WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th day of October, 1933, (C.W. 6636/33), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1918, to sanction the grant, at our discretion, of Temporary Commissions as Acting Chaplains to Ministers of Religious Bodies, not in conformity with the Church of England, who rendered full time service in the Royal Navy during the period of the late war:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing

date the 13th day of October, 1922, to sanction the continuance of the grant of temporary commissions to such Ministers under the same conditions in time of peace, subject to their being designated 'Temporary Chaplains' and not 'Acting Chaplains':

"And whereas the Reverend John Charles Jones was granted a Temporary Commission as Acting Roman Catholic Chaplain (now styled 'Temporary Roman Catholic Chaplain') with seniority of the 28th April, 1915, and served in Your Majesty's Naval Service until the 1st October, 1933, on which date he was placed on the retired list at his own request:

"And whereas we consider that such service should render this Officer eligible for retired pay:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

(1) Retired pay based on a standard rate of £315 a year to be granted to this Officer, and to be awarded at the current rate of £280 10s. 0d. a year as from the date of his retirement;

(2) The standard rate of £315 a year to be regarded as comparable with rates authorised in Schedule V, Section IX, of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd January, 1920, and his retired pay to be subject to revision as may from

time to time be prescribed for rates authorised by that Order.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas the said Benefice of Portland (All Saints) is now full, the Reverend Alfred Vincent Hurley being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Portland, Saint Peter, is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Alfred Vincent Hurley (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Portland (All Saints) and the said Benefice of Portland, Saint Peter, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of

souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Portland, All Saints with Saint Peter' but that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Alfred Vincent Hurley if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Portland (All Saints) shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £250 per annum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Portland, Saint Peter, shall form part of the endowments and property of the United Benefice but shall be used for the purpose of a house of residence for the Curate referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme unless the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being shall at any time by writing otherwise direct and so soon as conveniently may be after the said union has taken effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Portland (All Saints) and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated towards the cost of providing a house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Portland, Saint Peter, having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Portland (All Saints) having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Glington only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Peakirk and the then Incumbent of Glington shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Peakirk only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Glington and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Glington if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Peakirk shall have been instituted to Peakirk subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Peakirk before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Peakirk following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Glington and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Glington shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to

the said Benefice of Peakirk shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Peter at Peterborough, as the Patrons of the said Benefice of Northborough (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend Charles Edward Carnegie, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Northborough (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect (a) all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Glinton and all that adjacent detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Peakirk which lie to the east of and adjacent to the Parish of the said Benefice of Northborough shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Northborough, and (b) all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Glinton which lies to the east of and adjacent to the Parish of the said Benefice of Peakirk shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Peakirk.

That upon the said union taking effect a part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Bishop's Cleeve, namely a sum of £5,000 Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock, being part of a larger sum of such Stock at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of that Benefice, shall be severed from the said Benefice of Bishop's Cleeve and shall be annexed to the United Benefice and become a portion of the endowment thereof: and the said sum of £5,000 Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock shall not be subject to any charge in respect of the rent-charge of £150 referred to in the Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1929, and published in the London Gazette on the 31st day of the same month relating to the union of a part of the said Benefice of Bishop's Cleeve with a part of the Benefice of Swindon with Uckington and Elmstone Hardwicke and the Benefice of Tredington all in the said County and Diocese of Gloucester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Darnall, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 13th day of December, 1844, and published in the London Gazette on the 31st day of the same month, a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the Chapelry of Attercliffe cum Darnall, in the Parish of Sheffield, in the said County of York, and at that time in the Diocese of York, but now in the said Diocese of Sheffield, and the said District was named 'The District of Darnall':

"And whereas the said District of Darnall has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Darnall should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that, from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Darnall shall be altered so that all that portion of the Parish of Handsworth, in the said County of York and in the said Diocese of Sheffield which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis-severed from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Darnall.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Darnall, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, being:—

"All that portion of the Parish of Handsworth, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north east by the New Parish of Saint George, Brinsworth, upon the north by the Chapelry of Tinsley, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the west by the said New Parish of Darnall, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Darnall from the said Parish of Handsworth at a point in the middle of Carr Brook opposite to the south western end of the fence forming the north western boundary of Bowden Housteads Wood, and extending thence north eastward to and along such fence for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its north eastern end, and extending thence first north westward to and then north eastward along the middle of the footpath leading towards Bowdenhouse Farm for a distance in all of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the point where such footpath reaches the roadway leading through Bowdenhouse Farm, and extending thence first north westward to and then north eastward along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the last mentioned roadway and along the wall forming the northern boundary of Bowdenhouse Farmhouse for a distance in all of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point on the western side of the road leading from Handsworth to Darnall, and extending thence first north eastward to and then north westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance in all of 13 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Handsworth Bridge which carries such road across the Manchester and Cleethorpes Line of the London and North Eastern Railway

and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 47 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Handsworth from the said New Parish of Saint George, Brinsworth."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the new building of the National Central Library in Malet Place, London, W.C.1, on the 7th November, 1933:—

CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE NATIONAL CENTRAL LIBRARY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY:

Eighty-five years ago the first municipal Public Library was founded, thereby initiating a movement for the supply of sound literature to all classes of the community, which now covers the whole of the United Kingdom. Today Your Majesty, ever forward to help any effort for the intellectual, moral, and spiritual welfare of Your people, is graciously pleased to lay the coping-stone of the whole structure

by opening the building in which is housed the National Central Library.

The Library came into being in 1916 as a Central Library for Students, founded with the object of supplying books for the use of Adult Educational Classes, and for loans to individual students throughout the country. Before long it established relations with the Municipal, County, University, and Special Libraries, and thereby greatly extended its sphere of usefulness; and when the Departmental Committee on Public Libraries in 1927 recommended that the Public Libraries throughout the country should be welded together into a national system, this Library was made the centre of the organization. In 1930 it was reconstituted as the National Central Library. On the twenty-first day of April, 1931, Your Majesty graciously signed the Royal Charter of Incorporation.

The Public Libraries came into existence as purely local institutions, and they preserve their local and independent character. But they aspire now to a yet higher ideal, to render national as well as local service. They are linking themselves together in Regional Systems, whereby, without thought of local exclusiveness, books may be freely borrowed by one library from another within the area: and at the centre of this system stands the National Central Library, which can also, by its arrangements with a number of libraries, mostly of a specialist character, draw on stocks amounting to more than five million volumes, and make them, through the medium of the Public and University Libraries, available to serious readers everywhere.

For its progress hitherto the Library has been mainly indebted to the enlightened liberality of the Carnegie United Kingdom Trust. Other bodies and individuals have helped—the Cassel Trust, the Thomas Wall Trust, the United Services Fund, libraries of all kinds, and private subscribers—but the Carnegie Trust has up to the present provided a full half of the income of the Library, and has now crowned its generous gifts by the presentation of the building which Your Majesty has to-day opened.

The Public Libraries supply the life-blood of the intellectual vitality of the nation. They provide healthy mental recreation for the weary, but more and more it is recognised that they supply the indispensable material of the knowledge and thought without which no nation can prosper. But no library can possess all the books that a reader may need, and some can possess but few of them. Only by a well-organized system of loans between libraries can every necessary book be brought within reach of the reader at a minimum expense, and every book do the fullest service of which it is capable. The National Central Library aims at supplying, from its own resources or from the libraries linked with it, those volumes which few Public Libraries can economically possess, and by the formation of unified catalogues it can trace books of which readers have need and put the national system of loans into operation. The Trustees of the National Central Library see no limits to the beneficial services which they may with adequate resources render to the intellectual life of the nation. They wish to express their gratitude to the Carnegie Trust for all that

it has done for them. They ask the support of the nation in the task which lies before them; and they are profoundly grateful to Your Majesty, and to Her Majesty the Queen, for the encouragement given to their work by Your Majesties through Your presence here on this the birthday of a national library service.

To which address His Majesty was pleased to return the following Gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I thank you and the Trustees of the National Central Library for your loyal Address.

Two years ago, as your Address recalls, I had the pleasure of granting a Charter of Incorporation to the National Central Library. To-day I am happy to renew my association with a movement designed to meet the needs both of the general public and of students in this country. The striking increase in the number of libraries, and of those who avail themselves of the facilities thus offered, is welcome evidence of a growing recognition that education does not end with school or college. Education is indeed many sided, and must lead to the encouragement of reading for recreation and for the intrinsic pleasure that reading can afford. By your system of loans between libraries you have made provision for study and research which would be scarcely possible in any local library. In this respect these buildings constitute a National University which all may attend and none need ever leave, and it is fitting that they should have as neighbours those other great centres of National culture, the British Museum and the University of London.

I cordially share your feelings of gratitude to the Carnegie Trust for the munificent gift of this building, and to those other benefactors for their several contributions. This country owes much to the late Mr. Carnegie and the generous policy of his Trustees, and especially for their help in developing the Public Library Service, to-day enriched and crowned by the National Central Library.

I now declare these buildings open. In so doing I warmly congratulate the Trustees and the Chief Librarian on their great achievement, and wish them all success in making the National Central Library worthy of its new home and an instrument of still wider benefit to the cause of learning among my people.
