has retained as the result of wise and continuous development, and its record as a port of embarkation during the years of the Great War will never be forgotten.

It is as true to-day as ever that the welfare of this country is largely bound up with the prosperity of its seaborne traffic. Realising the vital need for efficiency in our ports, as in all other requirements of our Merchant Navy, I look upon the opening of this, the largest Graving Dock in the world, as a good augury for the future of Southampton.

I must express my admiration for the enterprise displayed by the Board of the Southern Railway in undertaking this great work in such difficult times. I congratulate the contracting Firms and the Engineers on their success in carrying it out, and I rejoice to think that the building of this Dock has given the blessing of employment to many who would otherwise have been without it.

I have much pleasure in declaring the Dock open for use and in naming it "The King George V Graving Dock"; and I pray that by God's Blessing it may serve to foster and increase the commerce of Southampton.

SEA-FISHING INDUSTRY ACT, 1933.

The Sea-Fishing Industry (Restriction of Fishing in Northern Waters) Order, 1933.

This Order provides that no person shall, during the months of June, July, August and September in any year, land in the United Kingdom any sea-fish which have been caught in waters situate

(a) to the northward of a line drawn along the parallel of latitude 71° 10' 10" north from the east coast of Greenland to the North Cape of Norway and to the westward of the meridian of the North Cape of Norway (longitude 25° 47' 20" east); or

(b) to the northward of the parallel of latitude 64° north and to the eastward of the meridian of the North Cape of Norway (longitude 25° 47' 20" east).

The Sea-Fishing Industry (Fishing Nets) Order, 1933.

This Order provides that no fishing boat registered in the United Kingdom shall carry for the purpose of catching any sea-fish (other than herrings or shrimps) in any waters outside the three-mile limit any net which has in the bag, pocket or cod-end a smaller mesh than is represented by:

- 21 rows or rounds to the yard when unused and untreated with any preservative
- 22 rows or rounds to the yard when unused and treated with some preservative
- 24 rows or rounds to the yard in any condition whatsoever.

The Sea-Fishing Industry (Immature Sea-Fish) Order, 1933.

This Order provides that no person in Great Britain shall sell or have in his possession for the purpose of sale any sea-fish of the following descriptions of less than the following measurements:—

- Hake—thirteen inches long.
