“And whereas we consider it desirable to extend the Special Service system to the Signal Branch and to enter men as Ordinary Signalmen, rising to Signalman and Leading

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the extension as from the 1st day of July, 1933, of the Special Service system accordingly to the Signal Branch, at the above rates of pay.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And whereas His Majesty by His Order in Council of the 16th day of *March, 1933*, was pleased to order that the number of Councillors of the Borough of *Gateshead* shall be thirty and that the number of Wards thereof shall be ten:

And whereas on the 10th day of *May, 1933*, the Right Honourable Sir *John Gilmour, Baronet*, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint *Richard Cowdy Maxwell, Esquire, O.B.E., LL.D.*, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of *Gateshead*:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 21st day of *June, 1933*:—

" SCHEME.

" *County Borough of Gateshead.*

" I.—Boundaries of Wards.

" *North Ward.*

" The North Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at a point in the *River Tyne* on the Northern boundary of the Borough 235 yards South West of the *Redheugh Bridge* over the said River thence North-Eastward along the said boundary to the centre of the *High Level Bridge* thence Southward, South-Eastward and Southward along the centre of the said Bridge, *Wellington Street* and *West Street* to the junction of *West Street* with *Bensham Road* thence Westward and South-Westward along the centre of *Bensham Road* to its junction with *Bank Street* thence North-Westward along the centre of *Bank Street* to its junction with *Askew Road West* thence South-Westward along the centre of *Askew Road West* to its junction with *Lower Cuthbert Street* thence North-Westward along the centre of *Lower Cuthbert Street* to its junction with *Rose Street* and thence North-Westward by a direct line to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" *North East Ward.*

" The North East Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the centre of the *High Level Bridge* on the Northern boundary of the Borough thence along the Borough boundary first in a generally Eastward direction and then in a generally South-Westward direction along the said boundary to its intersection by the line of the *London and North Eastern Railway* thence North-Westward along the centre of the said Railway to the centre of *Park Lane Bridge* thence Westward along the centre of *Park Lane Bridge* and *Park Lane* to the junction of *Park Lane* with *High Street* thence Northward along the centre of *High Street* to its junction with *Jackson Street* thence Westward along the centre of *Jackson Street* to its junction with *West Street* and thence Northward and North-Westward along the boundary of the North Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" *North West Ward.*

" The North West Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at a point on the Northern boundary of the Borough at the junction of the *River Tyne* with the *River Team* thence Eastward along the Borough boundary to a point in the *River Tyne* 235 yards South-West of *Redheugh Bridge* aforesaid thence South-Eastward along the Western boundary of the North Ward hereinbefore described to a point at the centre of the Bridge over the *London and North Eastern (Team Valley) Railway* at the junction of *Askew Road West* with *Lower Cuthbert Street* thence Southward along the centre of the said Railway to the centre of the Railway Bridge at the junction of *Lobley Hill Road* with *Bensham Road* thence South-Westward and Westward along the centre of *Lobley Hill Road* to its junction with the road leading to *Whickham* thence Westward along the centre of the latter road to the Borough boundary thence in a generally North-Eastward and Northward direction along the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" *Central Ward.*

" The Central Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the junction of *Bank Street* with *Bensham Road* thence North-Eastward along the Southern boundary of the North Ward hereinbefore described to the junction of *Bensham Road* with *High West Street* thence Southward along the centre of *High West Street* to its junction with *Whitehall Road* thence Westward along the centre of *Whitehall Road* to its junction with *Coatsworth Road* thence Northward along the centre of *Coatsworth Road* to its junction with *Bewick Road West* thence Westward along the centre of *Bewick Road West* to its junction with *Rectory Road* thence North-Westward along the centre of *Rectory Road* to its junction with *Cromwell Terrace* thence North-Eastward along the centre of *Cromwell Terrace* to its junction with *St. Cuthbert's Place* thence North-Westward along the centre of *St. Cuthbert's Place* and the footpath leading from *St. Cuthbert's Place* to *Bensham*

Road to the junction of that footpath with Bensham Road and thence North-Eastward along the centre of Bensham Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" East Central Ward.

" The East Central Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the junction of High West Street with Bensham Road thence Eastward and South-Eastward along the Southern boundary of the North East Ward hereinbefore described to the centre of the Bridge in St. James's Road over the London and North Eastern Railway thence South-Westward and Southward along the centre of the said Bridge, St. James's Road and Herbert Street to the junction of Herbert Street with Cobden Street thence Westward along the centre of Cobden Street and Cross Street to the junction of Cross Street with Brunswick Street thence Northward along the centre of Brunswick Street to its junction with St. Edmund's Road thence Westward along the centre of St. Edmund's Road to its junction with Durham Road thence Northward along the centre of Durham Road to its junction with Whitehall Road and thence Northward along the Eastern boundary of the Central Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" South Central Ward.

