TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th October, 1933, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th October, 1933, to Saturday, the 21st October, 1933, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bill's will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date

on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TREASURY MINUTE PRESCRIBING THE TERMS UPON WHICH REPAYMENTS OF LOANS MADE FROM THE LOCAL LOANS FUND MAY BE ALLOWED IN ADVANCE OF THE DUE DATE.

My Lords have had under further consideration the terms on which repayment of loans made to Local Authorities and others from the Local Loans Fund for periods of years can be accepted in advance of the date at which, in accordance with the terms agreed to by the borrower at the time when the loan was made, the principal of such loans falls due for repayment.

These loans have been financed by the issue of perpetual Three per cent. Local Loans Stock at such a discount as was necessary in the market conditions at the time of issue. For every £100 cash raised to make advances from the Local Loans Fund, the Fund has had to enter into a fixed liability (which will remain so long as the stock is uncancelled) in respect of Local Loans Stock to an amount in excess of £100.

When interest rates fall the amount required to pay off the stock at its enhanced value naturally increases. If, therefore, a borrower who has contracted for a 60 year loan were now allowed to repay the outstanding amount of his loan on the basis of £100 cash for each £100 cash borrowed, the amount repaid would be insufficient to pay off the stock set up in respect of that loan, and the Local Loans Fund, contrary to the intention of Parliament as embodied in the Statutes governing the Fund, would be involved in loss.

Under a Treasury Minute dated the 26th June, 1922, My Lords, having regard to the considerations set out above, decided that applications for repaying in advance of their due date loans made on or after the 1st April, 1916, should only be complied with on the condition that the borrower repaid in respect of every £100 loan outstanding a sum equivalent to the current price of so much stock as was deemed to have been created to provide the advance, subject to the proviso that the minimum sum to be repaid in respect of £100 advanced should be £100 cash.

While the adoption of the general principle that borrowers repaying before due date should repay an amount sufficient to cancel the liability incurred by the Local Loans Fund in respect of the advance is essential if that Fund is to be secured against a heavy capital loss, it has been represented to My Lords that the terms laid down, applying as they do to all loans irrespective of their term, bear hardly upon those borrowers who by reason of the nature of the work to be carried out have had recourse to the Fund for loans for a comparatively short period, and that it would be of advantage if, consistently with the above principle, a method could be devised under which the amount to be paid by a borrower could be varied according to the currency of the loan.

My Lords have decided therefore until further notice to substitute for the conditions laid down by the Treasury Minute of the 26th June, 1922, the following conditions, viz.

Applications for repaying, in advance of their due date, loans made on or after the 1st April, 1916, shall in future only be complied with provided:—

1. That at least a month's notice of the intention to repay is given to the Public Works Loan Commissioners.

2. That the borrower repays a sum equal to the present value of the annuity payments (or payments of equal instalments of principal with diminishing interest) still remaining to be made to the Public Works Loan Commissioners under the mortgage with those Commissioners, such present value being calculated by discounting the annuity payments (or other annual or half-yearly payments) at a rate equal to the rate of interest yielded by Local Loans Stock at the average market price (after due adjustment for dividend) of such stock on the day seven days before the date at which the notice of repayment expires and the repayment becomes due; subject, however, in every case to the proviso that the minimum sum to be repaid in respect of each £100 of principal outstanding shall be £100 cash. The average market price of Local Loans Stock for this purpose shall be the price certified by the Bank of England to the National Debt Com-

missioners; and the rate of interest yielded by such stock after adjustment for dividend, if not an exact \$th% shall be rounded down to the \$th% next below.

A table prepared in conformity with this principle showing the rate of interest to be used in discounting the annuity (or other) payments when the average market price of Local Loans Stock (ascertained and adjusted as above) falls within stated limits is annexed to this Minute.

My Lords authorise and require that, unless and until They shall otherwise direct, and subject to the exception provided for below, the cash sum to be lodged in respect of the repayment in advance of loans made from the Local Loans Fund shall be calculated in accordance with the terms of this Minute.

Should any question arise in a particular case as to the correct amount of the discounted value of the annuity (or other) repayments which it is desired to anticipate under the terms of this Minute, the matter shall be referred to the National Debt Commissioners, whose decision shall be final.

As an exception to the above principle, repayment in respect of unexpended balances of loans already advanced will continue to be accepted (subject to due notice) on the basis of £100 for each £100 cash advanced in any case where the Public Works Loan Commissioners are satisfied that the balance is unexpended either because a scheme is less costly than was anticipated or because it has been definitely reduced in extent.

Loans made from the Local Loans Fund previously to the 1st April, 1916, were financed by the issue of Local Loans Stock on more favourable terms; and My Lords consider that repayments in advance in respect of such loans may, until They may otherwise direct, continue to be accepted on the basis of £100 cash per £100 outstanding subject as in the case of loans made subsequently to that date, to the giving by the borrower of not less than one month's notice of the intention to repay.

Notices to Mariners-Revision of SYSTEM OF ISSUE.

Present System.

