The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lord Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of August, 1933, (N. 3707/33), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 19th day of December, 1923, to sanction certain revised rates of extra duty pay to Royal Marines employed in appointments at the several Royal Marine Divisions and the Depot, R.M., Deal :

“And whereas we consider that extra duty pay of 1s. 6d. a day should be paid to the Sergeant Tailor in responsible charge of the

fitting, alteration and repair of clothing and equipment of ranks serving in the Depot, R.M., Deal :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of extra duty pay accordingly, with effect from the 8th day of February, 1933.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by subsection (2) of section 31 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (in this Order referred to as “the Act”) it is provided that the Act shall come into

operation on the appointed day, and that the appointed day shall be such day as His Majesty may by Order in Council appoint, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The first day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-three shall be the appointed day for the provisions of the Act specified in the first column of Part I of the Schedule hereto for the purposes specified in the second column thereof.

2. The thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-three shall be the appointed day for the provisions of the Act specified in the first column of Part II of the Schedule hereto for the purposes specified in the second column thereof.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (Date of Commencement) Order (No. 1), 1933.

**WHEREAS** His Majesty, by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, 1-2 Geo. 5, c. 46, was pleased to make an Order in Council dated the 3rd day of February, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as the Copyright (United States of America) Order, 1915, S.R. & O. 1915, No. 130), extending in certain of His Majesty's Dominions, Colonies and Possessions the protection of the said Act to the unpublished works of citizens of or residents in the United States of America:

And whereas by the Copyright Act, 1911 (Extension to Palestine) Order, 1924, dated the 21st day of March, 1924, S.R. & O. 1924, No. 385, the Copyright Act, 1911, extends to Palestine:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Government of the United States of America has made or has undertaken to make such provision as it appears to His Majesty expedient to require for the protection of works entitled to copyright under the provisions of Part I of the said Act in Palestine (excluding Trans-Jordan):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Copyright (United States of America) Order, 1915, shall apply to Palestine (excluding Trans-Jordan) as if it were one of His

Majesty's Dominions, Colonies and Possessions to which the said Order applies.

2. Where any person has, before the commencement of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work in a manner which at the time was lawful or for the purpose of or with a view to the reproduction or performance of a work at a time when such reproduction or performance would, but for the making of this Order have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting and valuable at the said date unless the person who by virtue of this Order becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as failing agreement may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Copyright Act, 1911.

3. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (United States of America) Order, 1915 (Extension to Palestine) Order, 1933.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st October, 1933, which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of June, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting (1) the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ham situate in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury and the Benefice (being part of the United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe) of Buttermere, situate in the said County of Wilts and in the said Diocese of Salisbury and (2) the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Facombe, situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, with the Benefice (being the remaining part of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe) of Combe, situate in the County of Berks and in the said Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Ham with the said Benefice of Buttermere and (2) of the said Benefice of Facombe with the said Benefice of Combe, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and

therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas the said Report has also been approved in writing by the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Winchester:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions, which said Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishops of Salisbury and Winchester respectively embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Ham and Facombe are now full, the Reverend Charles Robert Eyre Wheeler being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ham, and the Reverend William Hipwood Mowat being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Facombe, and the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe is at present vacant:

"And whereas there is a pension charged upon the revenues of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe in favour of the Reverend Charles Rhodes Hall, a former Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent also of the said Charles Robert Eyre Wheeler and of the said William Hipwood Mowat (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Ham and a part of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe, namely the said Benefice of Buttermere (comprising the area of the Civil Parish of Buttermere) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the said Benefice of Facombe and the remaining part of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe, namely the said Benefice of Combe (comprising the area of the Civil Parish of Combe) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Facombe with Combe', and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Winchester, of the Archdeaconry of Basingstoke and of the Rural Deanery of Andover, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the *London Gazette* the unions shall forthwith take effect and the said Charles Robert Eyre Wheeler, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere and the said William Hipwood Mowat, if he is then Incumbent of

the said Benefice of Facombe shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Facombe with Combe.