" The South Central Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the junction of Coatsworth Road with Whitehall Road thence Eastward and Southward along the Southern boundary of the Central Ward hereinbefore described and the South-Western boundary of the East Central Ward hereinbefore described to the junction of Brunswick Street with Cross Street thence South-Eastward along the centre of Brunswick Street Old Durham Road and Sodhouse Bank to the junction of the latter with Kells Lane North thence Westward and South-Westward along the centre of Kells Lane North Beaconsfield Road and Bellevue Bank to the junction of the latter with Saltwell Road thence Northward along the centre of Saltwell Road to its junction with West Park Road thence continuing Northward along the centre of West Park Road to its junction with Field House Road thence Eastward along the centre of Saltwell View to its junction with Brinkburn Avenue thence Northward along the centre of Brinkburn Avenue and Coatsworth Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" West Central Ward.

" The West Central Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the centre of the London and North Eastern (Team Valley) Railway Bridge at the junction of Lobley Hill Road with Bensham Road thence Northward and North-Eastward along the Eastern boundary of the North West Ward hereinbefore described to the junction of Askew Road West with Lower Cuthbert Street thence North-Eastward and South-Eastward along the South-Eastern boundary of the North Ward hereinbefore described to the junction of Bank Street with Bensham Road thence in a generally Southward direction along the Western boundary of the Central Ward hereinbefore described to

the junction of Coatsworth Road with Whitehall Road thence South-Westward along the centre of Whitehall Road to its junction with Saltwell Road thence Northward along the centre of Saltwell Road to its junction with Hedley Street thence Westward along the centre of Hedley Street to the London and North Eastern (Team Valley) Railway aforesaid and thence North-Westward along the centre of the said Railway to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" East Ward.

" The East Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the junction of Cross Street with Brunswick Street thence Eastward and Northward along the Southern boundary of the East Central Ward hereinbefore described to the centre of the Bridge in St. James's Road over the London and North Eastern Railway, thence South-Eastward along the Southern boundary of the North East Ward hereinbefore described to the Borough boundary thence Southward along the Borough boundary to the intersection of the said boundary by the occupation road which leads to Blue Quarries Road thence South-Westward along the centre of the said occupation road and Blue Quarries Road to the junction of Blue Quarries Road with Sodhouse Bank thence North-Westward along the centre of Sodhouse Bank to its junction with Kells Lane North and thence continuing North-Westward along the Eastern boundary of the South Central Ward hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" South Ward.

" The South Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the centre of the public footbridge across the River Team thence Eastward along the centre of the said footbridge and the public footpath across the Derwent Crook Playing Fields to the junction of the said footpath with the unnamed road adjoining the Western side of Low Fell Railway Station thence Northward along the centre of that road to the Bridge over the said Railway Station thence Eastward along the centre of the said Bridge and Derwent Crook Road to the junction of the latter with Station Road thence Northward along the centre of Station Road to its junction with Bellevue Bank thence Eastward along the centre of Bellevue Bank to its junction with Saltwell Road thence continuing Eastward and North-Eastward along the Southern boundary of the South Central Ward hereinbefore described to the junction of Kells Lane North with Sodhouse Bank thence South Eastward and North-Eastward along the Southern boundary of the East Ward hereinbefore described to the Borough boundary thence South-Eastward, South-Westward, Westward and North-Westward along the said boundary to a point where it is intersected by the River Team and thence Northward along the centre of the River Team to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" The West Ward shall comprise the remaining portion of the Borough not comprised within the boundaries of the above mentioned Wards as set out herein.

" The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto which forms part of the Scheme.

" In case of any discrepancies between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out the textual description shall prevail.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 33 of the Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of sub-section (5) of Section I of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments, and prescribe the 8th day of August, 1933, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause 13 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following new Clause 13 shall be substituted therefor:—

13. The Board shall appoint a Secretary and such Inspectors or other officers as the Board may deem necessary to enable effect to be given to the functions of the Board, and they shall fix the terms and duration of each appointment.

2. Clause 55 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following new Clause 55 shall be substituted therefor:—

55. (1) As from the date when a minimum price is fixed by the Board for any class of coal under the provisions of the Scheme, no owner producing coal of that class shall, either directly or indirectly, except as provided by Section 4 of the Act,

(i) sell or supply the coal at a price below the price so fixed for the time being;

(ii) sell or supply the coal in any manner whereby the actual consideration obtained is less in value than the price so fixed;

(iii) make, allow or give, or agree to make, allow or give, save as may expressly be permitted by or under the Scheme, any gift, discount, commission, rebate, extended

credit or allowance in respect of the price, quantity or weight of the coal or otherwise; or

(iv) permit or suffer any agent or subsidiary company of the owner to make, allow or give, or to agree to make, allow or give, any such gift, discount, commission, rebate, extended credit or allowance as aforesaid,

and any owner who contravenes in any particular the provisions of this Clause shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Clause 76 of the Scheme.

