Majesty's Dominions, Colonies and Possessions to which the said Order applies.

- 2. Where any person has, before the commencement of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work in a manner which at the time was lawful or for the purpose of or with a view to the reproduction or performance of a work at a time when such reproduction or performance would, but for the making of this Order have been lawful. nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting and valuable at the said date unless the person who by virtue of this Order becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as failing agreement may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Copyright Act, 1911.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (United States of America) Order, 1915 (Extension to Palestine) Order, 1933.
- 4. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st October, 1933, which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical sioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of June, 1933, in the words and figures follow-

ing, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting
(1) the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ham situate in the County of Wilts
and in the Diocese of Salisbury and the Benefice (being part of the United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe) of Buttermere, situate in the said County of Wilts and in the said Diocese of Salisbury and (2) the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Faccombe, situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, with the Benefice (being the remaining part of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe) of Combe, situate in the County of Berks and in the said Diocese of

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Ham with the said Benefice of Buttermere and (2) of the said Benefice of Faccombe with the said Benefice of Combe, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas the said Report has also

been approved in writing by the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Winchester: "And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions, which said Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishops of Salisbury and Winchester respectively embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Ham and Faccombe are now full, the Reverend Charles Robert Eyre Wheeler being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ham, and the Reverend William Hipwood Mowat being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Faccombe, and the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe

is at present vacant:
"And whereas there is a pension charged upon the revenues of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe in favour of the Reverend Charles Rhodes Hall, a former

Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent also of the said Charles Robert Eyre Wheeler and of the said William Hipwood Mowat (testified by their respec-tively signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:-

- "1. That the said Benefice of Ham and a part of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe, namely the said Benefice of Buttermere (comprising the area of the Civil Parish of Buttermere) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ham with Buttermere ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.
- "2. That the said Benefice of Faccombe and the remaining part of the said United Benefice of Buttermere with Combe, namely the said Benefice of Combe (comprising the area of the Civil Parish of Combe) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Faccombe with Combe', and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Winchester, of the Archdeaconry of Basingstoke and of the Rural Deanery of Andover, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.
- "3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions shall forthwith take effect and the said Charles Robert Eyre Wheeler, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Ham Buttermere and the said William Hipwood Mowat, if he is then Incumbent of