"4. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) pending the provision of a new Parsonage House situate at Ham for the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere, the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere, (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Facombe shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Facombe with Combe and (c) so soon as conveniently may be after the unions have taken effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Buttermere with Combe and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and accumulated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for and towards the cost of the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere.

"5. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say (a) the right of presentation to the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Ham and Buttermere with Combe alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Buttermere with Combe having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Ham having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the same United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter, and (b) in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Facombe with Combe after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Buttermere with Combe shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Facombe shall have the second and the third turns.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect all the glebe situate within the Parish of the said Benefice of Buttermere and all Tithe Rent Charges arising within the said Parish of Buttermere, and now or formerly belonging to the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe, together with all capital sums of money and stocks (if any) representing or being the produce of the sale, redemption or other conversion of any part or parts of such Tithe Rentcharge shall subject as hereinafter provided become and be part of the endowments of the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere, and all other the endowments of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe shall subject as

aforsaid become and be part of the endowments of the United Benefice of Facombe with Combe.

"7. That with the consent of the said Charles Rhodes Hall (testified by his signing this Scheme), if upon the date of the unions taking effect the pension now payable to the said Charles Rhodes Hall as aforesaid shall still be payable, such pension shall be apportioned as follows, that is to say, a portion equal to seven-twelfths of such pension shall be charged upon the revenues of the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere and the remaining portion of such pension shall be charged upon the revenues of the United Benefice of Facombe with Combe.

"8. That upon the unions taking effect or upon the cessation of the pension now payable as aforesaid to the said Charles Rhodes Hall, whichever shall be later, a part of the endowments of the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say, the Tithe Redemption Annuity amounting to £17 10s. at present payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty for the benefit of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe and the Tithe Redemption Annuity amounting to £184 17s. 7d. at present payable to the said Governors for the benefit of the said Benefice of Ham, and the sinking funds held by the said Governors in respect of the same annuities, shall be applied as follows, that is to say, the said two tithe redemption annuities shall be payable to and the said sinking funds shall be held by the said Governors as to three fifth parts thereof for the benefit of the United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere and as to the remaining two fifth parts for the benefit of the Benefice of Westbury, in the said Diocese of Salisbury.

"9. That upon the unions taking effect or upon the cessation of the pension now payable as aforesaid to the said Charles Rhodes Hall whichever shall be later, a part of the endowments of the United Benefice of Facombe with Combe, namely a sum of £1,777 15s. 7d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the said Benefice of Facombe, together with an annual payment of £26 13s. 4d. being part of a larger annual payment now made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe shall be excepted out of the union and shall be applied for the benefit of the Benefice of Hurstbourne Tarrant, in the said Diocese of Winchester.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said



Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consents thereto in writing of the Bishops of Salisbury and Winchester have been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Dioceses of Salisbury and Winchester.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of June, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Kinnersley and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Norton Canon, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of

Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Kinnersley and Norton Canon duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas both of the said Benefices of Kinnersley and Norton Canon are now full, being held in plurality by the Reverend Erroll George Tyndall Simey under the authority of a Dispensation:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Erroll George Tyndall Simey (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That the said Benefice of Kinnersley and the said Benefice of Norton Canon shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Kinnersley with Norton Canon’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Erroll George Tyndall Simey if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Kinnersley and Norton Canon shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Kinnersley and Norton Canon shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

“3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Kinnersley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Kinnersley shall have the first and the third

turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Norton Canon shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of August, 1857, and published in the London Gazette on the 1st day of the following month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of All Saints, Child's Hill, Hendon, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Child's Hill, Hendon':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 5th day of August, 1892, and published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Peter, Cricklewood, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Cricklewood':

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 16th day of July, 1914, and published in the London Gazette on the 21st day of the same month, a District Chapel was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Michael, Golder's Green, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Golder's Green':

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") is empowered

under and by virtue of sub-section (2) of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply if of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade or in any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that Trade.

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to the trade specified in the Appendix hereto.

Now, therefore, the Minister by virtue of the powers conferred as aforesaid and of all other powers in that behalf, hereby makes the following Special Order:

1. The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the Appendix hereto.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Cutlery) Order, 1933.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