(2) In this Clause the expression "subsidiary company" means in relation to any owner (being a company) a subsidiary company within the meaning of Section 127 of the Companies Act, 1929, whose objects consist of, include, or involve, trading in coal produced from the coal mine or undertaking of that owner.

3. The following new Clauses shall be inserted in the Scheme:—

55A. (a) For the purpose of securing that the actual consideration obtained by the sale or supply of coal or any class of coal (other than coal supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about any coal mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed) shall not be less in value than the minimum price fixed for the time being under the Scheme for such coal, and with a view to enabling the Board to ascertain or verify the amount of the consideration actually received by or payable to the owner in respect of such sale or supply, the Board may from time to time prescribe conditions upon and in accordance with which coal or any class of coal shall be sold or supplied by owners, whether directly or through an agent or through any subsidiary company as defined in Clause 55 of the Scheme.

(b) Notice under the provisions of Clause 32 of the Scheme shall be served on every owner of any conditions so prescribed by the Board, and of the date on which they are to come into force.

(c) Any owner who, either directly or indirectly, sells or supplies coal or any class of coal upon terms inconsistent with any conditions for the time being prescribed under this Clause, or who fails to stipulate expressly that those conditions shall govern the sale or supply, or who refuses or fails when so required in writing by the Secretary to take forthwith all necessary steps for enforcing those conditions or any of them shall be liable to a penalty of 2s. 6d. per ton in respect of each ton so sold or supplied, or (as the case may be) in respect of each ton to which any such condition relates.

55B. (a) Without prejudice to the generality of the powers conferred upon the Board by Clause 55A of the Scheme, any owner selling coal for export abroad shall in the case of every such sale stipulate with the buyer for the following conditions:—

(i) that the coal is sold for bona fide export abroad, and shall not be sold for consumption in Great Britain at any price lower than the minimum price fixed for the time being under the provisions of the Scheme for the like coal when sold or sup-

plied for consumption in Great Britain; and

(ii) that the buyer shall, in the event of the coal being resold or used for consumption in Great Britain, pay to such owner by way of addition to the contract price the amount (if any) by which the value of the coal at such minimum price as aforesaid exceeds the contract price.

(b) In the event of any coal sold by any owner for export abroad being resold or used for consumption in Great Britain, such owner shall be liable to a penalty of 2s. 6d. per ton in respect of each ton or part of a ton so resold or used, unless he shall satisfy the Board that his contract with the buyer included the aforesaid conditions and that he has recovered from the buyer the amount (if any) of such excess as aforesaid or has been unable to effect recovery through no fault or omission of his own.

57A. If an owner ships or causes to be shipped any cargo or consignment of coal in any vessel belonging to him or under his control, the rate of freight charged to the agent or buyer (as the case may be) shall not be less than the market rate current at the date of shipment for carriage in a vessel of the like class and size, and in any case where coal is shipped or caused to be shipped by an owner in contravention of this Clause and the actual consideration obtained by the owner in respect of the coal is thereby reduced below the minimum price for the time being in force for the coal, such owner shall be liable to a penalty of 2s. 6d. per ton in respect of each ton or part of a ton so shipped or caused to be shipped by him.

4. Clause 70 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following new Clause 70 shall be substituted therefor:—

70. Every owner shall furnish to the Board or any person authorised by the Board in that behalf, in such manner as the Board may prescribe, such returns, accounts and other information as the Board may think fit to require for the purposes of their functions under the Scheme, and the same shall be certified by the owner, his manager or accounting officer, or other person authorised to act on his behalf, or verified by statutory declaration if required by the Board.

5. Clause 71 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following new Clause 71 shall be substituted therefor:—

71. (a) In order that the Board may be able to verify any return, account or other information furnished to them by an owner, or for the purpose of enabling the Board to secure any information that they consider necessary for the exercise or performance of any of their functions under the Scheme, every owner shall on demand by the Board produce or cause to be produced, the books and accounts relating to his coal mine or undertaking, including books and accounts of any subsidiary company as defined in Clause 55 of the Scheme, or of any agent through whom any coal of such coal mine or undertaking is sold or supplied, for inspection by an accountant authorised by the Board for this purpose, who shall report to the Board on the results of his inspection.

(b) Every owner shall give to every Inspector appointed by the Board to give effect to their functions under the Scheme all the facilities in the power of such owner to enable such Inspector to make such inspection as the Board may direct of any saleable coal belonging to such owner or of any wagon or ship belonging to or under the control of such owner and carrying or intended for the purpose of carrying coal of any coal mine.

6. Clause 78 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following new Clause 78 shall be substituted therefor:—

78. If any owner shall fail in any particular to comply with any demand made by the Board under Clause 71 of the Scheme, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 in respect of every day during which such default continues as from and including the date of the demand or the date (if any) specified therein for compliance therewith, whichever shall be the later, unless he shall satisfy the Board that compliance with the demand in such particular was not within his power.
