PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-first day of November, 1922, and known as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1922 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), provision was made for the administration of the Government of the territories known as the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas by Clause V of the Principal Order it was provided that the Protectorate should be divided into two or more portions each under the administration of a Lieutenant-Governor appointed by His Majesty:

And whereas His Majesty by certain Commissions under His Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the fifteenth day of May, 1929, and the fourth day of August, 1930, respectively, was pleased to appoint Cyril Wilson Alexander, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, and Walter Buchanan-Smith, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, upon whom has been bestowed the decoration of the Military Cross, Captain in His Majesty's Army (retired), to be Lieutenant-Governors in the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas by Clause XVIII of the Principal Order provision was made for the appointment of another officer to act provisionally as Lieutenant-Governor in the events described therein:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provision for the administration of the Government of the said Protectorate:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1933, and shall be construed as one with the Principal Order.

II. Clauses V and XVIII of the Principal Order are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following Clauses are hereby substituted therefor:—

"V. That portion of the Protectorate of Nigeria known as the Southern Provinces shall be under the immediate administration of a Lieutenant-Governor appointed by His Majesty. Provided that such Lieutenant-Governor shall be under the control and authority of the Governor and subject to such instructions as may be given to him from time to time by the Governor."

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"XVIII. Whenever the office of Lieutenant-Governor of the Southern Provinces of the Protectorate of Nigeria becomes vacant, or if the Lieutenant-Governor is administering the Government of the Colony and Protectorate or is absent from Nigeria or otherwise becomes incapable of or is from any cause prevented from performing the duties of his office, the Governor may by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Protectorate appoint another officer to act provisionally as Lieutenant-Governor. Such officer shall cease to act as Lieutenant-Governor as soon as either His Majesty shall have appointed another officer to the office, or the substantive holder of the office shall again be capable of performing the duties of the office, or the Governor shall appoint another officer to act provisionally as Lieutenant-Governor."

III. The above recited Commissions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the fifteenth day of May, 1929, and the fourth day of August, 1930, appointing the said Cyril Wilson Alexander and Walter Buchanan-Smith, respectively, to be Lieutenant-Governors in the Protectorate of Nigeria, are hereby revoked.

IV. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Nigeria Gazette, and shall be published in such Gazette; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Protectorate of Nigeria.

V. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Oldham, Bury, Manchester and County of Lancaster Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1933, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1933.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a Superintendent Registrar's district, and the terms "existing district" and "existing sub-district" mean respectively a district and a sub-district which existed immediately before the 1st day of October, 1933

2.—(1) That portion of the existing Oldham district which will on the 1st day of October, 1933, become a separate district situate wholly outside the County Borough

- of Oldham shall, with the existing districts of Bury and Manchester North, be united into one Superintendent Registrar's district, and the district so formed shall be divided into three districts called respectively the Middleton district, the Bury district and the Manchester North district.
- (2) The Middleton district shall consist of the Borough of Middleton and the Urban Districts of Chadderton, Crompton and Royton.
- (3) The Bury district shall comprise the existing Bury district as diminished by the exclusion therefrom of that portion which is situate in the Borough of Middleton.
