The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 14th day of November, 1933, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 14TH NOVEMBER, 1933.

Whereas two additional sites belonging to the Queen's College are being acquired for the extension of St. Edmund Hall: Now the University in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:

1. In *Statt. Tit. III. Sect. iv. cl. 5* (*Statuta*, ed. 1933, p. 22, ll. 43-4), for the words "clauses 9 and 12" substitute the words "clauses 9, 12, and 16".
2. *Ibid.* clause 16 (p. 26, at end of l. 4) add the following: "The site and buildings of the Hall shall be deemed to include the two pieces of land referred to in an Agreement dated the first day of August One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three and made between

the College of the one part and the Trustees of the other part together with the buildings for the time being standing thereon."
