TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on

the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1932.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, after the expiration of forty days from this date, to make Regulations under Section 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5, cap. 46), and subsection (3) of Section 2 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1932 (22 Geo. 5, cap. 15), for controlling the manufacture, possession and wholesale distribution of methylmorphine (commonly known as codeine), ethylmorphine (commonly known as dionin) and their respective salts.

The object of the Regulations is to implement in respect of the aforesaid drugs the provisions of the International Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and Regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs which require that the existing control of the trade in dangerous drugs shall be extended to the wholesale trade in these drugs as from 1st January next.

MERCHANDISE MARKS.

DECLARATION, DATED OCTOBER 20, 1933, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE, WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, UNDER SECTION 10 (1) OF THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5. c. 53).

Whereas by subsection (1) of Section 10 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 53) it is provided, that for the purposes of the said Act, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "agricultural and horticultural produce and the produce of any fishing industry" includes all foodstuffs other than such foodstuffs as the Board of Trade (hereinafter called "the Board") with the concurrence of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries may declare not to be foodstuffs for the purposes of that definition:

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has concurred in a proposal of the Board to declare edible rice starch (including rice starch cornflour) and edible maize starch cornflour not to be foodstuffs for the purposes of the said definition:

Now, therefore, the Board, with the concurrence of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, hereby declare edible rice starch (including rice starch cornflour) and edible maize starch cornflour not to be foodstuffs for the purposes of the aforesaid definition.

THE DURHAM DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 33 of the Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments, and prescribe the 7th day of November, 1933, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme"), shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause 51 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following new Clause 51 shall be substituted therefor:—

"51. The Minimum price per ton of 20 cwt. fixed for each class of coal produced in the District shall be:—

(i) in the case of any class of coal sold or destined for shipment, a price 'f.o.b.' at the customary place of shipment:

Provided that for the purpose of fixing such minimum 'f.o.b.' price the costs charges and expenses falling to be borne or paid by an owner selling under an 'f.o.b.' contract shall be deemed to include any dues rates or tolls chargeable in respect of coal shipped at or exported from such customary place of shipment, and an owner selling coal of any class for delivery 'f.o.b.' shall accordingly be at liberty to apply so much of the price thereof as represents the amount of any such dues rates or tolls as aforesaid in paying the same for the benefit of or on behalf of the buyer of that coal or to allow or refund such amount to the buyer if the said dues rates or tolls are paid by him; and

(ii) in all other cases such price as may be fixed by the Board having regard to all the circumstances of the case:

Provided that there shall be only one minimum price for each class of coal."

2. Clause 57 of the Scheme shall be amended as follows:—

After the words "incurred subsequent to shipment" in line 5 of the Clause there shall be inserted the words "(not being dues rates or tolls to which the proviso to subparagraph (i) of Clause 51 applies)".

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE NATIONAL LIBRARY OF SCOTLAND.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held only on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and shall as a rule not have attained the age of 26 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part, but in special circumstances candidates above the age of 26 or below the age of 22 may be admitted with the approval of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such Orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The Trustees of the National Library of Scotland will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Librarian of the National Library of Scotland and shall be made on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached the authorities of the Department shall scrutinize all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them qualified for the duties of the posts in question. They shall then forward to the Civil Service Commissioners all the application forms received, who may then, if dissatisfied with the candidates presenting themselves, take such steps in consultation with the authorities of the Library as they may think fit to obtain other candidates. The list of qualified candidates shall then be settled by agreement between the Civil Service Commissioners and the authorities of the National Library of Scotland.

6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in their opinion fits them for the post. In general, candidates should possess a University degree or other equivalent qualifications. The Commissioners may, if in doubt, submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test such education, or any part of it.

7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or

widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the authorities of the Department and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be constituted by the authorities of the Department in consultation with the Commissioners who shall be represented on the Selection Board. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendation that they may receive from persons named by any candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate subjected thereto will be required to pay a fee of £2. A selected candidate will be required to pay a fee of £4 5s. towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.