- 1. The Admiralty Notices to Mariners are at present published daily, and are collated and re-published in non-cumulative weekly editions in which the Notices are arranged in the order (viz., in numerical sequence) in which they are published daily. Each weekly edition also includes Sections furnishing all corrections for the week to the Admiralty List of Lights, etc., and Admiralty List of Wireless Signals. These weekly editions are at present distributed primarily to H.M. Ships and Establishments, Hydrographic Authorities the Dominions, Colonies and foreign countries, and to chart correctors, etc.
- 2. The Board of Trade Notices to Mariners, which are largely compiled from the Admiralty Notices or from similar sources to those from which the Admiralty Notices are compiled, are at present published in weekly, monthly and half-yearly editions, there being separate editions, respectively, for Foreign-going Ships of the Mercantile Marine, and for Home-trade Merchant Ships and Fishing Vessels. Notices in these various editions are arranged, so far as possible, in geographical order, and are not serially numbered.
- 3. It has been decided in the interests of economy and for other reasons, to discontinue the publication of the Board of Trade Notices, and to utilise the Admiralty Notices both for the Navy and the Mercantile Marine. This change will take effect as from the 1st January,

Details of Revised System.

- 4. The Admiralty Notices will continue to be published daily but will also include Notices issued for the information of the Mercantile Marine and/or Fishing Vessels only. Notices of an urgent character or of major importance will continue to be distributed as necessary to the Navy and/or Mercantile Marine and Fishing Vessels.
- 5. The form of the Admiralty weekly editions will continue unchanged, except that the numbered Notices, instead of being arranged in numerical sequence, will be arranged so far as possible in geographical sections but not geographically within those sections. revised make up of these editions will, therefore, be as follows:

Title page, including matter in explanation of abbreviations.

Section I (Geographical index).

Section II, in the following order:-

"Publications" Notices, e.g., those notifying the publication of charts, sailing directions, etc.;

Miscellaneous Notices;

Hydrographic Notices for the area covered by home-trade and fishing vessels, arranged in geographical sections, but not geographically within those sections;

Hydrographic Notices for the remainder

of the world similarly arranged.

Section III—Corrections to the Admiralty List of Lights, etc.

Section IV—Corrections to the Admiralty List of Wireless Signals.

These weekly editions will be supplied to Foreign-going Ships of the Mercantile Marine as well as to the Navy.

6. A separate weekly edition will be published by the Admiralty for Home-trade Ships of the Mercantile Marine and Fishing Vessels. This edition will be confined to the Notices for the area covered by the home-trade and fishing vessels, viz., British Isles, Greenland, Iceland, Færoes, White Sea and European Arctic, and western coasts of Europe from North Cape to Gibraltar, excluding the Baltic; and the make-up of the edition will be:—

Title and geographical limits on one page, including matter in explanation of abbreviations, etc., used in the Notices.

- "Publications" Notices and Miscellaneous Notices, followed by Hydrographic Notices for the area covered by home-trade and fishing vessels.
- 7. A quarterly edition, which will be a collation of the Notices, revised as necessary published during the quarter in Sections II of the weekly editions referred to above in paragraph 5, will also be published by the Admiralty for Foreign-going Ships of the Mercantile Marine.
- 8. The weekly editions will be non-cumulative and the Notices will be arranged, so far as possible and irrespective of numerical sequence, in geographical sections, but not geographically within those sections. Home-trade edition (see paragraph 6) and the Quarterly edition (see paragraph 7) will not include Sections III and IV (see paragraph 5 above), furnishing corrections to the Admiralty List of Lights, etc., and Admiralty List of Wireless Signals. The more important corrections to these Lists will, however, continue to be promulgated as necessary in the numbered Notices.
- 9. The Board of Trade will publish an annual booklet containing general information, e.g., information regarding distress signals, etc., and at present included in the Board of Trade foreign-going and home-trade This booklet will be supplied to all editions. classes of Merchant Ships and Fishing Vessels, and additions and corrections will appear in the weekly and quarterly editions referred to above in paragraphs 5, 6 and 7.
- 10. Distribution of the Admiralty daily Notices and of the various editions will be effected as follows:-
 - (a) Those referred to in paragraphs 4 and 5 will continue to be distributed by the Hydrographic Department (Admiralty Chart Establishment, Cricklewood, London, N.W.2) to H.M. Ships and Establishments at home and abroad, Hydrographic Authorities in Dominions, Colonies and countries, etc.
 - (b) Those referred to in paragraphs 4 and 5 will continue to be distributed by the Admiralty Chart Agent (Mr. J. D. Potter, 145, Minories, London, E.C.2), to his subagents, and to chart correctors, sundry chart purchasers, etc.
 - (c) Those mentioned above in paragraphs 4 to 7 inclusive and 9 will be distributed by

the Board of Trade (Mercantile Marine Department, Great George Street, London, S.W.1), as necessary, to Fishing Vessels and the Mercantile Marine, through similar channels to those now employed, viz., through Mercantile Marine Offices, Custom Houses, etc., in the British Isles; through Port Authorities, etc., at ports in the Dominions, Colonies and India; and through British Consular Offices in foreign countries.

 - (b) Weekly edition of Notices: An edition relating to the area traversed by home-trade and fishing vessels, containing information which has become available during the pre-vious week for the correction of the Admiralty Charts, Sailing Directions, and other Hydrographic Publications.
- 4. The Board of Trade will publish and distribute to foreign-going, home-trade and fishing vessels, an annual booklet containing general information, e.g., information regarding distress signals, life-saving, various special signals, etc.
