MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REFERENCE TO STANDING COMMITTEE.

CHAIN OR PULLEY BLOCKS WHETHER IMPORTED COMPLETE OR IN PARTS.

In accordance with the provision of Section 2, sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that, in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order-in-Council to require Chain or Pulley Blocks whether imported complete or in parts to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also, at their discretion, consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

DRESSMAKING AND WOMEN'S LIGHT CLOTHING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO VARY CERTAIN MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE LEARNERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade Board (England and Wales) hereby give notice that they propose to vary certain of the Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Learners set out in their Notices W.D. (22) and W.D. (23), dated 29th March, 1933.

Particulars of the proposed variation may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address given below.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 24th November, 1933. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade Board (England and Wales), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that objections should state precisely and, so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
