ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS,
1882 TO 1933.

LONDON AND HOME COUNTIES ELECTRICITY DISTRICT.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of Section 7 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1919, the Electricity Commissioners made an Order entitled the London and Home Counties Electricity District Order, 1925 (hereinafter called "the principal Order") constituting the London and Home Counties Electricity District and establishing and incorporating the London and Home Counties Joint Electricity Authority (hereinafter called "the Joint Authority") which Order was confirmed by the Minister of Transport and approved by a resolution passed by each House of Parliament:

And whereas it is provided in sub-section 3 of Section 7 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1919, that an Order made under that Section may be altered by a subsequent Order made confirmed and approved in like manner as the original Order:

And whereas an approved draft Agreement has been entered into between the Joint Authority and the North Metropolitan Electric Power Supply Company in regard to certain undertakings of the Company within the area of the London and Home Counties Electricity District:

And whereas the Electricity Commissioners have published a draft Order entitled the London and Home Counties Electricity District (Amendment) Order, 1934, giving effect to certain provisions of the draft Agreement hereinbefore cited and providing for certain amendments of the principal Order:

Now therefore the Electricity Commissioners hereby give notice that they intend to hold a Local Inquiry at the Institution of Electrical Engineers, Savoy Place, Victoria Embankment, W.C.2, on Tuesday, 2nd January, 1934, at 10.30 a.m. and following days, if necessary, with reference to the said draft Order.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

RIVER GREAT OUSE CATCHMENT BOARD.

Ramsey Upwood and Great Raveley Internal Drainage District.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming the Order made on the 9th October, 1933, in relation to the Scheme prepared by the River Great Ouse Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, for, *inter alia*, the constitution of the Ramsey Upwood and Great Raveley Internal Drainage District.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this
