**GEORGE, R.I.**

Whereas by Sect. 136 of the Army Act it is enacted that the pay of an officer or soldier of the Regular Forces shall be paid without any deduction other than the deductions authorised by that or any other Act or by any Royal Warrant for the time being, or by any law passed by the Governor-General of India in Council,

And whereas it is commanded in the Warrant of Our late Royal Father dated the 22nd February, 1902, that certain provisions regarding the liability of certain such emoluments to be stopped shall be extended to Our Indian Empire,

And whereas We deem it expedient that in like manner certain other provisions regarding such liability, contained in Our Royal Warrant dated the 12th February, 1931, should be extended to Our Indian Empire,

We do hereby command that save in such exceptional circumstances as may be approved by Our Secretary of State for India in Council or by Our Governor-General of India in Council or by an officer whom either may duly authorise, no claim shall be admitted for pay or other pecuniary advantage granted under the Army Regulations, India, to an officer,

soldier, or other person, relating to any period more than twelve months antecedent to the date of claim.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's* this 1st day of *September*, 1933, in the 24th year of Our Reign.
