MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that, in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order-in-Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of imported goods of the following descriptions:—

1. Woven piece goods and ribbons, wholly or partly of cotton, wool (including alpaca, mohair, cashmere, llama, vicuna and camels' hair), silk, artificial silk, hemp, flax or jute, whether or not coated, impregnated, or in any other way treated or operated upon.

2. Articles of the following descriptions made wholly or mainly of the goods included in (1) above:—

(a) Articles for the table, sideboard, dressing table or the like:—

Table cloths, carving cloths and napkins.

Tea, tray and supper cloths.

Breakfast, luncheon, tea and dinner sets.

Bridge sets.
