The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 28th day of July, 1933, (N.), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of July, 1932, to sanction the grant of extra pay of one shilling a day to Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers of the Writer and Supply Branches who are qualified in cypher duties and who are employed regularly in peace time on these duties in sloops and

similar vessels on detached service on foreign stations, where not more than one Accountant Officer is borne, payment being confined to the days on which the ratings actually perform cyphering duties which entail a considerable amount of work outside their normal working hours:

“And whereas we are of opinion that payment of extra pay of one shilling a day should be extended to qualified Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers of the Writer and Supply Branches employed at Your Majesty's Naval Wireless Stations abroad, subject to the conditions applicable to ratings serving afloat:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize the payment of extra pay accordingly.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by subsection (3) of section 2 of the *Dangerous Drugs Act, 1932*, power is conferred on His Majesty by Order in Council to apply Part III of the *Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920* (in this Order referred to as "the principal Act"), with such modifications as may be specified in the Order, to any of the following drugs (in this Order referred to as "the said drugs"), that is to say, methylmorphine (commonly known as codeine), ethylmorphine (commonly known as dionin) and their respective salts:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by subsection (3) of section 2 of the *Dangerous Drugs Act, 1932*, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. Part III of the principal Act shall, with the modifications specified in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order, apply to the said drugs.

2. The power conferred on a Secretary of State by subsection (1) of section 7 of the principal Act to make regulations for controlling the manufacture, sale, possession and distribution of drugs to which Part III of the principal Act applies shall be exercisable—

(a) in relation to sale or to distribution of any of the said drugs only as respects sale or distribution by a wholesale druggist and, in the case of a wholesale druggist who is also an authorised seller of poisons, only as respects sale or distribution otherwise than in the course of any retail business carried on by him.

(b) in relation to possession of any of the said drugs, only as respects possession thereof in a quantity exceeding one pound avoirdupois.

For the purpose of this Article—

"authorised seller of poisons" means, in relation to any period before the coming into operation of section 28 of the *Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933*, a person who lawfully keeps open shop for the retailing of poisons in accordance with the provisions of the *Pharmacy Act, 1868*, as amended by the *Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908*, and thereafter a person lawfully carrying on business in accordance with the provisions of the *Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933*, as an authorised seller of poisons.

"retail business" means the business of retailing or dispensing (or compounding) drugs carried on at a shop.

"wholesale druggist" means a person who carries on the business of selling drugs to persons who buy to sell again.

3. Subsection (2) of the said section 7 shall not apply in relation to any of the said drugs.

4. The *Interpretation Act, 1889*, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October nineteen hundred and thirty-three.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the *War Loan Act, 1919*, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
